Activities undertaken for the Public Benefit

In planning the activities for the year the Trustees had regard to the guidance on Public Benefit issued by the Charities Commission, activities included -

Developing Watchtree Nature Reserve as a local community asset managed for and by local people in co-operation with the site owners (Defra) and their Facility Management Company (Interserve) who manage the "Operational" aspect of the FMD carcass disposal site

The provision of public access and quiet enjoyment of the site and its wildlife by people of all ages and abilities

Provide opportunities for local school and education establishments to use the site for curriculum related studies

Manage and maintain the created habitats as set out in the habitat establishment plan

Recruiting volunteers to help with the running of the site and its management

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

Achievements

The membership scheme was well received and 107 memberships were taken during the financial year comprising 50 individual, 53 family and 4 group memberships

Habitat and Estate Management

A Biffa award enabled us to plant and fence off another 2km of new hedgerow to fenced boundaries enhancing the landscape and adding to the site diversity

We maintained progress with our Marsh Fritillary butterfly habitat creation ploughing out and reseeding another 4 small fields and planting other 4000 food plant plugs of Devils' bit Scabious.

We contributed significantly to the Cumbria Marsh Fritillary Action Group reintroduction scheme, our captive breeding stock producing over 3000 caterpillars for sites in West Cumbria

We converted our only remaining agricultural grassland into wildflower meadow to further increase and enhance site biodiversity

We commenced the development of an "Elemental Garden area primarily for less able visitors to enjoy the site wildlife within a sheltered environment and received a donation of topsoil from Birse Civils

Our overall visitor numbers increased to 4,103 including 1,055 school children, 33 visits by 9 different schools. Students from The University of Cumbria (Newton Rigg campus) and Hadlow College, Kent made study visits and we developed two research student opportunities with Lancaster University. We work with a number of organisations and groups who care for disabled and disadvantaged people including Garden Links. A number of students undertook their John Muir Awards projects at Watchtree. Sixth form students from Limehouse School and William Howard School undertook projects for the EES (Environmental Engineering Award Scheme) in business partnership to increase and develop engineering talent and understanding. Their projects were for Limehouse to produce an "underwater viewer" for wheelchair users and William Howard to produce a feasibility study for webcams at Watchtree.

Our own volunteers accomplished over 2,500 man hours of work to a wide variety of projects

Watchtree Wheelers continue to make very good progress and 756 people used the cycles and cycle track with groups from Chrysalis and Cumbria Care being the main users A grant of £1,800 from Cumbria Community Foundation funded free drop in sessions from April to October

We extended the size and range of our cycle fleet and continued to work with the Charity "Cycling Projects" on their "wheels for All" project.

DIRECTORS AND TRUSTEES ANNUAL REPORT

A number of individuals made small grants ranging from a few pounds to £500 and donations in kind included an electric mobility scooter and cycles

Two late grants of £12,000 from Aiming High and £2,500 from Cumbria Community Foundation enabled us to purchase enough tools to equip our cycle maintenance facility, acquire a large cabin as a cycle workshop area and volunteer base and to develop a sustainable energy (wind turbine) interpretive panel

We commissioned and commenced the implementation of visitor interpretation plan

We made a significant achievement for our Watchtree Wheelers cycling project when we secured funding for a Watchtree Wheelers Project Officer from June 2011 from the Northern Rock foundation. This secured the employment of our current Access and Development Officer for a further 3 years from June 2011

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Policy on Reserves

The Trustees have agreed that any excess funds should be set aside in interest bearing accounts to build up reserves for when the funding from DEFRA ceases in April, 2016

As far as possible the Watchtree Wheelers project is independent of the Defra contract funding and relies on various conventional fund raising. Some of the "Reserve Income" may be used as matched funding against this and other initiatives that the Trustees are developing.

£100,000 is invested in a Guaranteed Investment Account with the Co-operative Bank which will be reviewed every 6 months
