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Report of the trustees for the year ended 28th February 2009

Structure, Governance and Management

Avery Hill Charitable Trust is a charitable company limited by guarantee, incorporated on 10th February 2004 and registered as a charity on 26th April 2004. Church activities are carried out under the name of Avery Hill Christian Fellowship. The company was established under a Memorandum of Association, which established the objects and powers of the charitable company and is governed under its Articles of Association. Membership is open to those over 18 who subscribe to the Statement of Beliefs contained in the Memorandum and Articles of Association and are accepted by the Board of trustees. There are currently four members (four in 2008) of the Company, each of whom agrees to contribute £1 in the event of the charity winding up.

In accordance with the Articles of Association the minimum number of Trustees is three. Each year one third of the Trustees are to retire and be available for election at the AGM. No person may be appointed a Trustee unless over the age of eighteen years of age and subscribes to the Statement of Beliefs. It is expected that new Trustees will be appointed from within the church. The board of trustees currently consist of four people who meet on a regular basis to administer the charity.

The Trustees have conducted its own review of the major risks to which the charity is exposed and systems designed to mitigate those risks. The risk of significant shortfall in funding is mitigated by the reserving policy. Internal risks are minimised by the implementation of procedures for authorisation of all transactions and projects. These procedures are periodically reviewed to ensure that they still meet the needs of the charity.

Objectives and activities

The company is a charity and exists to advance the Christian Faith throughout the world generally including the worship of God, the instruction and edification of Christians, the care and Christian instruction of young people and children and the evangelisation of non-Christians. In addition the charity exists to relieve poverty, hardship, sickness and distress among all peoples of the world, promote education and training and to support such other charities and charitable purposes as the Trustees shall decide. To achieve these objects the charity undertakes a number of activities.

The congregation meets at Avery Hill Christian Fellowship, Southspring, Sidcup on the Avery Hill estate in South East London. Worship meetings are held on a Sunday with weekly bible study and prayer meetings held at the church or in smaller groups in homes around the locality. Sunday school and young peoples group also operates on a Sunday morning. During the week there are clubs for mothers and toddlers, young people and the elderly held at the church premises. The organisation also supports charities whose operations meet the objects of the charity.

Achievements and performance

There are some 75 adults and 20 children who attend the church on a regular basis with many others who attend the various other activities that occur at the church.

As reported last year the church embarked on a number of initiatives under the nationwide Hope 08 banner. These included outreach into the local community, organising events at the church such as an evening with Jennifer Rees-Lacombe (Beauty from Ashes) and the provision of an Alpha Course. As a result of these initiatives several new people now attend the church with additional people visiting on an ad hoc basis.

During the year under review a group from the church travelled to Razgrad in Bulgaria to meet up with one of the missionary families supported by the church. As well as refurbishing one of the church member's home the group met people from the local Millet community, visited an orphanage and took part in several church meetings.

Other activities included a week of prayer in October, joining with other churches in Sidcup for the annual Lark in the Park summer celebration, together with special Christmas and Easter services. In October three people were baptised at a special service.

The church supported a number of charities during the year. iNet is a charity which provides financial and spiritual advice and information to a number of missionaries based overseas. The charity also provides direct financial support to one such family and also to another missionary family based in the Lebanon. The organisation also supported XLP a charity based in South East London working with young people and Youth for Christ a nationwide charity working with young people.

Financial review

The net incoming resources for the year amounted to £ 16,601 of which there was an inflow of £696 from restricted activities and an inflow of £15,905 was the amount attributable to general reserves, which now stands at £96,459.

The Trustees consider that unrestricted funds not committed or invested in tangible assets ("the free reserves") held by the charity should be in the order of three months salary, rent and other church expenses, approximately £10,000. As at the 28th February 2009 free reserves were significantly above this amount but are expected to reduce in the future once a full time pastor is appointed.

The Trustees have considered the most appropriate policy for investing funds and consider that short-term deposits meet the requirement to provide income without restricting access to the funds

Plans for future periods

The charity plans to continue the activities outlined above in the forthcoming years subject to satisfactory funding arrangements. Following the search for a new pastor the Trustees are pleased to report that since 1st September 2009 Rob Stevens who was previously Minister in training at Merland Rise Church in Surrey has taken up the role. As a result of this appointment the services of Alan Murphy have ceased. The Trustees wish to record their grateful thanks to him for all his valuable input into the church over the past two and a half years

Trustees' responsibilities in relation to the financial statements

Company law requires the Trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of the affairs of the charitable company as at the balance sheet date and of its incoming resources and application of resources, including income and expenditure, for the financial year. In preparing those financial statements, the Trustees should follow best practice and:

- Select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- Make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and
- Prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to assume that the company will continue on that basis.

The Trustees are responsible for maintaining proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charitable company and to enable then to ensure that the financial statements

comply with the Companies Act 1985. The Trustees are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charitable company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Independent examiner

The Trustees intend to ask the existing auditors to undertake the independent examination of the charity next year.

Notes forming part of the financial statements for the year ended 28th February 2009

1. Accounting policies

- a) The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention in accordance with the Companies Act 1985 and follow the recommendations in Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice (revised 2005).
- b) Income is received by way of donations and gifts and is included in full in the Statement of Financial Activities in the year in which they are receivable.
- c) Incoming resource from investment income is included when receivable.
- d) Resources expended are recognised in the period in which they are incurred. Resources expended include attributable VAT, which cannot be recovered.
- e) Items of equipment are capitalised where the purchase price is above £2,500.
- f) Unrestricted funds are donations and other incoming resources receivable or generated for the objects of the charity without further specified purpose and are available as general funds
- g) Restricted funds are to be used for specified purposes as laid down by the donor. Expenditure, which meets these criteria, is charged to the fund.

2. Voluntary Income

Voluntary income consists of donations funded by those attending Avery Hill Christian Fellowship.

3. Investment income

Investment income comprises interest on deposit with the charity's bankers totalling £1,291 (£1,698 in 2008).

4. Incoming resources from charitable activities

During the financial year incoming resources from charitable activities consists of the hire of the church hall which resulted in income of £130 (last year £350), the payment of fees totalling £266 (last year £6,058) in relation to a weekend house party to be held in February 2010 and income of £203 from the Mothers and Toddlers Group (last year £150).
