REPORT OF THE DIRECTORS

The directors present their report and the financial statements for the period ended 30 September 2011

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY

iNet Trust Limited ("iNet" or the "Trust"), was set up in August 2004 by a group of independent, self-governing churches to enable them

- To operate a fully church-based missions programme
- To maintain among the missionaries of member churches a sense of community, of the bigger team, of 'being in it together'
- To stand together as local churches, encouraging and enabling one another in the development and implementation of overseas and cross cultural mission vision and activity
- To continue to offer support in prayer, through finances, pastorally and strategically for overseas and cross cultural missionaries of member churches
- To recruit and prepare more people for overseas and cross cultural missionary work
- To partner, where appropriate, with other churches and missionary agencies in the task of fulfilling the great commission

ADMINISTRATIVE INFORMATION

Charitable objectives

iNet is governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association The Trust's objects are

- To promote and advance the Christian Faith throughout the world generally including by the worship of God, the instruction and edification of Christians, the care and Christian instruction of young people and children and the evangelisation of non-Christians
- 2 To relieve poverty, hardship, sickness and distress among all peoples of the world
- 3 To promote education and training
- 4 To support such other charities and charitable purposes as the trustees shall decide

Structure governance and management

The 'owners' or 'members' of iNet, i.e. churches whose trusts have subscribed to the iNet Guarantee, regularly participate in consultations, both formal and informal, regarding the broader aims and objectives of the charity. They also receive the Directors Report annually at the AGM

The Board of Directors who act as trustees of the charity are appointed by the members. They are responsible for the overall strategy and management of the charity and they delegate certain responsibilities to an operating team. The major risks to which the charity is exposed, as identified by the trustees, are reviewed from time to time and, if considered appropriate, systems or procedures are established to manage those risks.

Day to day operations is the responsibility of the Missions Director who is paid part-time and is not a trustee. The Missions Director is supported by a Member Care Officer and an Office

Administrator both of whom are paid part-time A number of volunteers support the team some of whom are Directors

REVIEW OF THE YEAR

Since incorporation iNet has provided support and assistance for the benefit of our member churches and our member churches' workers overseas who have opted to receive that support, direction and assistance from the Trust The Trust's activities for the past year have included the following

Regarding iNet member churches' overseas workers

- Regular communication
- Annual appraisals
- A summer conference with the aim of providing fellowship, encouragement, training and envisioning
- An expo to celebrate and promote the work of iNet
- Pastoral and strategic support
- On field visits
- Financial support

During the year iNet and its member churches supported some 28 adult workers, plus children in fifteen countries outside the UK. Two short term overseas workers were also supported during the year

Regarding iNet's member churches

- Providing monthly informational and prayer updates
- Providing advice and help with recruiting, preparing and sending new workers overseas
- Providing advice, training and preparation of people for cross-cultural activity in the UK and overseas
- Developing joint strategies for member churches both overseas and in London
- Providing training for individual churches and outside agencies on Mission
- Working with Global Connections

During the year iNet together with its member churches leaders reviewed the strategy for the charity. This resulted in the appointment of James Price as Missions Director to implement the strategy to continue iNet's support and training of overseas workers and also to aid member churches in cross cultural mission in London. James is a mission partner with World Outreach International, focusing on mission mobilisation in Europe. James previously worked for CMS Ireland, where he was Regional Mission Partner (Europe), responsible for establishing new partnerships between local churches and projects across the continent.

The trustees have complied with the duty imposed by Section 4 of the Charities Act 2006 to have due regard to the public benefit guidance published by the Charity Commission in December 2008

FUTURE PLANS

iNet will continue to provide its support and services to overseas workers and member churches.

Specific plans for the forthcoming year include

- Training courses and events to facilitate recruitment and to prepare possible applicants for overseas work
- Various courses, seminars and materials for member churches and other churches to help their appreciation of and involvement in the challenge of world mission
- A conference for overseas workers and their supporters
- An exhibition to showcase the activities of overseas workers and mission opportunities to iNet churches (and other interested parties)
- Promote and mobilize local UK based cross-cultural mission opportunities
- Explore other churches joining iNet
- Develop work with young people
- Promote short term teams and individuals to assist overseas mission activities
- Promote the activities of iNet through speaking engagements at iNet churches and other interested church groups
- Review and develop the management and governance structure as appropriate

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The Directors are grateful to the member churches for their continued financial support throughout the period and for their willingness to participate in this tangible way in the extension of God's kingdom around the world

During the year under review to 30th September 2011 total income reduced by £11,427 to £47,598 compared to the last financial year primarily due to the previous year's change to member churches supporting overseas workers direct rather than through iNet. As a result of this change there was a corresponding reduction in gifts to overseas workers from iNet of £11,950. People costs also fell during the year by £9,369 due to a reduction in the hours worked by staff. Total expenditure was £38,427 some £22,221 lower than the previous year. This resulted in a surplus of £9,171 of which £8,538 is attributable to the general fund compared to a deficit of £1,623 the previous year of which £2,327 was attributable to the general fund.

RESERVES POLICY

The trustees have reviewed the reserves policy and concluded that it is appropriate to maintain reserves equal to three months expenses, approximately £11,000 At the end of the financial year the general fund stood at £21,223

GRANT MAKING POLICY

iNet operates a small Youth Bursary Fund from which grants may be made from time to time to young people from member churches to assist them to explore overseas mission work opportunities

RISK MANAGEMENT

All major insurable risks are subject to commercially available charities and employers' insurance

STATEMENT OF DIRECTORS' RESPONSIBILITIES

The law applicable to charities in England and Wales requires the directors to prepare accounts for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the company's financial activities during the year and of the income and expenditure and financial position of the company as at the end of that period. In preparing these accounts, the directors are required to -

- Select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently
- Make adjustments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent
- Prepare the accounts on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the company will continue in operation

The directors are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the company and to enable them to ensure that the accounts comply with the Companies Act 2006 and the Charities Act 1993. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities. The directors confirm that the accounts comply with current statutory requirements and those of the company's governing documents.

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Companies Act 2006 and follow the recommendations in Accounting and Reporting by Charities Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) 2005

a) Incoming resources

Gifts are accounted for on a received basis. Contributions, fees, and tax recoverable from HM Revenue & Customs under the Gift Aid scheme are recognised on an accruals basis when receivable.

b) Capitalisation and Depreciation

Items of equipment are only capitalised where the purchase price exceeds £1,000 As the charity has no fixed assets, no policy on depreciation has been made

c) Expenditure

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis, inclusive of VAT, which cannot be recovered

d) Pensions

The charitable company offers its employees, and its overseas workers, a pension with Legal & General Assurance Society, administered by Kinsgworld Walder Ltd. The scheme is a defined contributions scheme. The charitable company matches employees' contribution up to 5% of their gross salary. For overseas workers the equivalent of 5% of their original monthly gift is contributed irrespective of any contribution they choose to make. Expenditure is charged to the Statement of Financial Activities in the period to which it relates

e) Funds accounting

Funds held by the charitable company are

Unrestricted general funds - these are funds which can be used in accordance with the charitable objects at the discretion of the trustees

Restricted funds - these are funds which can only be used for particular purposes within the objects of the charitable company. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes. The nature and purpose of each fund is explained further in the notes to the financial statements.

2 GIFTS TO OVERSEAS WORKERS

During the previous year iNet changed from making grants to overseas workers, to grants being made to overseas workers directly from member churches. This accounts for there being no gifts to overseas workers from general funds and also a corresponding reduction in contributions from member churches.

These are gifts given for individual overseas workers or their work, either for general or specific needs, and are paid on to the overseas worker concerned

Overseas Workers Conference Fund

This fund was set up to receive gifts from member churches to contribute to the costs of their overseas worker(s) attending the conference, and to receive gifts for the running of the conference

Youth Bursary Fund

These are gifts received from churches and individuals to be used to help fund young people travelling overseas to participate in cross cultural mission work

Independent Examiner's report to the Trustees of iNet Trust Ltd

I report on the Accounts of iNet Trust Ltd for the year ended 30th September 2011, which are set out on pages 8 to 11.

Respective responsibilities of the Trustees and the Examiner

The charity's trustees consider that an audit is not required for this year (under section 43(2) of the Charities Act 1993 (the Act), as amended by s.28 of the Charities Act 2006) and that an independent examination is needed.
