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Group Strategic Report For the year ended 31 March 2015

Introduction

The group has continued its principal activities for the year of reclaiming compensation for customers who have been mis-sold financial products.

Business review

The business carried out its plan of streamlining the PPI process by improving processes from start to finish, reducing costs and concentrating solely on PPI during the financial year. For the current year the business has invested in increasing its customer base and enhancing the customer journey at all stages of the PPI lifecycle with satisfying results. Again due to the nature of the lifecycle of claims the business expects to see the benefits of this in the coming years.

Financial risk management objectives

The group uses various financial instruments, these include cash and various items such as trade debtors and trade creditors that arise directly from its operations. The main purpose of these financial instruments is to raise finance for the group's operations.

The existence of these financial instruments exposes the group to a number of financial risks, which are described in more detail below.

The main risks arising from the group's financial instruments are liquidity risk and credit risk. The directors review and agree policies for managing each of these risks and they are summarised below. These policies have remained unchanged from previous years.

Liquidity risk

The company seeks to manage financial risk by ensuring sufficient liquidity is available to meet foreseeable needs and to invest cash assets safely and profitably. Short term flexibility is achieved by overdraft facilities, but currently the group are not using these.

Credit risk

The group's principal financial assets are mainly cash with very limited trade debtors. The credit risk associated with cash is limited, the principal credit risk arises therefore from its trade debtors. However, very few customers are given credit accounts and these are reviewed regularly and collections are kept up to date.

Financial key performance indicators

- Turnover is a key measure of the group's performance. Sales for the year were £5,171,409 (2014 £9,966,772).
- Overall profitability is a key indicator of the group's performance. The profit for the financial year was £1,651,637 (2014 £2,541,525).
- Working capital management is seen as an important target for the business. At the year end, the net current asset level was £407,959 (2014 £24,631).
- Net worth is seen as an important target for the business. At the year end, the level of shareholders' surplus was $f_{534,652}$ (2014 $f_{232,124}$).

Notes to the Financial Statements

For the year ended 31 March 2015

1. Accounting Policies

1.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards.

1.2 Basis of consolidation

The financial statements consolidate the accounts of I-Sm@rt Group Limited and its subsidiary undertakings ('subsidiaries').

The results of subsidiaries acquired during the year are included from the effective date of acquisition.

The results of subsidiaries sold are included up to the effective date of disposal.

1.3 Turnover

Turnover comprises revenue recognised by the company in respect of services provided during the year, exclusive of Value Added Tax and discounts.

Claim revenue is recognised when the certainty of receipt and claim value has been confirmed by the relevant institution.

1.4 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost or valuation less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost or valuation of fixed assets, less their estimated residual value, over their expected useful lives on the following bases:

Freehold property - term of lease

Plant and machinery - 3 - 5 years straight line

Motor vehicles - 4 years straight line

Fixtures and fittings - 3 - 5 years straight line

Office equipment - 3 years straight line

1.5 Investments

Investments in subsidiaries are valued at cost less provision for impairment.

1.6 Leasing and hire purchase

Assets obtained under hire purchase contracts and finance leases are capitalised as tangible fixed assets. Assets acquired by finance lease are depreciated over the shorter of the lease term and their useful lives. Assets acquired by hire purchase are depreciated over their useful lives. Finance leases are those where substantially all of the benefits and risks of ownership are assumed by the company. Obligations under such agreements are included in creditors net of the finance charge allocated to future periods. The finance element of the rental payment is charged to the Profit and loss account so as to produce a constant periodic rate of charge on the net obligation outstanding in each period.

1. Accounting Policies (continued)

1.7 Operating leases

Rentals under operating leases are charged to the Profit and loss account on a straight line basis over the lease term.

1.8 Deferred taxation

Full provision is made for deferred tax assets and liabilities arising from all timing differences between the recognition of gains and losses in the financial statements and recognition in the tax computation.

A net deferred tax asset is recognised only if it can be regarded as more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted.

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are calculated at the tax rates expected to be effective at the time the timing differences are expected to reverse.

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are not discounted.
