FOREWORD BY THE CHAIR OF BLACKBURN WITH DARWEN EDUCATION DEVELOPMENT TRUST MIKE MURRAY FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MAY 2007

As Blackburn with Darwen Education Development Trust completes its third full year of operation, the Trustees are pleased to report that their work continues to make a positive difference to the lives of children and young people in our community. The Trust continues to respond to the challenges and opportunities presented through the 'Every Child Matters' agenda.

This year our work has continued to support some of the most vulnerable children and young people living in our community. Our Parenting Fund project has supported self help/voluntary groups of parents with children who have Special Educational needs and disabilities, to help them build skills and become more sustainable. Over 50 'looked-after' children have benefited through our one to one volunteer reading project and drama club, helping them to build resilience, confidence and self esteem.

Children attending the Highercroft Children's Centre, situated in one of the most deprived wards in the borough, now have a high quality, safe outdoor play area, thanks to the generous support of the locally based Eric Wright Trust. As a result, children and young people who are currently excluded from mainstream education have developed new skills, gained an understanding of healthy food and how it's produced and benefited from a boost to their confidence and self esteem by taking part in an allotment project.

Since we were established in August 2004, we have secured a third of a million pounds to support children, young people and families in a particularly deprived part of the country

Our Interfaith project has developed a shared understanding and mutual respect between young people of different faiths from 3 schools in Blackburn with Darwen. A celebration of achievement event was held attended by representatives of the Blackburn with Darwen Borough Council Children's Services department and the schools taking part.

In the past year, our projects have helped 2,000 children and young people and 500 adults, including children in care and children with Special Educational Needs or a disability as well as their parents

We are once again extremely grateful to the charitable trust's corporate supporters and our local business community who have invested in our work during the past twelve months. We now look forward to building on our past experience to meet a new and growing set of challenges in the coming year.

TRUSTEES' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MAY 2007

The Trustees, who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act, submit their annual report and the audited financial statements of Blackburn with Darwen Education Development Trust (the charity) for the year ended 31 May 2007. The Trustees confirm that the annual report and financial statements of the charity comply with current statutory requirements, the requirements of the charity's governing document and the provisions of the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" issued in March 2005.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

a. Constitution

The charity a charitable company limited by guarantee and is constituted under a Memorandum of Association dated 26 02 2004 and is a registered charity number 1105329

b Method of appointment or election of Trustees

The management of the charity is the responsibility of the Trustees who are elected and co-opted under the terms of the Articles of Association

c Policies adopted for the induction and training of Trustees

Trustees are inducted in line with Charity Commission recommendations

d. Organisational structure and decision making

The Trustees meet regularly and receive regular reports from the Chief Officer. The Trustees have delegated responsibility for day-to-day management of the Trust to the Chief Officer. Mrs Mary Carley, who is also responsible for developing and implementing the fundraising strategy.

The Trustees are supported by a Steering Group the members of this are drawn from various interested parties and the Group builds understanding of the Education Development Trust's role among a wider audience and hopefully will identify potential new trustees

e. Risk management

The Trustees have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, in particular those related to the operations and finances of the charity, and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate their exposure to the major risks

The Chief Officer maintains a comprehensive risk register which is regularly updated. The risk register is a standing item at steering group meetings

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

a Policies and objectives

The company's strategic aims are

- 1 To support initiatives to raise the achievement of learners in Blackburn with Darwen
- 2 To meet the diverse learning needs
- 3 To support the development of Blackburn with Darwen as a learning community

There have been no changes in the objectives since the last annual report

b. Strategies for achieving objectives

Blackburn with Darwen Education Development Trust works with voluntary and statutory partners to identify the need for services for children, young people and young families in the Borough Links are established with Blackburn with Darwen Children and Young People's Plan to ensure selected priorities are relevant. A comprehensive fundraising and development strategy is prepared, subject to regular review and amendment

c. Activities for achieving objectives

Funding applications are made to charitable trusts and corporate sponsors in line with Institute of Fundraising Codes of Practice and Education Development Trust priorities. Projects are delivered in partnership with a range of partners and are subject to regular monitoring and review. Where appropriate, external evaluation takes place.

d Grant making policies

Blackburn with Darwen Education Development Trust occasionally awards grants to other voluntary organisations, schools and educational bodies for activities which meet the Education Development Trust's charitable objects Invitations to bid and details of the application process are widely publicised in Blackburn with Darwen

The grants awarded are reported to Trustees and Development Group members and regular updates on key projects are circulated

e. Volunteers

The charity would like to thank all the volunteers who aided the charity during the year in fulfilling its objectives. It is estimated that over 75 volunteer hours were provided during the year, trustees contributed 40 hours and project volunteers 35 hours. If this is conservatively valued at £6 per hour the volunteer effort amounts to approximately £2,700.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

a Review of activities

Out of School Behaviour Clubs has provided training to encourage parents who may be isolated from school. to become more involved with their child's learning and behaviour, funded by Lloyd's TSB and the Children's Fund A donation from the Eric Wright Trust has supported the development of an outdoor play area at the Highercroft Children's Centre, helping children to have fun in a safe environment whilst developing new skills and creativity Grants from the Local Network Fund, Century FM and the Ernest Cook Trust has enabled young people attending the St Thomas Centre Pupil Referral Unit (PRU) to develop an allotment, encouraging healthy eating, team working and building confidence and self esteem. Our Special Place Project is a mobile sensory experience for children with disabilities, it provides a base for short term therapeutic support for children within mainstream provision who experience behavioural and/or emotional difficulties, funded by The Waterside Trust, The Beatrice Laing Trust, The Variety Club, Rock FM and the Shepherd Street Trust Our volunteer reading project has provided one to one volunteer reading support for looked after children supported by The Roald Dahl Foundation, the Noel Buxton Trust and Awards for All The Play Integration Project has enabled children with Special Educational Needs to access mainstream activities with the support of their own fully trained dedicated volunteer, supported by the Children's Chest. Teenage mums attending the St Thomas Centre PRU are learning how to adopt a complete change in lifestyle through the use of gym equipment bought with a grant from The Ironmongers Company Our Interfaith project has developed shared understanding and mutual respect between young people of different faiths from 3 schools in Blackburn with Darwen A celebration event was held attended by representatives of the Blackburn with Darwen Borough Council Children's Services department and schools, made possible with a grant from The Faith Communities Capacity Building Fund And last but not least a Blackburn with Darwen Community Network Grant has enabled further development of our very popular drama project for looked after children

b Fundraising activities/Income generation

The trust's fundraising strategy, approved by Trustees and members of the Development Group has been reviewed during the past year and a number of new initiatives have being identified in line with our mission statement

'To develop and promote additional and diverse opportunities for learning for all in Blackburn with Darwen'

Since we were established in August 2004, we have secured a third of a million pounds to support children, young people and families in one of the most deprived parts of England

Our projects have helped 2,000 children and young people and 500 parents. We give particular support to looked after children, children with special educational needs and disabilities and those who face social isolation.

Fundraising is conducted in line with the Institute of Fundraising's Code of Practice, the Chief Officer, supported by the Fundraising Officer are both members of the Institute

Trustees are kept informed of fundraising approaches and approve fundraising priorities

c. Factors relevant to achieve objectives

Blackburn with Darwen Education Development Trust is dependent on charitable income to meet its objectives. In kind support to the Trust is provided by Blackburn with Darwen Borough Council, business and voluntary sector partners.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

a. Reserves policy

The Trustees aim to maintain general reserves at a maximum of 10% of annual income, until such time as the Trust employs its own staff and assumes liability for pension and redundancy costs. At such time costs such as rent, legal and equipment purchase are likely to also be incurred. Should the general reserves exceed the agreed level, small grants will be made to partner organisations wishing to deliver services which would meet the Trust's charitable objectives. The reserves policy is to be reviewed annually

b. Principal funding

Blackburn with Darwen Education Development Trust's funding is from statutory and charitable grants

PLANS FOR THE FUTURE

a. Future developments

Blackburn with Darwen Education Development Trust's forthcoming priorities include supporting children and young people with disabilities and special needs and vulnerable children and young people. We will continue to support parents and families in need and activities to benefit children and young people throughout the Borough

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MAY 2007

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2005). The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP), "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" published in March 2005, applicable accounting standards and the Companies Act 1985.

12 Company status

The charity is a company limited by guarantee. The members of the company are the Trustees named on page 1. In the event of the charity being wound up, the liability in respect of the guarantee is limited to £1 per member of the charity.

13 Fund accounting

General funds are unrestricted funds which are available for use at the discretion of the Trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity and which have not been designated for other purposes

Restricted funds are funds which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by donors which have been raised by the charity for particular purposes. The cost of raising and administering such funds are charged against the specific fund. The aim and use of each restricted fund is set out in the notes to the financial statements.

14 Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy

Donated services or facilities, which comprise donated services, are included in income at a valuation which is an estimate of the financial cost borne by the donor where such a cost is quantifiable and measurable. No income is recognised where there is no financial cost borne by a third party.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MAY 2007

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

15 Resources expended

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been included under expense categories that aggregate all costs for allocation to activities. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular activities they have been allocated on a basis consistent with the use of the resources.

Fundraising costs are those incurred in seeking voluntary contributions and do not include the costs of disseminating information in support of the charitable activities. Support costs are those costs incurred directly in support of expenditure on the objects of the charity and include project management carried out at Headquarters. Management and administration costs are those incurred in connection with administration of the charity and compliance with constitutional and statutory requirements.

Grants payable are charged in the year when the offer is made except in those cases where the offer is conditional, such grants being recognised as expenditure when the conditions attaching are fulfilled. Grants offered subject to conditions which have not been met at the year end are noted as a commitment, but not accrued as expenditure.
