The board consists of a maximum of 3 Association Directors, 1 of each nominated by the respective tenant and resident boards, a maximum of 6 Community Directors, a maximum of 4 Professional Agency Directors and a maximum of 2 Special Directors.

The directors all retire at the AGM and are re-elected/elected in accordance with nominations received prior to the date of the AGM. In the case of Community Directors if more than 6 nominations are received the appointment is decided by ballot.

Officers and Advisers

The officers and advisers are as stated on page 2.

Directors responsibility for the financial statements

Company law requires the directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company and of the profit or loss of the company for that period. In preparing those financial statements the directors are required to:

- * select suitable accounting policies and apply them consistently;
- * make adjustments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- * prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume the company will continue to operate.

The directors are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the company and which enable them to ensure the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 1985. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Risk management

The board review all plans and forecasts, during this process risks related to the project are identified and the appropriate action built into the plans.

The systems of the company are reviewed regularly to ensure that appropriate controls are in place to safeguard its assets and to facilitate its effective management.

Reserves

The directors have identified that the company needs to accumulate free reserves equivalent to three months operating expenditure. This amount is necessary to ensure the continuity of the operations and the maintenance of efficient systems of administration and management. At the current level of activity this equates to a required balance of free reserves of approximately £219,653; the current level of free reserves is £43,478.

The policy of the company is to generate income relating to the delivery of its charitable objectives which will allow it to accumulate free reserves until the target level has been achieved.

Current year and financial position

The directors consider the performance of the company to be satisfactory.

Future developments

This has been an eventful year for the Trust aided by the securing of funding from the Welsh Assembly Governments Communities First Fund. This funding will allow the 3 G's to put its plans into action and already some of the benefits of this action are evident. This year has seen the opening of the Forsythia and the 3 G's Information Centre, both venues being extremely popular and well used by the community.

There is much to do and now, with a fully staffed team the Trust will be able to build on its work to date and further develop its links with the community. The coming year will see the improvement of the Cinema Club and the introduction of a community newspaper. There are many other projects planned including a re-cycling and clean up task force scheme.

The future looks bright, supported by the Welsh Assembly Government there are the resources to carry out much needed improvement to our communities. The success of this work is dependant upon the continued support of the community.

Principal activity, objects and organisation of work

The company is a non profit making organisation whose liability is limited by guarantee and a Registered Charity, as such it is governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association. The 3 G's Development Trust principal activity is that of community regeneration within the areas of the Old Gurnos, New Gurnos, Galon Uchaf and Penydarren. Full details of activities during the year are given in the annual report; copies of which are available from the principal office.

The company is organised so that the directors meet regularly to manage its affairs. The Lead Officer has a central administration team which controls the day to day operation of the company. The remaining staff are directly employed in the delivery of the charitable projects.

Related parties

Many partner organisations and agencies work in the £G's area bringing their professional expertise on a range of issues. The 3G's works closely with all the community associations in the area including New Gurnos Residents Board, Galon Uchaf Residents Board, Old Gurnos Tenants and Residents Board, Natures Angels and New Gurnos Fundraising Group. Merthyr Tydfil County Borough Council is the lead co-ordinator of Communities First Funding from the Welsh Assembly Government. Other partners/organisations include Groundwork Merthyr & RCT, Safer Merthyr Tydfil, NSPCC, North Glamorgan NHS Trust, South Wales Police, Barnados, Community Education, Job Centre Plus, Goetre Family Project, Triangle Project, Family Support Group, Citizens Advice Bureau, citizens Advice Bureau, Neighbourhood Watch Association, Credit Union Gurnos Community Workshops & Neighbourhood Learning Centre, WEA, Working Links, Career Wales, Sanctuary, Venture Wales, Local Health Group, and Voluntary Action Merthyr Tydfil.

Notes to the Accounts for the year ended 31st March 2004

1. Principal Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting. These financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention as modified to incorporate the revaluation of certain assets, in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standards, the relevant provisions of the Charities Act 1993 and the Statement of Practice "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" (SORP 2000).

Status. The 3G's Development Trust is a company limited by guarantee and a Registered Charity. It is a non-profit making organisation funded by grants for specific restricted objectives. As such it is governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association in achieving its specific charitable objectives.

Fund Balances. The balances held are separated between restricted and unrestricted funds. Balances on restricted funds are subject to specific restrictive conditions imposed from the funding source. Unrestricted funds are available to be utilised by the trustees in the furtherance of the general objectives of the organisation.

Tangible Fixed Assets are capitalised and written off over their expected useful life in accordance with the guidelines laid down by the charities SORP. Assets are capitalised when they have an expected useful life to the charity in excess of one year and are in excess of the de-minimis limit of £100.

Leased Assets. Fixed assets acquired under finance leases are included in the balance sheet at historic cost less accumulated depreciation. The present value of future rentals is shown as a liability. Interest payable in each period is charged as an expended resource in proportion to the amount outstanding under the lease. Operating lease rentals are charged as expended resources as incurred.

Depreciation. The company provides for depreciation on tangible fixed assets at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life:

Equipment 25% on cost Freehold Land & Buildings 2% on cost

Leasehold improvements Over the life of the lease

Stock is included in the balance sheet at the lower of cost or net realisable value, provisions being made as appropriate against any obsolete or slow moving items. Where stock is held for a specific restricted purpose the relevant incoming resources are held as balances on restricted funds.

Deferred Income. Income or grants received in advance are held as deferred income and carried forward to future accounting periods to be released when the defined purposes of the work or project have been completed, approved or certified.

Gifts in Kind are included in the income and expenditure account, where they are applied in carrying out the organisations activities, where the company would otherwise have to purchase the donated facility and the benefit is both quantifiable and material. The quantifiable benefit is shown as both incoming and expended resources within the appropriate funds and full details of the gifts are disclosed in note 9.

Unrestricted Incoming Resources are in received in the furtherance of the non-profit making objects of the company and relate to contributions made by participants to activities, miscellaneous rentals which contribute towards running costs and new deal payments which help support the related costs.
