TRUSTEES' REPORT

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2013

The Trustees present their report and financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2013.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the financial statements and comply with the Charity's Memorandum & Articles of Association, the Companies Act 2006, the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008) and the Statement of Recommended Practice, "Accounting and Reporting by Charities", issued in March 2005.

Structure, governance and management

The charity is a company limited by guarantee (registered number 03670634) having no share capital. It is also a registered charity (number 1081005). Under the provisions of Section 60 of the Companies Act 2006, the company is entitled to omit the word "Limited" from its name. It is governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association dated 10 May 2000, with its registered office being at 30 Fore Street, Totnes, Devon, TQ9 5RP. Members of the Trustee Board are all Directors of the company. In the event of the company being wound up the liability of the members is limited to £1 each.

Recruitment and appointment of Trustees

Trustees are appointed in accordance with procedures as may be specified by the Board of Trustees.

Trustee induction and training

New Trustees are explained their role by the Chairman and other Trustees receive training for updates that arise.

Organisational structure

The Board of Trustees administers the Charity and meets on a regular basis. Eleven meetings of the Trustees were held in the year.

Objectives and activities

The charity's objects are to pursue any charitable purpose for the benefit of the inhabitants of Totnes and neighbouring parishes in the county of Devon, and in particular the relief of poverty, the advancement of education and training, the preservation and improvement of craftsmanship, and the maintenance, improvement or provision of public amenities.

To meet these objectives the Charity provides community leadership, supports capacity building and undertakes sound and sustainable projects.

TRUSTEES' REPORT (CONTINUED)

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2013

The Trustees have paid due regard to guidance on public benefit issued by the Charity Commission in deciding what activities the charity should undertake.

Achievements and performance

The Charity has led a variety of community projects. The Gardening for Health project has been successful in linking community food growing with national health initiatives for healthy living. It is sited at the Lamb Garden, a site licensed from South Hams District Council, and has been used to help individuals with a range of health improvements.

The Charity continues to support the maintenance of the Leechwell Garden site and is working towards improvements to the Leechwell immersion pool.

The Rotherfold Gardens project is working towards a garden that is open to all members of the public with the added benefit that residents feel a real sense of ownership.

The Charity continues to seek new projects and also executes a number of smaller projects across the community which enhance the day to day utility in the town such as the Totnes Skate Park lighting project.

Financial review

There was a deficit of income over expenditure of funds for the year of £243 (2012: surplus of £10,804).

It is the Trustees' policy to maintain a balance on unrestricted funds to allow for shortfalls in income. Surplus funds are placed on deposit with National Westminster Bank.

Running costs for 2014 are forecast to be around £1,800. This estimate includes some element of one off costs and a reserve of this amount is recommended.

The reserves position is to be reviewed at the end of each year.

In the unlikely event that the Trust had considerable unrestricted surplus funds which were not likely to be needed in the short term, consideration would be given to minimising risk by investing in Government securities or funds such as those of the Charities Aid Foundation.

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2013

1 Accounting policies

1.1 Basis of preparation

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards, the Statement of Recommended Practice, "Accounting and Reporting by Charities", issued in March 2005, the Companies Act 2006 and the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008).

1.2 Incoming resources

Donations and grants for immediate expenditure are accounted for when they become receivable. Donations and grants received for specific purposes are treated as restricted funds. Grants restricted to future accounting periods are deferred and recognised in those periods.

Donated facilities are included at the value to the charity where this can be quantified, and recognised as income when they become employed. No amounts are included in the financial statements for services donated by volunteers.

1.3 Resources expended

Resources expended are recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities on an accruals basis inclusive of any VAT as the liability is incurred.

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them. Governance costs include those costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements of the charity. All costs are allocated between the expenditure categories of the Statement of Financial Activities on a basis designed to reflect the use of the resource.

1.4 Funds

Funds held by the charity are either:

Unrestricted general funds - these funds can be used in furtherance of the charitable objectives at the discretion of the Trustees.

Designated funds - these are unrestricted funds earmarked by the Trustees for particular purposes.

Restricted funds - these funds can only be used for the particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when funds are received for a specific purpose. The aim and use of each restricted and designated fund is set out in the notes to the financial statements.
