These key laws and regulations included but were not limited to compliance with the Companies Act 2006, International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRSs) as adopted by the United Kingdom, and relevant tax legislation.

We are not responsible for preventing irregularities. Our approach to identifying and assessing the risks of material misstatement in respect of irregularities, including fraud and non-compliance with laws and regulations, was as follows:

- the engagement partner ensured that the engagement team collectively had the appropriate competence, capabilities and skills to identify or recognise non-compliance with applicable laws and regulations;
- we identified the laws and regulations applicable to the company through discussions with directors and other management, and from our commercial knowledge and experience of the pub sector;
- we assessed the extent of compliance with the laws and regulations identified above through making enquiries of management and inspecting legal correspondence where applicable; and
- identified laws and regulations were communicated within the audit team regularly and the team remained alert to instances of non-compliance throughout the audit.

We assessed the susceptibility of the company's financial statements to material misstatement, including obtaining an understanding of how fraud might occur, by:

- making enquiries of management as to where they considered there was susceptibility to fraud, their knowledge of actual, suspected and alleged fraud; and
- considering the internal controls in place to mitigate risks of fraud and non-compliance with laws and regulations.

To address the risk of fraud through management bias and override of controls, we:

- tested journal entries to identify unusual transactions;
- assessed whether judgements and assumptions made in determining the accounting estimates set out in note 1 were indicative of potential bias, in particular the director's accounting treatment of the group restructure:
- investigated the rationale behind significant or unusual transactions
- reviewed client's basis for provisions; and
- reviewed nominals of certain nominal codes for indication of any management override.

In response to the risk of irregularities and non-compliance with laws and regulations, we designed procedures which included, but were not limited to:

- agreeing financial statement disclosures to underlying supporting documentation;
- enquiring of management as to actual and potential litigation and claims; and
- reviewing correspondence with HMRC and associated parties

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparation

Punch Taverns (PRAC) Limited is a limited liability company incorporated in England. The registered office is on the information page of these financial statements. These financial statements were prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 102 ("FRS 102").

Basis of preperation

The financial statements are prepared on the historical cost convention and in accorance with companies Act 2006 and Unitd Kingdom applicable accounting standards. The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the company and rounded to the nearest £'000. \sim

The following disclsoure exemptions have been taken advantage of:

- Preperation of a cash flow
- Disclosure of related party transactions with and between wholly-owned subsidiaries of the group
- Disclosures relating to financial instruments

Fundamental accounting concept - going concern

The company's current liabilities exceed its current assets. However, a parental entity, Punch Tavern's Limited has undertaken to support the company for a period of at least one year following the date of approval of these financial statements and not recall group debt until all other liabilities have been settled and the company has funds to repay. For this reason, the financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis.

Taxation

Current tax is provided at amounts expected to be paid (or recovered) using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantially enacted at the balance sheet date. Deferred tax is provided on temporary differences between the carrying amount of assets and liabilities for financial reporting purposes and the amounts used for taxation

Fixed asset investments

Investments are stated at cost, less provision for impairment in value. The carrying value of investments is reviewed for impairment when events or changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying value may not be recoverable.

Significant accounting estimates and judgements

The preparation of financial statements requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, disclosure or contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period.

Management bases its estimates and judgements on historical experience and on various other factors that are believed to reasonable under the circumstances, the results of which form the basis for making judgements about the carrying value of assets and liabilities that are not readily available from other sources. Actual results may differ from these estimates under different assumptions and conditions.

The estimates and judgements that have significant effect on the amounts recognised in the financial statements are detailed below:

Impairment of debt

The company assesses the risk of impairment to the recoverable value of the debt held. There is a judgement in considering whether an impairment arises because of the difference between the carrying value and the fair value being value in use.

Impairment of fixed asset investments

The company assesses the risk of impriments to the investment in its subsidiaries. There is judgement in considering whether an impriment arises because of the difference between the carrying value and the fair value, being value in use.

Following completion of the acquisition referenced in note 11, the company's ultimate parent undertaking and controlling party becomes Fortress Investment Group LLC, an independently operated subsidiary of SoftBank Group Corp.

The largest and smallest group in which the results of the company are consolidated is that headed by Vine Acquisitions Limited, a company registered in England & Wales. Copies of the financial statements of Vine Acquisitions Limited are available from Companies House.
