# **Objects and Policies**

The company was formed in succession to the unincorporated association of the same name. Its objectives are the provision of museum facilities in the Rye area and the advancement of education by acquisition and exhibition of objects and collections with an educational nature.

The Hon Curator is Mrs M Bird.

The Museum is staffed by Messrs J Davidson, M Ellwood, C Rutland Staples and Mrs C Wheeler.

#### **Activities and Finance**

The results for the period are show on page 3.

The Museum is currently housed in the Ypres Tower which was formally leased from Rother District Council. The freehold was purchased during the period for £1 subject to a right to repurchase in the event of sale.

RMA also owns 3 East Street, Rye which is in process of being developed as a second museum site. RMA has been successful in obtaining Heritage Lottery funding of £459,000 which will be used to

- Display certain artefacts in the Ypres Tower in suitable conditions and to provide educational facilities.
- To develop a local history museum of national standard, displayed on the East Street site.
- Give the collection on the East Street site the care and environmental conditions impossible to achieve in the Ypres Tower.

Substantial costs were invested in employment of professional consultants during the period of these accounts in order to achieve the above grant.

It has been recommended by the Heritage Lottery fund that a paid curator be appointed and we hope to implement this on a part time basis during 1998.

# Summary of Other Activities During the Period

A successful lecture and social programme was enjoyed by many members. Three coffee mornings were held in the Ypres Tower to recruit volunteers to assist in the Museum activities. All members were invited but we continue to seek volunteers.

Rother District Council's Contractors completed their works to the Ypres Tower in February 1997 and the building seems much improved, however the wet conditions have not been cured.

Despite the wet conditions precluding the display of artefacts in the Tower, attendance between April and December 1997 was 19,912.

The Rye Museum Trust is a charitable trust with a separate trust deed which exists for the purpose of holding the permanent collection. In April 1997, the Chief Executive Officer of Rother District Council resigned as a trustee of the Rye Museum Trust, due to a conflict of interest. Due to this, it was proposed to the Charity Commission that in place of a representative of Rother District Council an additional trustee should be selected by the directors of the Association. This was approved by the Charity Commission in July 1997 and Mr Brian Hargreaves was appointed.

## Restricted Funds

Other grants and donations have been received during the period to develop a medieval garden in the exercise yard and a separate Fabric Fund has been started for maintenance of the Tower.

# NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR TO 31 DECEMBER 1997

# 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

- a) These accounts have been prepared under the historic cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards and the Statement of Recommended Practice on Accounting by Charities.
- b) Deprecation is provided on equipment at the following rates based on the estimated useful life of these fixed assets and their anticipated residual value.

Office equipment 15% (reducing balance basis) Environmental Control Equipment 15% (reducing balance basis)

No depreciation is provided on freehold buildings, as in the opinion of the directors the estimated residual value is in excess of the book value.

- c) In accordance with the recommendations of the Statement of Recommended Practice the Permanent Collection of Museum Exhibits has been excluded from the balance sheet. See note 12.
- d) Donated income is recorded as income of the Charity at the point at which it is received by the Charity.
- e) Stock of Publications for resale is valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making allowance for slow moving items. Stock more than five years old is written down to zero.
- f) The Association is not registered for VAT. All items in the accounts include attributable VAT where applicable.
- g) Grants are not recorded until they are received.

Freehold property taken over comprised 3 East Street at its cost price of £67,385 and capitalised improvement expenditure on Ypres Tower at a cost of £10,580.

During the period, the freehold of the Ypres Tower was purchased at a cost of £1 plus legal expenses of £500. The Ypres Tower freehold is subject to pre-emption rights granted to Rother District Council and Rye Town Council granting them a right of purchase in the event of a sale.

The Association is a registered charity. It is a company limited by guarantee and does not have share capital. The liability of each member is limited to £1. The Directors have set the annual subscription at £5.00.
