NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2003

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards.

The company had net liabilities of £160,464 at the balance sheet date. The ability of the company to continue trading is dependent on the continued support of its parent company.

The directors are of the opinion that they will continue to receive this support and on this basis consider it appropriate to prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis.

The financial statements do not include any adjustments that would result from the withdrawal of support by the parent company.

Cash flow statement

The directors have taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 (revised) from including a cash flow statement in the financial statements on the grounds that the company is a wholly owned subsidiary of A.S. Création Tapeten AG, the consolidated accounts of which are publicly available.

Related parties transactions

The company is a wholly owned subsidiary of A.S. Création Tapeten AG. Accordingly, the company has taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 8 from disclosing transactions with members or investees of the group.

Turnover

The turnover shown in the profit and loss account represents amounts invoiced during the year, exclusive of Value Added Tax.

Fixed assets

All fixed assets are initially recorded at cost.

Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost of an asset, less its estimated residual value, over the useful economic life of that asset as follows:

Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items.

Operating lease agreements

Rentals applicable to operating leases where substantially all of the benefits and risks of ownership remain with the lessor are charged against profits on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.
