Day Services

Our day services offer a wide range of practical and emotional support in groups and individually. We provide therapeutic and fun activities, Monday to Friday. Groups are designed to foster a sense of belonging, ownership and mutual support within our community, enabling clients to learn new skills and develop their existing inner resources. Individual support can include assistance with welfare benefits, housing issues, life skills and problem solving. Our overall aim is to work to empower clients in their journey of recovery, to manage their problems, live more effectively, develop under-used resources, and seek missed opportunities. Our goal is to help build self-confidence and self-esteem, to enhance a sense of personal responsibility and, ultimately, to assist our clients in developing alternative—coping strategies and preventing or managing their difficulties.

Crisis Services

Our crisis services are available, to registered Haven clients, twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week. Their purpose is to provide swift response and early intervention at times of crisis. Telephone contact is available twenty-four hours a day and travel arrangements exist to ensure fast access to The Haven, at any time of the day or night, on any day of the week, for those in crisis. The Safe Centre is a sanctuary which can be used for several hours, during the day or during the night, for any registered Haven client in crisis. It has a capacity of four to six people at any one time. Additionally, the Crisis House has four bedrooms for respite admission and a stay may last from one night or up to three weeks maximum.

Social Inclusion Unit

Our social inclusion unit helps Haven registered clients to progress in the outside world in a variety of ways:

Exploring barriers to recovery e.g. emotional barriers/negative strategies/mobility

Literacy and numeracy work

Use of recovery and life plan programmes

Exploring educational opportunities

Pre-access and Access Planning

Voluntary work opportunities

Planning paid employment

Benefits advice in relation to voluntary and paid work and therapeutic earnings

Applying for jobs and interview skills

Exploring your unique aspirations and what your next step might be

The Haven currently has 136 registered clients with a Personality Disorder Diagnosis and 65 of our clients are signed up to Social Inclusion initiatives.
