TRUSTEES' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MAY 2009

The Trustees, who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act, present their annual report together with the audited financial statements of Trust for Children (the charity) for the year ended 31 May 2009. The Trustees confirm that the annual report and financial statements of the charity comply with the current statutory requirements, the requirements of the charity's governing document and the provisions of the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" issued in March 2005.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

a. CONSTITUTION

The charity is a charitable company limited by guarantee and is constituted under a Memorandum of Association dated 26 February 2004 and is a registered charity number 1105329

The charity has decided to wind up its activities from 31st July 2009

b. METHOD OF APPOINTMENT OR ELECTION OF TRUSTEES

The management of the charity is the responsibility of the Trustees who are elected and co-opted under the terms of the Articles of Association

c POLICIES ADOPTED FOR THE INDUCTION AND TRAINING OF TRUSTEES

Trustees are inducted in line with Charity Commission recommendations

d ORGANISATIONAL STRUCTURE AND DECISION MAKING

The Trustees meet regularly and receive regular reports from the Chief Officer The Trustees have delegated responsibility for day-to-day management of the Trust to the Chief Officer, Mrs Mary Carley, who is also responsible for developing and implementing the fundraising strategy

The Trustees are supported by a Steering Group the members of this are drawn from various interested parties and the Group builds understanding of the Trust for Children's role among a wider audience and hopefully will identify potential new trustees

e. RISK MANAGEMENT

The Trustees have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, in particular those related to the operations and finances of the charity, and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate their exposure to the major risks

The Chief Officer maintains a comprehensive risk register which is regularly updated. The risk register is a standing item at steering group meetings.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES FOR THE PUBLIC BENEFIT

a. POLICIES AND OBJECTIVES

The charity's strategic aims are

- 1 To support initiatives to raise the achievement of learners in Blackburn with Darwen
- 2 To meet the diverse learning needs
- 3 To support the development of Blackburn with Darwen as a learning community

There have been no changes in the objectives since the last annual report but the chanty will cease activities from 31st July 2009

TRUSTEES' REPORT (continued) FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MAY 2009

b STRATEGIES FOR ACHIEVING OBJECTIVES

Trust for Children works with voluntary and statutory partners to identify the need for services for children, young people and young families in the Borough Links are established with Blackburn with Darwen Children and Young People's Plan to ensure selected priorities are relevant. A comprehensive fundraising and development strategy is prepared, subject to regular review and amendment.

c ACTIVITIES FOR ACHIEVING OBJECTIVES

Funding applications are made to charitable trusts and corporate sponsors in line with Institute of Fundraising Codes of Practice and Trust for Children priorities. Projects are delivered in partnership with a range of partners and are subject to regular monitoring and review. Where appropriate, external evaluation takes place.

d. GRANT MAKING POLICIES

Trust for Children occasionally awards grants to other voluntary organisations, schools and educational bodies for activities which meet the Trust for Children's charitable objects. Invitations to bid and details of the application process are widely publicised in Blackburn with Darwen.

The grants awarded are reported to Trustees and Development Group members and regular updates on key projects are circulated

e VOLUNTEERS

The charity would like to thank all the volunteers who aided the charity during the year in fulfilling its objectives

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

a. REVIEW OF ACTIVITIES

The charity has spent the last year completing the objectivies of the restricted projects which included the Parenting Fund Project, Looked After Children - Peer Mentoring, Looked After Children - Drama Project and the Multi Sensory Room in the Gatehouse Project

The Trustees decided that the balance of unrestricted funds would be donated to local voluntary organisations who share the chanty's aims and objectives

b. FACTORS RELEVANT TO ACHIEVE OBJECTIVES

Trust for Children is dependent on charitable income to meet its objectives. In kind, support to the Trust is provided by Blackburn with Darwen Borough Council, business and voluntary sector partners.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

a RESERVES POLICY

The Trustees aim was to maintain general reserves at a maximum of 10% of annual income, until such a time as the Trust employed its own staff. Following the decision to wind up the Charity's activities, the reserves will be distributed to various local voluntary organisations sharing the same aims and objectives.

b. PRINCIPAL FUNDING

Principal funding for the charity is provided by Blackburn with Darwen Borough Council

MEMBERS' LIABILITY

The Trustees of the charity guarantee to contribute an amount not exceeding £1 to the assets of the charity in the event of winding up

STATEMENT OF TRUSTEES' RESPONSIBILITIES

The Trustees, who are also directors of Trust for Children for the purposes of company law, are responsible for preparing the Trustees' report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice)

Company and charity law requires the Trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the chantable company and of the incoming resources and application of resources, including the income and expenditure, of the charitable company for that period. In preparing these financial statements, the Trustees are required to

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently,
- observe the methods and principles in the Chanties SORP,
- make judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent,
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charitable company will continue in operation

The Trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records that disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charitable company and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charitable company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MAY 2009

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1.1 BASIS OF PREPARATION OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, with the exception of investments which are included at market value, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008). The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP), "Accounting and Reporting by Chanties" published in March 2005, applicable accounting standards and the Companies Act 2006.

12 COMPANY STATUS

The charity is a company limited by guarantee. The members of the company are the Trustees named on page 1. In the event of the charity being wound up, the liability in respect of the guarantee is limited to £1 per member of the charity.

1.3 FUND ACCOUNTING

General funds are unrestricted funds which are available for use at the discretion of the Trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity and which have not been designated for other purposes

Restricted funds are funds which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by donors which have been raised by the charity for particular purposes. The cost of raising and administering such funds are charged against the specific fund. The aim and use of each restricted fund is set out in the notes to the financial statements.

1.4 INCOMING RESOURCES

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy

Donated services or facilities, which comprise donated services, are included in income at a valuation which is an estimate of the financial cost borne by the donor where such a cost is quantifiable and measurable. No income is recognised where there is no financial cost borne by a third party.

1.5 RESOURCES EXPENDED

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been included under expense categories that aggregate all costs for allocation to activities. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular activities they have been allocated on a basis consistent with the use of the resources.

Support costs are those costs incurred directly in support of expenditure on the objects of the charity and include project management carned out at Headquarters. Governance costs are those incurred in connection with administration of the charity, and compliance with constitutional and statutory requirements.

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

1.6 CASH FLOW

The financial statements do not include a cash flow statement because the charitable charity, as a small reporting entity, is exempt from the requirement to prepare such a statement under the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008)

1.7 PENSIONS

The charity contributes to a defined contribution pension scheme operated by Blackburn Diocese and the pension charge represents the amounts payable by the charity to the fund in respect of the year

1.8 IRRECOVERABLE VAT

The Chanty is not vat registered therefore expenses are stated gross of irrecoverable VAT
