#### STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

#### Governing document

The Charity is a company limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 1985 and is governed by its Memorandum & Articles of Association The Company was incorporated on 26 June 2001 and registered as a charity on 14 May 2002

#### Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

Appointment of Trustees is governed by the Memorandum & Articles of Association. The Board of Trustees is authorised to appoint new Trustees to fill vacancies arising through resignation, or the death of an existing Trustee.

#### Organisational structure

The scheme is now dormant and a resolution to close and dissolve the scheme is to be put to an EGM

#### Related parties

The Charity is a Branch Scheme member of Crossroads Association, a national charity also incorporated as a company limited by guarantee

#### Risk management

The trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error. The trustees have considered potential risks to which the Charity may be exposed and have plans in place to protect it's assets.

#### **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

#### Objectives and aims

The principal objective of the Charity was to promote, offer, support and deliver a high quality of service to carers, recognising their individual needs and involving them in the development of those services. Such support was provided as a means of relieving the stresses experienced by carers, and children and adults who have care needs, as a result of disability, illness or age by offering a respite service through the provision of community-based support workers

South Gloucestershire Crossroads was committed to treating carers and people with care needs with respect and sensitivity, recognising the dignity and value of each person for whom a service was provided

#### ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

#### Charitable activities

Our grant aided funding decreased slightly during the year to 31 March 2011, from which date grant funding was replaced by individual contracts. Care hours provided to clients remained reasonably consistent but then reduced from late 2010.

#### Fundraising activities

Although the charity did not undertake direct fundraising activities it remained grateful to those supporters who donated additional funds to the charity. This amounted to £2,508 during the year (2010 - £1,817)

#### Investment performance

The Memorandum & Articles of Association authorise the trustees to make and hold investments using the general funds of the charity. Currently the trustees hold funds on deposit in a business reserve account held at NatWest bank. Such funds were held in readiness to meet the day to day needs of the Charity.

### FINANCIAL REVIEW

### Reserves policy

The Trustees determined that reserves should be at least at the level to fund an orderly closure of the scheme This is likely to be achieved

#### Principal funding sources

The principal source of funding of the charities activities was South Gloucestershire Council Community Care and Housing Department and South Gloucestershire Primary Care Trust A breakdown of grants received from those sources is shown in note 2 to these financial statements

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Companies Act 2006 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities

#### Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy

#### Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

#### Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities

#### Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes
