CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

Chairman's Report to the Annual General Meeting

The last year has been one of growing activity on the C H R T's key long term Llanelly House project though the Trust continued to pursue a range of other important heritage projects

LLANELLY HOUSE

The Llanelly House project itself continued to develop under Llanelli Town Council's and its Project Director William Wilkins but with growing input and support from C H R T personnel Key events during the year included

- -disappointing results from the County Council led application for Welsh Assembly Physical Regeneration Fund support(December 2006)
- -a new approach to the Heritage Lottery Fund for a 70%grant to a project costed at just under £5m was positively received (later submitted in early July 2007)
- -application successfully made to Hidden Dragon funding towards the cost of a Project Development Co-ordinator(matched with the existing AHF funding offer)
- development of a major new After Use Business Plan generously sponsored by the Town Council This turned out to be a seminal moment for the project's future (January 2007)
- -development of a potential partnership with Trinity College Carmarthen to run part of the upper floor of the restored House as a heritage oriented enterprise incubator space (March 2007)
- -development of a very positive working relationship with the County Council who offered to take on the heritage use of the middle floor of the restored House
- -continuing to strengthen and develop the core relationship between the C H R T and the Llanelli Town Council

THE BIG PICTURE

Undoubtedly a success story of 2006/7 and offering a wonderful opportunity for a small group of special needs pupils of Ysgol Tregib, Llandeilo to take forward their interest in the landscape and develop it into a charming photographic exhibition of their work. The project was generously supported by the Countryside Council for Wales and will lead on to a larger and more ambitious project in 2007/8 that will provide a model for similar activity throughout Wales.

RUGBY HERITAGE CENTRE

Sadly, the proposals for a feasibility study were rejected by Carmarthenshire 1Fund on the grounds that it would be at risk of conflict with controversial developments for residential land at Llanelli

RUGBY ORAL HISTORY PROJECT In abeyance pending HLF support

GWENDRAETH VALLEY HERITAGE SURVEY

The project was successfully completed and produced a revealing picture of the wealth of heritage material in the Gwendraeth Valley and offered some excellent projects that can take forward the most interesting of these

POLICE VOICES

No progress due to the non-availability of key project team members

KIDWELLY HERITAGE CENTRE

Continuing to offer support and advice to Modern Welsh though there appear to be difficulties around eligibility for their project

FINANCIAL PERFORMANCE

Our turnover and financial activity was somewhat more modest than in the previous year, turnover being £18,316(£44,543 in 2006) We continue to receive excellent support from our accountants-L H Phillips & Co of Carmarthen and our VAT advisor-Alun Mathias of VAT Capital Both will provide invaluable services as we proceed to a significantly increased turnover when the Llanelly House project gets underway The National Trust has also offered the support of an experienced grants officer-Keith Davies-when the project requires it

STAFFING

The period saw the employment of Bethan Bishop as Director of Projects working on a range of project development- notably the success of phase 1 of the Big Picture Bethan was on a short term fixed contract and made a significant contribution to the work of C H R T She resigned from the post in May 2007 and will be missed

CONCLUSION

I must as always express my thanks to my vice chair-J C Williams MBE-for his support and for taking the Chair on my occasional absences and to all my fellow Trustees for their continued commitment. The various partners also played a crucial role during the year-particularly the National Trust(for whom I have the honour of acting as Chair in Wales), Trinity College and Carmarthenshire County Council All. Three provide essential resources, support and guidance throughout the year Finally, 2007/2008 promises to be a most exciting and enervating year with the challenges and opportunities of Llanelly House-we look forward to this project with great excitement.
