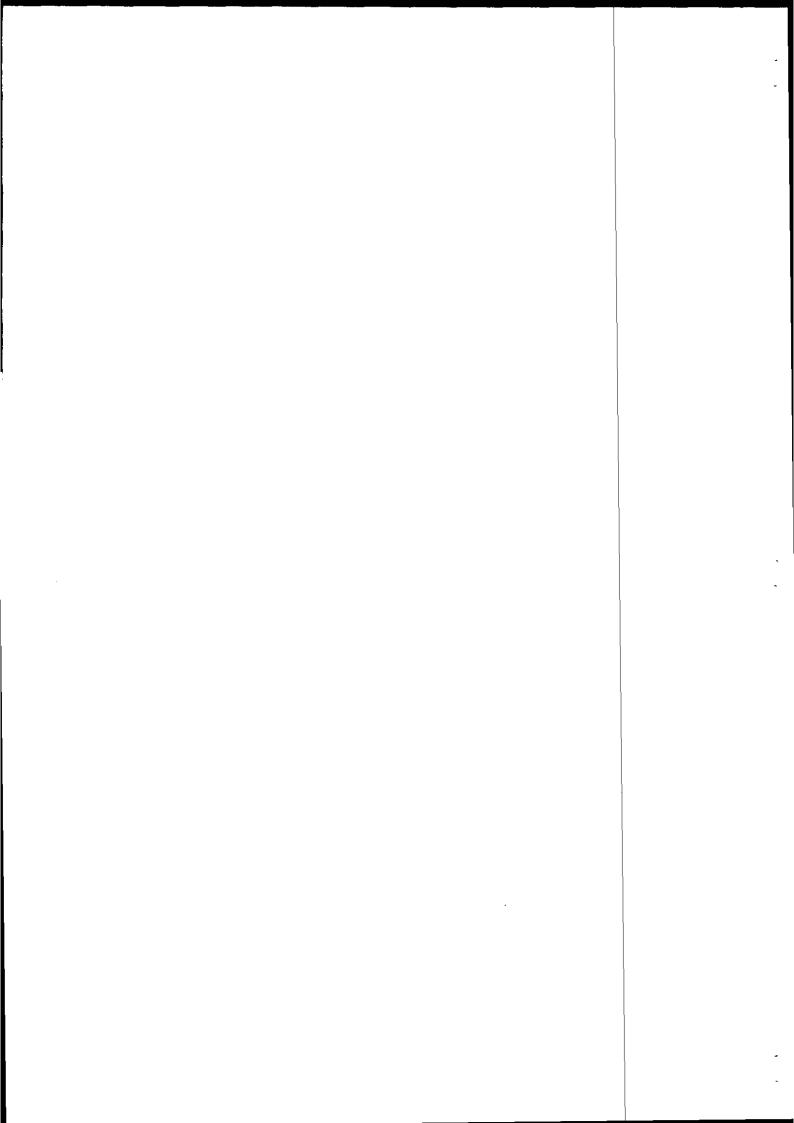

#### Governance

Prepare the accounts on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the company will continue in business.

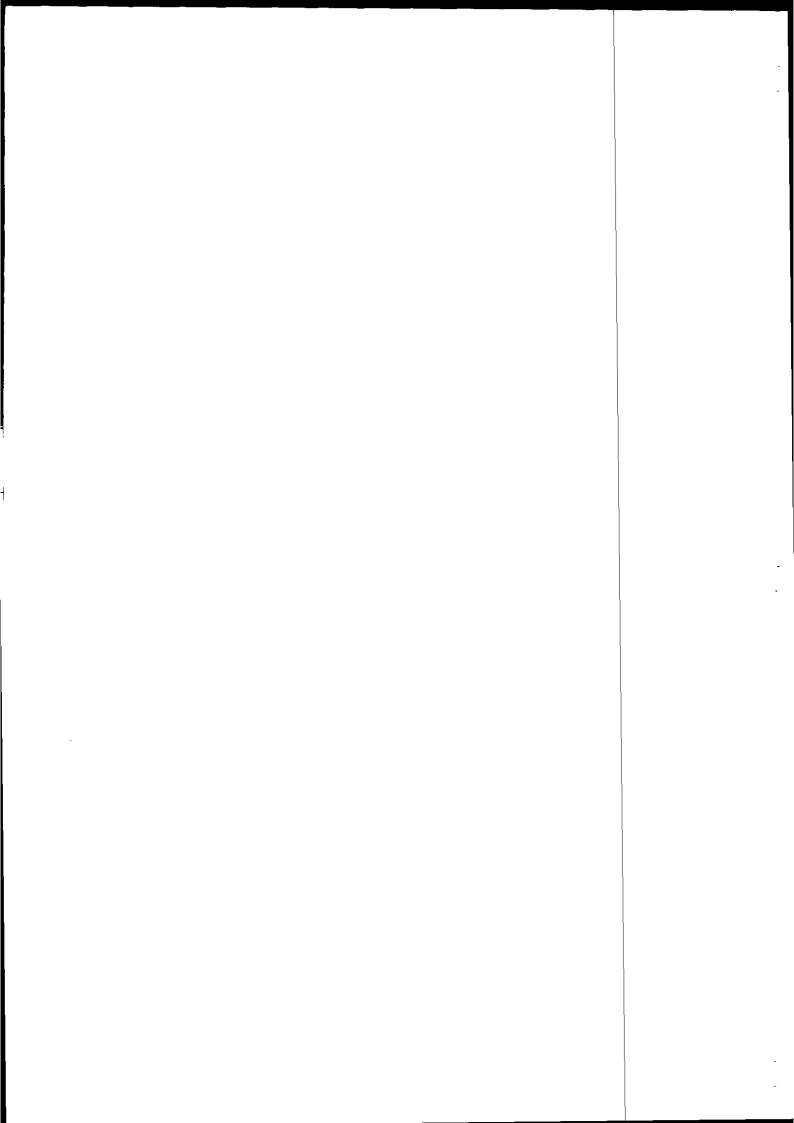

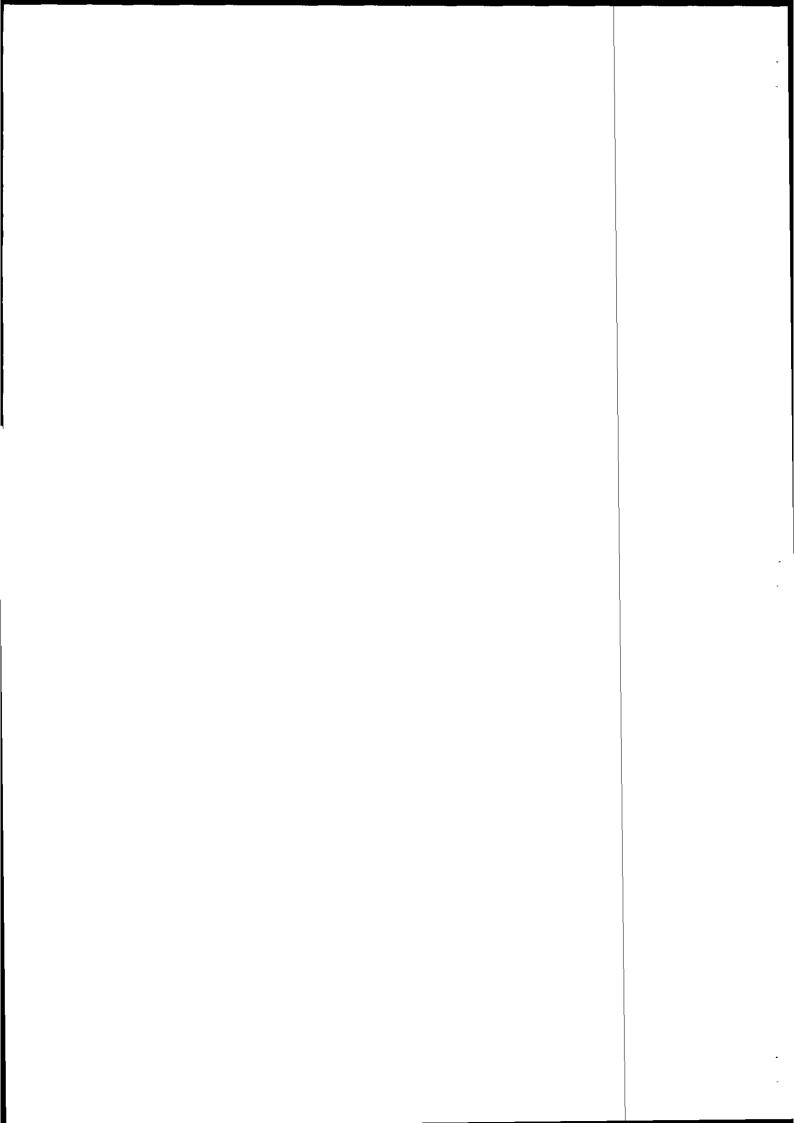
#### INDEPENDENT EXAMINERS' STATEMENT

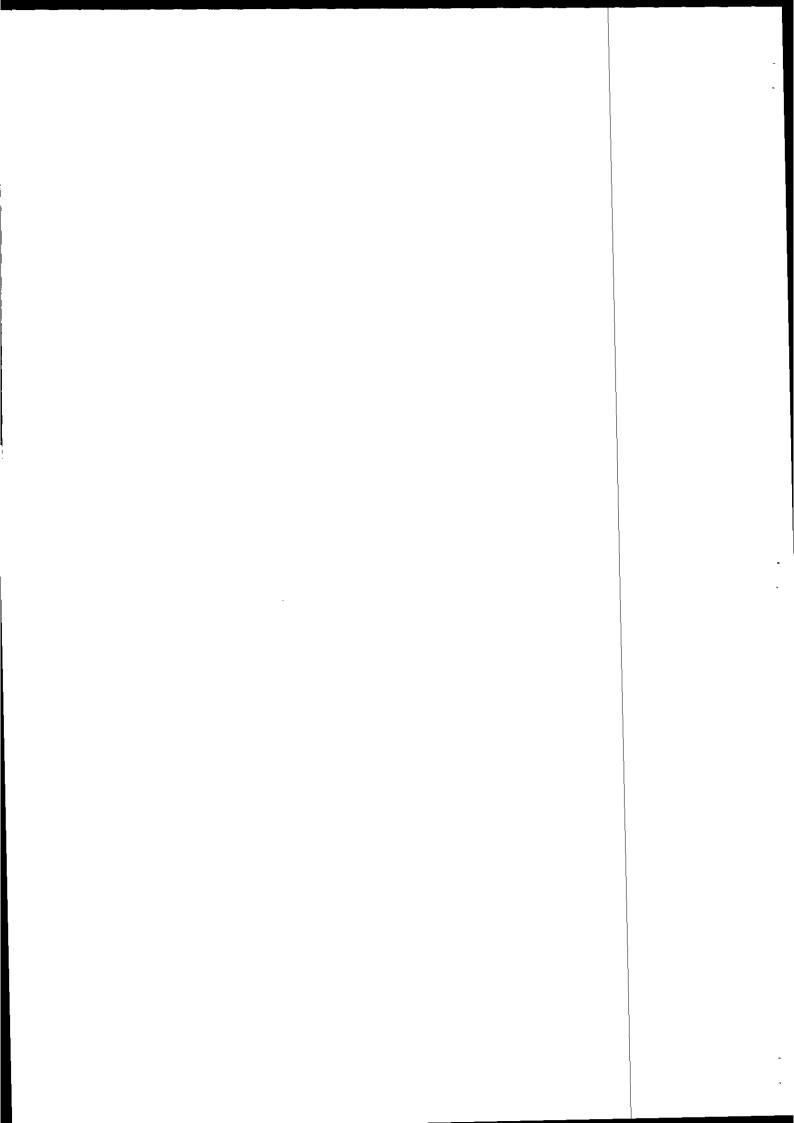

#### 1 Accounting Policies

#### **Basis of Accounting**

The Accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

The company has taken advantage of the exemptions in Financial Reporting Standard No.1 from the requirement to produce a cash flow statement on the grounds that it is a small company.

#### **Incoming Resources**

Incoming resources represent the total donations received from members and well wishers during the period.

#### Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated to write down the cost less estimated residual value of all tangible fixed assets other than freehold land by reducing balance method. The rates generally applicable are:

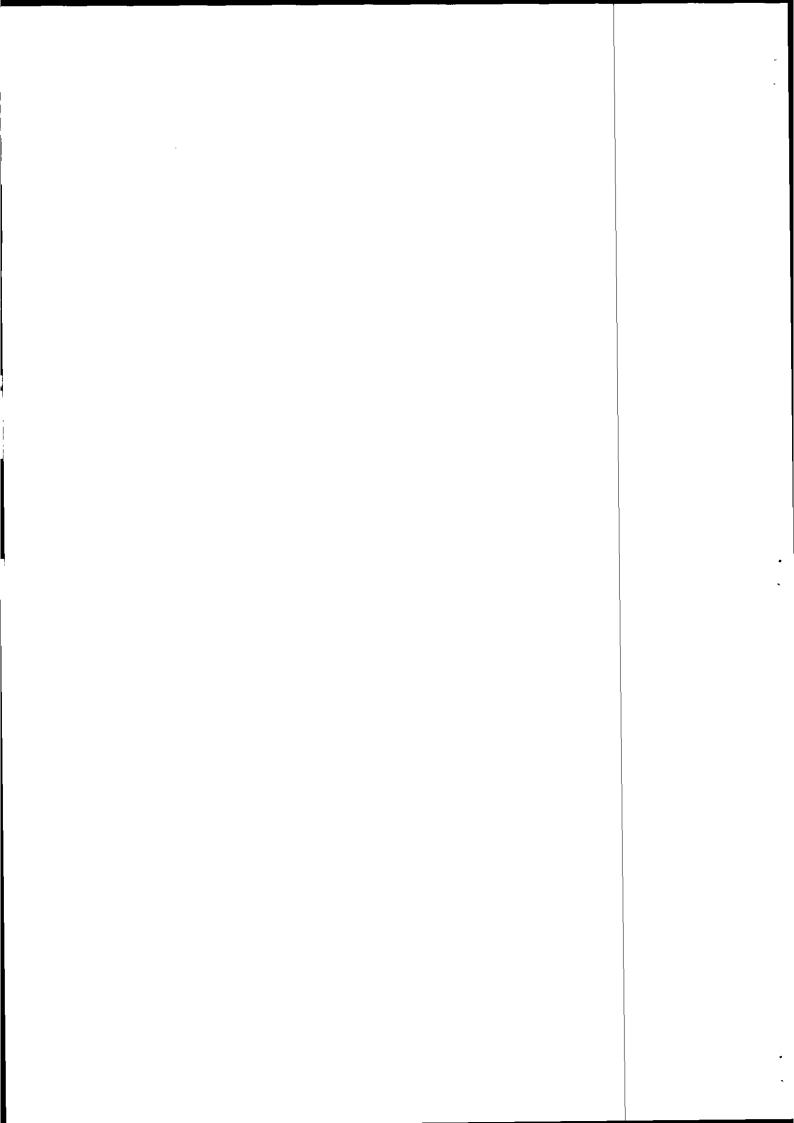
#### 2 Incoming Resources
