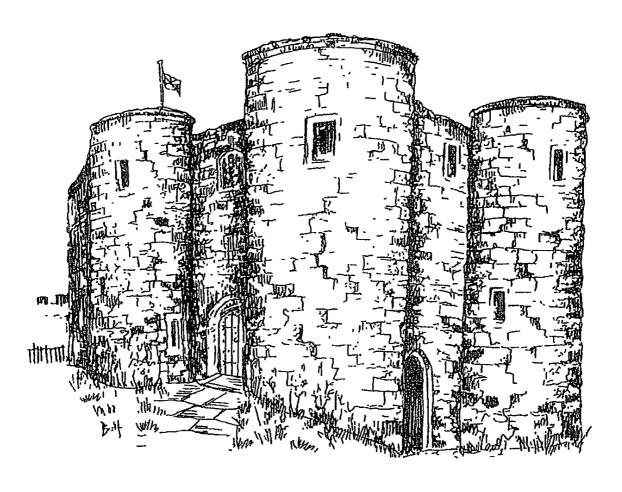

Activities and finance:

The Association owns two museum sites at the Ypres Tower and 3 East Street, Rye.

The Directors are satisfied that the company can meet its financial obligations

Summary of Activities During the Year:

Rye Museum Association continues to fulfil its commitments according to the Objectives and Policies of the Association.

Once again the Ypres Tower opened daily throughout the year (with the assistance of volunteer stewards during the lunch break) and visitor numbers reached 22,873, a 1% decrease over the previous financial year

Visits by school children were down from the previous year at 498. Including other groups and events, total entries to the Tower for the year were 24,864 as compared to 25,127 in 2014/5.

Visitors to East Street, (opened by volunteers during summer weekends and Bank Holidays), increased to 10,108 under the continuing policy of free entry. This represents an increase of 24%. The total number of entries including groups and events was 11,345, as compared to 9060 the previous year.

Once again, the Directors would like to place on record their thanks to Peter Cosstick and his team at the Rye Heritage Centre who greatly assisted the Museum by directing many visitors to the Tower In addition, the Directors acknowledge the committed and skilled services of our guides, Mike Berry, Ted Emson and Toby Mayor.

A new display of maritime items was completed in the Tower. Twelve cases in East St have new displays including Rye Royale in the 1920s to mark Her Majesty's birthday. As part of the Rye Arts Festival, we put on an Exhibition called 'leading up to Waterloo' Updating of the Collection catalogue has continued under Linden Thomas.

The planning application submitted to Rother District Council for a proposed new museum development in the courtyard at the Ypres Tower has still not been resolved Further discussions have been held and reports produced as required The Directors are unable to say with any certainty whether the project will proceed.

The Museum continued with its programme of annual maintenance at the Ypres Tower (a Scheduled Monument) to the plan prepared by our architects, and at East Street lighting was renewed and a new retail/storage area was installed with the help of grant funding.

Once again, the Directors wish to extend their warmest thanks to the many volunteers amongst their members without whom the Museum could not function

Permanent Collection:

The artefacts, documents and other exhibits are held by the company on loan from the Rye Museum Trust

The Trustees of the collection on 5th April 2016 were: Sherla Maddock, Elizabeth Hughes, Jo Kirkham, Geoffrey Mead, Frank Palmer, Brion Purdey, and Cathy Walling

Some additions to the collection have taken place for which we are most grateful

Directors' Responsibilities:

Independent Examiner's Report on the Unaudited Financial Statements to the Directors and Trustees of the Rye Museum Association.

I report on the financial statements for the year ended 5th April 2016 as set out on pages 5 to 10.

Respective responsibilities of Trustees and Examiner

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 5th APRIL 2016

1 Accounting Policies

- a) These accounts have been prepared under the historic cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards and the Statement of Recommended Practice on Accounting by Charities.
- b) Donated income is accounted for when received.
- c) Grants in respect of capital and revenue expenditure are credited to the Statement of Financial Affairs in the year in which they are received This is line with the Statement of Recommended Practice on Accounting by Charities (revised 2005)
- d) The company is not registered for VAT. All items in the accounts include attributable VAT.

Depreciation is provided on fixed assets at the following annual rates based on the estimated useful life and anticipated residual value.

Assets purchased by the RMA in its own right and those purchased with Heritage Lottery grants are depreciated in line with the above rates.

No depreciation is provided on the original acquisition cost of the freehold land and buildings.

- f) Stock of publications for resale is valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making allowances for obsolete and slow moving items.
- g) In accordance with the recommendations of the Statement of Recommended Practice on Accounting by Charities, the Permanent Collection of Museum Exhibits has been excluded from the Balance Sheet. See note 14

14 Permanent Collection

The permanent collection of museum exhibits is held by the Rye Museum Trust.

15 Contingent Liability

Under the terms of Heritage Lottery Funding, RMA must maintain the Ypres Tower for the purposes set out in the grant application for a period of 10 years from 2008. Should the terms of the grant be breached, RMA would be required to repay the greater amount of the grant or the net proceeds of sale.

16 Limited by guarantee

Ryr Museum Association is a registered charity. It is a private company limited by guarantee, and does not have a share capital. The liability of each member is limited to £1.
