Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

The directors of the Charitable Company ("the charity") are its trustees for the purpose of the Charity Commission and throughout this report are collectively referred to as the trustees. As set out in the Articles of Association, the number of trustees shall not be less than three, but shall not be subject to any maximum. Trustees are elected annually by members of the charitable company attending the Annual General Meeting. Subsequent to the first Annual General Meeting, one-third of the trustees are required to retire in rotation. Recruiting New Trustees

Appropriate trustees with specialist skills are identified by the day to day manager and/or the Trustees. A meeting is then arranged with the day to day manager to introduce the Trustee to the work of the Youth Trust. A subsequent meeting is arranged with the Chair of the Trustees. Informal references are followed up and, if successful, the New Trustee is provided with a welcome pack (which includes the Memorandum of Association of the Youth Trust, The Articles of Association and the Trustees' Responsibilities) and invited to meet the other trustees and observe a Trustees. Meeting. Provided both new and existing Trustees are comfortable with the appointment, the new Trustee is voted on to the Board at the next meeting.

Structure, Governance and Management

The Isle of Wight Youth Trust (charity number 294783) was dissolved on 30 June 2001. The assets and liabilities of the charity were transferred to the new charity, registered number 1087163, under the same name, which is a company limited by guarantee, incorporated 29th January 2001, company number 04149036.

Risk management

The trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error

The trustees have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, in particular those related to the operation and finances of the Trust, and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate any exposure to the major risks. The trustees are continually monitoring risks in the light of contracts being awarded. Budgets are set annually and monitored by the Trustees. The Finance Sub Group deals with any financial matters.

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2007

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The objects of the charity are to advance the education and training of young people through the relief of poverty, distress and sickness. The charity meets the need for an independent service which bridges the gap in the network of care provided for young people by the statutory agencies in the Isle of Wight. To achieve this, the Isle of Wight. Youth Trust

- * promote the study of and research into all aspects of the problems faced by young people and disseminate results appropriately
- * provide a confidential and independent counselling and advice service for young people
- * offer counselling, advice, and information to the parents guardians and families of young people
- * contribute to the health education programmes and activities run by the statutory authorities and schools
- * organise or contribute to exhibitions, meetings, lectures, seminars and any activities, involving young people, as appropriate
- * co-operate and work in partnership with statutory and charitable bodies engaged in work with young people

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

Since February 1985, the Trust has been providing counselling for young people on the Island, from 1, St John's Place, Newport Young people contact the Trust themselves, or a parent, GP or other professional contacts the Trust on the young person's behalf Each person can see the same counsellor for up to six weeks and all counsellors are qualified and accredited

Over 600 new young people and their families have had contact with the Trust over the last year with 1515 counselling appointments being made—two thirds by females and one third by males. Young people come with a variety of issues, high on the list are relationship problems, anxiety, depression and self harming. In today's society, young people are experiencing more and more external pressures. However, society does not always provide young people with the mechanisms needed to not only survive, but to thrive. Hence, they increasingly rely on extreme behaviours such as self harming, substance misuse and withdrawal to get by. The Youth Trust provides a service where young people, through counselling, can access their own inner resources, leading to increased self-confidence, self-respect and less inappropriate patterns of behaviour. The Trust offers them a safe place, confidentiality and the time, with the help of a counsellor, to explore and understand their difficulties.

It is with thanks to a donation by a member of the public that the Trust once again this year has been able to offer counselling to children and their families (Child Trust) Many families contact the Trust asking for help, sadly, we are only able to see three a week. Our aim for the coming year is to encourage funders to contract with the Trust to provide this much needed service.

This last year we piloted a new look charity shop, by purchasing new items, taking items for sale on a fifty/fifty basis and donated items. This was a lot of extra work for Youth Trust personnel and the profit made was not enough to warrant carrying on. So with much regret a decision was made to close the shop

On a lighter note, the Trust continues to develop and serve young people of the Island. It has been able to offer consistency in a forever changing environment, but at the same time be flexible to the needs of young people. The Trust instigated and developed the Wight 2B Heard project which this year held its 7th successful conference and now sits with Connexions and Youth and Community. Over the past two years the Trust has been working with Portsmouth University to develop a young people's website. We work at the cutting edge and are at the forefront of developments for young people.

None of this would be possible though without a dedicated workforce and board of Trustees

Fundraising activities

In terms of income generation, the Youth Trust has provided welfare services at the following events the 2006 Rock Festival, the Bestival, and Island concerts

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standards for Smaller Entities (effective January 2005) and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy

Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Cost of generating funds

Costs of generating funds comprise those costs associated with attracting voluntary income and the costs of trading for fundraising purposes including the charity's shop

Charitable activities

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes such costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of indirect nature necessary to support them

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its useful economic life

Plant and machinery

-15% on reducing balance

Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements

Pensions

The charitable company operates a defined contribution pension scheme Contributions payable for the year are charged in the Statement of Financial Activity
