The primary objective is the provision of community facilities and services.

#### **Public benefit policy**

In planning activities, the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit has been kept in mind.

#### Achievements and performance

Conniburrow Community Association, being a non-profit organisation, continues to perform well and has achieved its targets. Bookings are on the increase, however, drainage issues on the playing field still persist. Efforts are ongoing to rectify the situation. The facility is well used all year round and is becoming more popular in and around the community.

Conniburrow Community Association continues to serve its community providing for a range of age groups and in particular the youth and senior citizens. CONNIBURROW UNITED YOUTH FC (The Hares) run 3 youth teams and have had good success. We are proud to say that one of our teams have only lost a single league match for the whole year, thanks to our Management Committee and the commitment of all our coaches and Club Manager. Holiday Youth Football Coaching was provided by our volunteer Football Club Coaches during the holiday seasons. We also held our Senior Citizens Christmas Luncheon for 56 persons. Conniburrow News (CCA Newsletter) is produced in-house and distributed in the community twice per year.

We have continued to reduce our operating deficit year on year since the rebuilding and development of Conniburrow Community Centre & Sports Pavilion – from 2013/14 deficit of £10,321 to 2014/15 £5,200, 2015/16 £3,805, 2016/17 £96.

#### YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2017

#### 1. General information

The charity is a private company limited by guarantee, registered in England and Wales and a registered charity in England and Wales. The address of the registered office is Neighbourhood House, Conniburrow Boulevard, Conniburrow, Milton Keynes, MK14 7AJ.

#### 2. Statement of compliance

These financial statements have been prepared in compliance with FRS 102, 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland', the Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (Charities SORP (FRS 102)) and the Charities Act 2011.

#### 3. Accounting policies

#### **Basis of preparation**

The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis.

The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the entity.

#### Going concern

There are no material uncertainties about the charity's ability to continue.

#### Transition to FRS 102

The entity transitioned from previous UK GAAP to FRS 102 as at 1 April 2015. No transitional adjustments were required in the retained funds or income or expenditure for the year.

#### **Disclosure exemptions**

The entity satisfies the criteria of being a qualifying entity as defined in FRS 102. As such, advantage has been taken of the following disclosure exemptions available under paragraph 1.12 of FRS 102:

- (a) No cash flow statement has been presented for the company.
- (b) Disclosures in respect of financial instruments have not been presented.

#### 3. Accounting policies (continued)

#### **Fund accounting**

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees to further any of the charity's purposes.

Designated funds are unrestricted funds earmarked by the trustees for particular future project or commitment.

Restricted funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure declared by the donor or through the terms of an appeal, and fall into one of two sub-classes: restricted income funds or endowment funds.

#### Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when entitlement has passed to the charity; it is probable that the economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the charity and the amount can be reliably measured. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:

- income from donations or grants is recognised when there is evidence of entitlement to the gift, receipt is probable and its amount can be measured reliably.
- legacy income is recognised when receipt is probable and entitlement is established.
- income from donated goods is measured at the fair value of the goods unless this is impractical to measure reliably, in which case the value is derived from the cost to the donor or the estimated resale value. Donated facilities and services are recognised in the accounts when received if the value can be reliably measured. No amounts are included for the contribution of general volunteers.
- income from contracts for the supply of services is recognised with the delivery of the contracted service. This is classified as unrestricted funds unless there is a contractual requirement for it to be spent on a particular purpose and returned if unspent, in which case it may be regarded as restricted.

#### Resources expended

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated on a basis consistent with use of resources.

Governance costs are those incurred in connection with the administration of the charity and compliance with constitutional and statutory requirements.

#### Tangible assets

Tangible assets are initially recorded at cost, and subsequently stated at cost less any accumulated depreciation and impairment losses.

#### 3. Accounting policies (continued)

#### **Depreciation**

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost of an asset, less its residual value, over the useful economic life of that asset as follows:

Fixtures, fittings and equipment

20% straight line

#### Impairment of fixed assets

A review for indicators of impairment is carried out at each reporting date, with the recoverable amount being estimated where such indicators exist. Where the carrying value exceeds the recoverable amount, the asset is impaired accordingly. Prior impairments are also reviewed for possible reversal at each reporting date.

#### 4. Limited by guarantee

Conniburrow Community Association Limited is a company limited by guarantee without share capital. The liability of each member is limited to contributing £1 to the assets of the charity in the event of it being wound up while a member.

At 31 March 2017, the number of members was 6 (2016: 6).
