REPORT OF THE DIRECTORS AND TRUSTEES

FOR THE PERIOD ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2005

The Directors and Trustees present their report together with the financial statements for the period ended 31st December 2005.

BACKGROUND AND SCOPE

Universal Compassion & Wisdom for Peace (the word 'Limited' being omitted by licence from the Department of Trade) is registered under the Companies Act 1985 as a company limited by guarantee and not having a capital divided by shares on the 18th January 2005. The financial statements comply with current statutory requirements, the memorandum and articles of association and the Statement of Recommended Practice 2000 – Accounting and Reporting by Charities.

The company was established under a Memorandum of Association, which established the objects and powers of the charitable company and is governed under its Articles of Association.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

The objects of the charity is the advancement of education, in particular by providing or facilitating the provision of leaning opportunities, facilities, tools and resources that will enable anyone, anywhere to develop their compassion and wisdom and contribute to peace in the world.

REVIEW OF ACTIVITIES

As this was the first year of UCWP's existence as an organisation, much of it was spent laying foundations for the future. A successful application was made for charitable status (granted in July) and the term 'Essential Education' chosen to represent the main thrust of the charity's work. Domain names were acquired, and a website launched in September. A bank account was opened and corporate stationery designed and printed.

During the year the number of UCWP network members rose to more than 600 people spread across 6 continents. They all received quarterly electronic newsletters, and meetings of network members were organised in London, Zurich and Melbourne. A training weekend also took place in Herefordshire, UK.

UCWP's Inaugural Conference took place in the UK in October 2005. This was a 5-day event which brought together 102 people from 14 different countries, who presented work in progress and discussed the future development of Essential Education tools and programmes. Preparations were subsequently made for an Australasia Pacific Launch Conference in 2006.

The most important piece of resource development work carried out during the year concerned the '16 Guidelines for a Happy Life'. A range of international focus groups were established and background research was undertaken in readiness for the presentation of the Guidelines at a conference in Sydney in April 2006.

The Directors and Trustees are satisfied with the state of the organisation's affairs at the Balance Sheet date.

ORGANISATION AND DECISION MAKING PROCESSES

The governing body of the organisation is the Board of Directors and Trustees, which comprises up to 12

INTERNAL CONTROLS

The Directors and Trustees confirm that internal control procedures are in place in order to provide reasonable assurance against material misstatement or loss.

They include:

- 1. Comprehensive financial policies and procedures
- 2. Internal audit of cash handling and other financial procedures
- 3. Comprehensive system of annual budgets, approved by the trustees, and monthly financial reporting of actual against budget
- 4. Regular forecasting of predicted income and cash flow
- 5. Regular monitoring of reserves policy
- 6. Annual review of the organisation's risk register

RESERVES POLICY

The Directors and Trustees have reviewed the reserves of the organisation. This review covered the nature of the income and expenditure streams of the organisation and the need to match variable income with fixed costs.

It is recognised that the organisation needs to have sufficient cash and reserves to absorb short-term fluctuations and larger setbacks in income receipts. The review concluded that the organisation needs to maintain reserves at around the current level and is conscious of that need when agreeing the Budget for 2006.

RISK

During the current year a full risk assessment will be undertaken in order to identify the major risks to which the organisation may be exposed. The Directors are not aware of any areas that require immediate attention.

STATEMENT OF DIRECTORS' AND TRUSTEES' RESPONSIBILITIES

Company law requires the Directors and Trustees to prepare accounts for each financial period which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company as at the end of the financial period and of the surplus or deficit of the company for that period. In preparing those accounts, the Directors and Trustees are required to:

- (a) select suitable accounting policies and apply them consistently;
- (b) make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- (c) follow applicable accounting standard, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the accounts:
- (d) prepare the financial statements on a going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the company will continue in business.

The Directors and Trustees are responsible for maintaining proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the company and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 1985. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.
