DIRECTORS' REPORT

The Directors submit their annual report and the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2006.

The Director's report has been prepared in accordance with the special provisions relating to small companies under section 246 (4) (a) of the Companies Act 1985.

BUSINESS REVIEW AND PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES

The Company is a wholly owned subsidiary of John Laing Infrastructure Limited.

The principal activity of the Company is the holding of an unlisted investment of 849,999 ordinary shares in CountyRoute (A130) pic, a Special Purpose Company set up to fulfil obligations under a PFI contract with Essex County Council.

There have not been any significant changes in the Company's principal activities in the year under review.

The Company received interest in the year on loan notes of £1,302,428 (2005 - £1,170,170) issued by CountyRoute (A130) plc. The Company paid interest in the year on loan notes issued by John Laing Infrastructure Limited of £1,302,428 (2005 - £1,170,170).

There were no other items of income or expenditure in the year.

FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS

The Directors are not aware, at the date of this report, of any major changes in the Company's activities in the next year.

RESULTS AND DIVIDENDS

The result for the year before taxation amounted to £nil (2005 - £nil). After taxation and group relief of £nil (2005 - £nil), result for the year was £nil (2005 - £nil).

The Directors do not recommend the payment of a dividend (2005 - £nil).

PRINCIPAL RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The principal risk to the Company is the ability of CountyRoute (A130) plc to meet its loan note debt service requirements. This is mitigated by ensuring the senior debt service reserve is fully funded.

AUDIT INFORMATION

Each of the persons who is a Director at the date of approval of this report confirms that:

- as far as the Director is aware, there is no relevent audit information of which the Company's auditors are unaware; and

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

a) Basis of preparation of accounts

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with applicable United Kingdom accounting standards. A summary of the principal accounting policies adopted by the Directors, which have been applied consistently, is shown below.

The Company is a wholly owned subsidiary undertaking of John Laing plc and as such is exempt under FRS 1 (revised 1996) from the requirement to prepare its own cash flow statement.

As a wholly owned subsidiary undertaking the Company is also exempt under section 228 of the Companies Act 1985 from any requirement to prepare consolidated financial statements for its group. Accordingly, the financial statements present information about the Company as an individual undertaking, and the results of its subsidiary are reflected in these accounts only to the extent that dividends have been declared.

b) Investments

Fixed asset investments are shown at cost less provision for impairment.

2 DIRECTORS' REMUNERATION

No Directors received any remuneration for services to the Company during the current or prior year.

3 PROFIT AND LOSS

The fees payable to the Company auditors for the audit of the Company's annual accounts of £2,243 (2005 - £2,178) have been borne by CountyRoute (A130) plc.

9 TRANSACTIONS WITH RELATED PARTIES

As a greater than 90% subsidiary of John Laing plc, the Company has taken advantage of the exemption under Financial Reporting Standard 8 not to provide information on related party transactions with other undertakings within the John Laing plc group. Note 10 gives details of how to obtain a copy of the published financial statements of John Laing plc.

10 ULTIMATE PARENT UNDERTAKING

The largest and smallest group in which the Company's results are consolidated, is John Laing plc, a company incorporated in Great Britain and registered in England and Wales. Copies of the consolidated accounts of John Laing plc are available from Companies House, Crown Way, Cardiff CF14 3UZ.

Prior to 22 December 2006, the Company's ultimate parent and controlling entity was John Laing plc. From this date the Company's ultimate parent and controlling entity is Henderson Infrastructure Holdco (Jersey) Limited, a company incorporated in Jersey, Channel Islands.

Henderson Infrastructure Holdco (Jersey) Limited was incorporated on 13 September 2006 and will not prepare consolidated accounts at 31 December 2006.
