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#### CHAIRMAN'S STATEMENT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MAY 2008

The chairman presents his statement for the period.

Trust for Children has now completed its fourth full year of operation.

We are delighted to report that we have raised £500,000 since we were established in 2004 to support children, young people and families living in Blackburn with Darwen.

Our projects during 2007 - 08 include:

Our mentoring project helped transform the lives of some of the borough's most vulnerable children and young people who are looked after. Young people enjoyed new social activities they would not normally have the opportunity to participate in. There was an increase in young people's self-esteem and confidence within school and at home and school attendance improved by 60%. The project achieved the Mentoring and Befriending Foundation's (MBF) Approved Provider Standard.

Also during the year our **looked after children drama project** enabled children and young people to gain confidence and self esteem by taking part in positive activities including dance, drama, music and arts. The project supported the five outcomes, enjoy and achieve; be healthy; stay safe; make a positive contribution and achieve economic wellbeing.

Our **parenting fund project** has now completed its third year. The project continues to support 15 self help parental support groups for families with children with disabilities, helping them to become more sustainable, building links with mainstream services, raising professionals' awareness of children with Special Educational Needs and develop links to extended support for parents through voluntary and statutory sectors.

Our **Summer Activity project** supported 12 young people with Special Educational Needs aged 11 – 16 to take part in a Summer residential at Water Park in Cumbria. Young people participated in a range of activities of their choice to help develop skills, knowledge and self esteem in a fun environment. The Summer Activity project also added value to our Parenting Fund project which supported up to 650 parents/carers and children with disabilities.

**The Gatehouse** (now known as Appletrees) short stay and respite multi sensory room project has opened up a whole new world for children with severe sensory impairment or neurological challenges. The multi sensory resource is helping to increase awareness and positive behaviours for children and young people.

We are once again very grateful to the charitable trusts, corporate supporters and our local business community for their support during the past year.

Last but not least, the trustees and members of Trust for Children, wish to extend our gratitude and sincere thanks to Mary Carley, Trust for Children's Charity Correspondent for her dedication and expertise in helping to change the lives of hundreds of children, young people and families in Blackburn with Darwen during the past four years.

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#### TRUSTEES' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MAY 2008

The Trustees, who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act, present their annual report together with the audited financial statements of Trust for Children (the charity) for the year ended 31 May 2008. The Trustees confirm that the annual report and financial statements of the charity comply with the current statutory requirements, the requirements of the charity's governing document and the provisions of the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" issued in March 2005.

#### STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

#### a. CONSTITUTION

The charity is a charitable company limited by guarantee and is constituted under a Memorandum of Association dated 26 February 2004 and is a registered charity number 1105329.

#### **b. METHOD OF APPOINTMENT OR ELECTION OF TRUSTEES**

The management of the charity is the responsibility of the Trustees who are elected and co-opted under the terms of the Articles of Association.

#### c. POLICIES ADOPTED FOR THE INDUCTION AND TRAINING OF TRUSTEES

Trustees are inducted in line with Charity Commission recommendations.

#### d. ORGANISATIONAL STRUCTURE AND DECISION MAKING

The Trustees meet regularly and receive regular reports from the Chief Officer. The Trustees have delegated responsibility for day-to-day management of the Trust to the Chief Officer, Mrs Mary Carley, who is also responsible for developing and implementing the fundraising strategy.

The Trustees are supported by a Steering Group: the members of this are drawn from various interested parties and the Group builds understanding of the Trust for Children's role among a wider audience and hopefully will identify potential new trustees.

#### e. RISK MANAGEMENT

The Trustees have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, in particular those related to the operations and finances of the charity, and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate their exposure to the major risks.

The Chief Officer maintains a comprehensive risk register which is regularly updated. The risk register is a standing item at steering group meetings.

#### **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

#### a. POLICIES AND OBJECTIVES

The company's strategic aims are:

- 1. To support initiatives to raise the achievement of learners in Blackburn with Darwen.
- 2. To meet the diverse learning needs.
- 3. To support the development of Blackburn with Darwen as a learning community.

There have been no changes in the objectives since the last annual report.

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### TRUSTEES' REPORT (continued) FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MAY 2008

#### **b. STRATEGIES FOR ACHIEVING OBJECTIVES**

Trust for Children works with voluntary and statutory partners to identify the need for services for children, young people and young families in the Borough. Links are established with Blackburn with Darwen Children and Young People's Plan to ensure selected priorities are relevant. A comprehensive fundraising and development strategy is prepared, subject to regular review and amendment.

#### c. ACTIVITIES FOR ACHIEVING OBJECTIVES

Funding applications are made to charitable trusts and corporate sponsors in line with Institute of Fundraising Codes of Practice and Trust for Children priorities. Projects are delivered in partnership with a range of partners and are subject to regular monitoring and review. Where appropriate, external evaluation takes place.

#### d. GRANT MAKING POLICIES

Trust for Children occasionally awards grants to other voluntary organisations, schools and educational bodies for activities which meet the Trust for Children's charitable objects. Invitations to bid and details of the application process are widely publicised in Blackburn with Darwen.

The grants awarded are reported to Trustees and Development Group members and regular updates on key projects are circulated.

#### e. VOLUNTEERS

The charity would like to thank all the volunteers who aided the charity during the year in fulfilling its objectives. It is estimated that over 80 volunteer hours were provided during the year, trustees contributed 40 hours and project volunteers 40 hours. If this is conservatively valued at £6 per hour the volunteer effort amounts to approximately £480.

#### **ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE**

#### a. REVIEW OF ACTIVITIES

Our mentoring project helped transform the lives of some of the borough's most vulnerable children and young people who are looked after, this was made possible with a grant from the Blackburn with Darwen Community Network Grant. Looked after children in the borough were also given new opportunities to continue to take part in drama, this enabled children and young people to gain confidence and self esteem by taking part in positive activities including dance, drama, music and arts. This was made possible with support from Awards for All and Blackburn with Darwen Children's Chest. A grant from the Parenting Fund has continued to support self help parental support groups for families with children with disabilities, helping them to become more sustainable, building links with mainstream services, raising professionals' awareness of children with SEN and developing links to extended support for parents through voluntary and statutory sectors. A grant from the Harris Charity and the Local Network Fund has supported a Summer Activity project for 12 young people with Special Educational Needs aged 11 - 16 to take part in a range of activities of their choice to help develop skills, knowledge and self esteem in a fun environment. The Summer Activity project also added value to our Parenting Fund project which supported up to 650 parents/carers and children with disabilities. The Gatehouse short stay and respite multi sensory project benefited with financial support from The Bailey Thomas Charitable Fund; Lifeline 4 Kids; The Clara E Burgess Charity; The David Solomons Charity and a Community Network Grant, opening up a whole new world for children with severe sensory impairment or neurological challenges. The multi sensory resource is helping to increase awareness and positive behaviours for children and young people.

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### TRUSTEES' REPORT (continued) FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MAY 2008

#### b. FUNDRAISING ACTIVITIES/INCOME GENERATION

The trust's fundraising strategy, approved by Trustees and members of the Trust for Children has been reviewed during the past year and a number of new initiatives have being identified in line with our mission statement:

'To develop and promote additional and diverse opportunities for learning for all in Blackburn with Darwen'

Since we were established in August 2004, we have secured half a million pounds to support children, young people and families in one of the most deprived parts of England.

Our projects have helped over 2,200 children and young people and 500 parents. We give particular support to looked after children, children with special educational needs and disabilities and those who face social isolation.

Fundraising is conducted in line with the Institute of Fundraising's Code of Practice, the Chief Officer, supported by the Fundraising Officer are both full members of the Institute. Trustees are kept informed of fundraising approaches and approve fundraising priorities.

#### c. FACTORS RELEVANT TO ACHIEVE OBJECTIVES

Trust for Children is dependent on charitable income to meet its objectives. In kind support to the Trust is provided by Blackburn with Darwen Borough Council, business and voluntary sector partners.

#### **FINANCIAL REVIEW**

#### a. RESERVES POLICY

The Trustees aim to maintain general reserves at a maximum of 10% of annual income, until such time as the Trust employs its own staff and assumes liability for pension and redundancy costs. At such time costs such as rent, legal and equipment purchase are likely to also be incurred. Should the general reserves exceed the agreed level, small grants will be made to partner organisations wishing to deliver services which would meet the Trust's charitable objectives. The reserves policy is to be reviewed annually.

#### b. PRINCIPAL FUNDING

Principal funding for the charity is provided by Blackburn with Darwen Borough Council.

#### PLANS FOR THE FUTURE

#### a. FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS

Trust for Children continues to support children and young people, particularly those with disabilities and special needs and vulnerable children and young people. We also continue to support parents and families in need and activities to benefit children and young people throughout the Borough.

#### TRUSTEES' LIABILITY

The Trustees of the charity guarantee to contribute an amount not exceeding £1 to the assets of the charity in the event of winding up.

#### STATEMENT OF TRUSTEES' RESPONSIBILITIES

#### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MAY 2008

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### 1.1 BASIS OF PREPARATION OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, with the exception of investments which are included at market value, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2007). The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP), "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" published in March 2005, applicable accounting standards and the Companies Act 1985.

#### 1.2 COMPANY STATUS

The charity is a company limited by guarantee. The members of the company are the Trustees named on page 1. In the event of the charity being wound up, the liability in respect of the guarantee is limited to £1 per member of the charity.

#### 1.3 FUND ACCOUNTING

General funds are unrestricted funds which are available for use at the discretion of the Trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity and which have not been designated for other purposes.

Designated funds comprise unrestricted funds that have been set aside by the Trustees for particular purposes. The aim and use of each designated fund is set out in the notes to the financial statements.

Restricted funds are funds which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by donors which have been raised by the charity for particular purposes. The cost of raising and administering such funds are charged against the specific fund. The aim and use of each restricted fund is set out in the notes to the financial statements.

#### 1.4 INCOMING RESOURCES

All incoming resources are included in the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

Donated services or facilities, which comprise donated services, are included in income at a valuation which is an estimate of the financial cost borne by the donor where such a cost is quantifiable and measurable. No income is recognised where there is no financial cost borne by a third party.

Deferred incoming resources are recognised in the accounting period to which they relate.

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#### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MAY 2008

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

#### 1.5 RESOURCES EXPENDED

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been included under expense categories that aggregate all costs for allocation to activities. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular activities they have been allocated on a basis consistent with the use of the resources.

Fundraising costs are those incurred in seeking voluntary contributions and do not include the costs of disseminating information in support of the charitable activities. Support costs are those costs incurred directly in support of expenditure on the objects of the charity and include project management carried out at Headquarters. Management and administration costs are those incurred in connection with administration of the charity and compliance with constitutional and statutory requirements.

Grants payable are charged in the year when the offer is made except in those cases where the offer is conditional, such grants being recognised as expenditure when the conditions attaching are fulfilled. Grants offered subject to conditions which have not been met at the year end are noted as a commitment, but not accrued as expenditure.

#### 1.6 CASH FLOW

The financial statements do not include a cash flow statement because the charitable charity, as a small reporting entity, is exempt from the requirement to prepare such a statement under the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2007).

#### 1.7 PENSIONS

The charity contributes to a defined contribution pension scheme operated by the Blackburn Dioscese and the pension charge represents the amounts payable by the charity to the fund in respect of the year.

#### 1.8 IRRECOVERABLE VAT

The Charity is not vat registered therefore expenses are stated gross of irrecoverable VAT.

#### 4. EXPENDITURE BY CHARITABLE ACTIVITY
