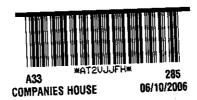

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

The last year has been one of promise and excitement after a long period of waiting and gestation. We are now on the verge of finally moving forward with the major Llanelly House project and have enjoyed a good year full of work on other interesting and significant heritage projects.

Llanelly House

After something of an hiatus in the second half of 2005 the New Year saw a flurry of activity leading in May, to an application for an AHF Acquisition Loan to purchase the lease from the Town Council-supported by a Project Organiser Grant, Refundable Project Development Grant and Project Administration Grant from the same source. These are due for determination in late June 2006.

The Llanelly House project itself continues to develop under the Town Council's Project Director William Wilkins. Though there remains some confusion over the County Council's interest in a more ambitious cultural heritage scheme covering the wider area around the House there has been excellent progress in securing PRF funding for the external works and other sources of support - including private contributions - to support the latter stages of the scheme. Our hope is to acquire the 99 year lease from the Town Council by June 2006 - or at the latest by September if PRF funding becomes a condition of our acquiring the site.

Inner Courtyard (Newton House)

The final Feasibility and Options Study was received and submitted to the AHF early in 2006. The feasibility study has been exceptionally successful and has contributed to National Trust commitment and the quite unexpected purchase of the Inner Courtyard. This will form a crucial element in the overall development of this major cultural, ecological, historical and landscape site.

Rugby Heritage Centre

Developed from our 2004 Llanelli Heritage Development Study, this takes the form of the current proposal for a scoping and feasibility study into the development of a unique heritage centre for the long rugby tradition and cultural heritage of Llanelli, Carmarthenshire and Wales. Start is due in July 2006.

Rugby Oral History Project

Also stimulated by the Llanelli Heritage Development Study, this has led to the development of an HLF bid for funding an oral history project gathering material from a wide range of community sources across Carmarthenshire. Negotiations with funders is ongoing and a steering group is to be established in Summer 2006.

Gwendraeth Valley Heritage Survey

At the request of the community councils in the Gwendraeth area in July 2005 the CHRT was asked to develop a comprehensive survey of the area's heritage assets with a view to developing a number of capital projects for the 2006/2007 period and beyond. The project is currently awaiting a funding decision (June 2006).

Police Voices

Drawing on our success with Voices of Agriculture and more recent experience in developing the rugby oral history project this scheme - to run in 2006/2007 - will research, record and celebrate the unique role played by the police in our communities and record their

experiences for posterity as well as spin off uses in police training and community liaison. A proof of concept demonstration was agreed with Dyfed Powys Police in April 2006.

Dinefwr Advocacy Group

As part of the ongoing and close relationship with the National Trust in Llandeilo, the Secretary was asked to work on a contract basis in support of a new initiative of the National Trust's to develop a partnership development and community participation programme in support of the wider Dinefwr Park and Castle project.

Other Projects

The Trust explored and took part in a number of other projects throughout the year that did not necessarily lead to any specific capital or revenue schemes. These included: Whitford Lighthouse - advising and support the Gower Society: Cardigan Castle - a possible capital scheme now in the hands of a local BPT: Parc Howard - a proposed feasibility study in relation to Llanelly House but not supported: Guildhall Carmarthen - currently being considered as a potential feasibility and options study: Cilgwyn Mansion - surveyed for a possible Trust project but likely to be a private sale: Kidwelly Heritage Centre - support and advice to Modern Welsh and the Town Council.

Financial Performance

Our turnover and financial activity were modest as in the previous year, turnover being £44,000 (£53,000 in 2005). We continue to receive excellent support from our accountants - L H Phillips & Co. of Carmarthen and have also secured the services of a VAT advisor - Alun Mathias of VAR Capital. Both will provide invaluable services as we proceed to a significantly increased turnover as and when the Llanelly House project gets underway.

Staffing

The period saw the departure of Bonnie Hewson in September 2005 and the arrival of Bethan Bishop as Director of Projects in February 2006. Though Bethan is on a short term fixed contract at present she has already made a significant contribution to the work of the CHRT.

Conclusion

I must again express my thanks to my vice chair - J C Williams MBE - for his support and for taking the Chair on my occasional absences and to all my fellow Trustees for their long standing commitment. The various partners also played a crucial role during the year - particularly the National Trust, for whom I have the honour of acting as Vice Chair in Wales, and Trinity College. Both of them provided essential resources, support and guidance throughout the year. Carmarthenshire County Council also played a major role and our relationship with them is a rich complex and rewarding partnership.

In conclusion, 2006/2007 promises to be a most exciting and enervating year with challenges and opportunities for which we have so well prepared ourselves - we look forward to the future with great enthusiasm.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable United Kingdom accounting standards, the Statement of Recommended Practice "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" issued in March 2005 (SORP 2005) and the Companies Act 1985.

Charitable status was awarded in November 2004. The accounts for future periods will be produced in compliance with Charities Statements of Recommended Presentation.

Cash flow statement

The trustees have taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 (revised) from including a cash flow statement in the financial statements on the grounds that the charity company is small.

Fixed assets
