Structure, Governance and Management

Avery Hill Charitable Trust is a charitable company limited by guarantee, incorporated on 10th February 2004 and registered as a charity on 26th April 2004. Church activities are carried out under the name of Avery Hill Christian Fellowship. The company was established under a Memorandum of Association, which set the objects and powers of the charitable company and is governed under its Articles of Association. Membership is open to those over 18 who subscribe to the Statement of Beliefs contained in the Memorandum and Articles of Association and are accepted by the Board of trustees. There are currently four members (four in 2010) of the Company, each of whom agrees to contribute £1 in the event of the charity winding up

In accordance with the Articles of Association the minimum number of Trustees is three Each year one third of the Trustees are to retire and be available for election at the AGM. No person may be appointed a Trustee unless over the age of eighteen years of age and subscribes to the Statement of Beliefs. It is expected that new Trustees will be appointed from within the church. The board of trustees currently consist of four people who meet on a regular basis to administer the charity.

The Trustees have conducted their own review of the major risks to which the charity is exposed and systems designed to mitigate those risks. The risk of significant shortfall in funding is mitigated by the reserving policy. Internal risks are minimised by the implementation of procedures for authorisation of all transactions and projects. These procedures are periodically reviewed to ensure that they still meet the needs of the charity

Objectives and activities

The company is a charity and exists to advance the Christian faith throughout the world including the worship of God, the instruction and edification of Christians, the care and Christian instruction of young people and children and the evangelisation of non-Christians In addition the charity exists to relieve poverty, hardship, sickness and distress among all peoples of the world, promote education and training and to support such other charities and charitable purposes as the Trustees shall decide. To achieve these objects the charity undertakes a number of activities.

The church meets at Southspring, on the Avery Hill estate in South East London. Worship meetings are held on a Sunday with weekly bible study and prayer meetings held at the church or in smaller groups in homes around the locality. Sunday school and a young peoples group also operate on a Sunday morning. During the week there are clubs for young people and the elderly held at the church premises as well as a parent and toddlers group and a card making club. The church is also active in the community running an after school club at the local primary school, providing input for religious education lessons and assemblies as well as involvement in the local Sure Start Centre. The local community police panel for the Avery Hill ward also meet at the church. The charity also supports charities whose operations meet the objects of the charity.

Achievements and performance

It has been another active year with over 100 people attending church services on a regular basis. The main service is our weekly Sunday worship meeting which during the course of the year saw a number of special services including a child dedication, Easter and Christmas carol services. Church members also meet in eight home groups throughout the area.

During the year the church continued to work in the local community through the provision of an after school club at the local primary school and a drop-in meeting for the elderly and a thriving parent and toddlers group both of which meet at the church. In June the church took part in the Big Lunch initiative opening up its building to provide food, games and crafts for people in the community. The event was well attended with over 200 people joining in the fun. Once again members of the church supported the Lark in the Park summer celebration held in Sidcup over two weeks. Two ladies meetings were also held with over 40 women attending each one.

The church continued to support cross cultural mission through iNet which is a charity that provides financial and spiritual advice, training and information to a number of missionaries based overseas. The church also provides direct financial support to two families working overseas, one based in the Lebanon and the other in Bulgaria. The organisation also supported XLP a charity based in South East London working with young people. The food donated at our harvest celebration together with that from Alderwood School was given to the local Foodbank which provides food parcels to those in need.

The Trustees have complied with the duty to have due regard to the public benefit guidance published by the Charity Commission in December 2008

Financial review

Total income for the year amounted to £109,073 compared to expenditure of £105,670 resulting in a surplus of £3,403. The net incoming resources for the year amounted to £3,403 of which a surplus of £2,871 was attributable to restricted activities and £532 to general reserves which now stands at £109,964 of which £5,000 is in a designated fund. The Trustees consider that unrestricted funds not committed or invested in tangible assets ("the free reserves") held by the charity should be in the order of six months salary, rent and other church expenses, approximately £50,000. As at the 29th February 2012 free reserves were significantly above this amount but are expected to reduce in the future

The Trustees have considered the most appropriate policy for investing funds and that short-term deposits meet the requirement to provide income without restricting access to the funds

Plans for future periods

The charity plans to continue the activities outlined above in the forthcoming years subject to satisfactory funding arrangements. These include

Weekly worship service
Midweek meetings and home groups
Children's and youth meetings
Parent & Toddlers group
The Big Lunch
After school club at Alderwood School
Drop-in for older people

In addition a church weekend away at Ashbumham Place is to be held in March 2012 and it is planned to open a Foodbank in the autumn for the Avery Hill Bexley area with help from the Trussell Trust

Trustees' responsibilities in relation to the financial statements

Company law requires the Trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of the affairs of the charitable company as at the balance sheet date and of its incoming resources and application of resources, including income and expenditure, for the financial year. In preparing those financial statements, the Trustees should follow best practice and

- Select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently,
- Make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent, and
- Prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to assume that the company will continue on that basis

The Trustees are responsible for maintaining proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charitable company and to enable then to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. The Trustees are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charitable company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Independent examiner

The Trustees intend to ask the existing examiner to undertake the independent examination of the charity next year

INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT TO THE TRUSTEES OF AVERY HILL CHARITABLE TRUST

I have examined the accounts for the year ended 29th February 2012 on pages 5 to 9 following which have been prepared on the basis of the accounting policies set out on page 7

Respective responsibilities of the Directors/Trustees and Examiner

- e) Items of equipment are capitalised where the purchase price is above £2,500
- f) Unrestricted funds are donations and other incoming resources receivable or generated for the objects of the charity without further specified purpose and are available as general funds
- g) Restricted funds are to be used for specified purposes as laid down by the donor Expenditure, which meets these criteria, is charged to the fund
