Trustees' Report for the year ended March 2008

The Trustees present their report along with the financial statements of the Charity for the year ended 31 March 2008. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out on page 10 and comply with the Charity's Trust Deed and applicable law.

Structure, governance and management

The organization is a charitable company limited by guarantee incorporated on 4 April 2005. The company was established under Memorandum of Association which established the objects and powers of the charitable company and is governed under its Articles of Association. In the event of the company being wound up members are required to contribute an amount not exceeding £1.

Trustees

The directors of the company are also the Charity Trustees for the purpose of Charity Law. The trustees named on page 1 have served throughout the year except Mrs A Lury, P R K Felstead and Mrs Y Miller. Appointment of Trustees is governed by the Trust Deed of the Charity. The Board of Trustees is authorised to appoint new Trustees to fill vancancies arising through resignation or death of an existing Trustee.

The Charity's work focuses on the disabled and the directors aim to ensure that a majority of the Trustees either have a disability or care for a person with a disability.

Trustees are normally recruited through recommendation and interviewed by the existing Trustees before an appointment is made.

Most of the Trustees are also actively involved with other charitable and voluntary organizations.

Trustees' Induction and Training

Most Trustees are already familiar with the practical work of the charity having been encouraged to visit the Gillingham office and familiarize themselves with the services offered and also to visit one or more of the Outreaches.

Trustees are invited to our 'away days' and to meet staff and volunteers. They are also given copies of our Policy and Procedures Manual, the Memorandum and Articles of Association and the latest financial statements and reports.

Board Meetings

The Trustees held 11 meetings during the year.

Connected Charities

There are no connected Charities.

Objectives and Activities

Mission statement

To 'empower disabled people, older people and/or their carers, to have access to information about welfare benefits and current services that are available, both statutory and voluntary. Our service is provided by disabled people and their allies'.

Our services are available at our offices in Gillingham and Dorchester (in cooperation with Age Concern Dorchester), and our Outreaches in Shaftesbury, Blandford Forum, Sturminster Newton, Stalbridge, Weymouth, Bridport and Wareham.

Risk Management

The major risks to which the charity is exposed are reviewed regularly.

Home visit staff are subject to Criminal Records Bureau checks. Where appropriate, systems or procedures have been established to mitigate the risks faced.

The external risks to funding have been recognized and new fund-raising sources have been and are being developed.

Procedures are in place to ensure compliance with health and safety of staff, volunteers, clients and visitors to our premises.

Achievements and performance

The main areas of charitable activity are the provision of information and advice on matters which affect persons with a disability; and retail sales of specialist goods and equipment for the disabled.

We have successfully completed another year of consistently worthwhile work in the community, also giving practical help in completing welfare benefit applications and offering a wheelchair service.

This has been achieved despite a fall in the financial help received from the traditional funders. Worldwide disasters continue to make demands on big name commercial organizations and we have to compete for support from those funders to whom we have looked in the past.

Funding has been primarily provided by the Dorset County Council; we have also received grants from three Town Councils and two Village Councils.

Our funds have, however proved sufficent to employ 5 staff members - all part-time. Three out of our present five staff are wheelchair users. The mainstay of our service remains our volunteers, many of whom are disabled or care for a disabled person. During the year our offices and outreaches handled close to 2000 enquiries - many related to the purchase of specialist goods and equipment but a substantial number sought information and/or advice on benefits. We acted for clients submitting claims for Disability Living Allowance,

Incapacity Benefit, Attendance Allowance, Community Care Grants, Health Costs and Carers Allowance.

We have expanded our services to include home visits to people who find it difficult to come to one of our offices or outreaches.

We provide information on bath and shower equipment, feeding aids, mobility aids, cooking aids and anything that helps the hard of hearing and visually impaired. We keep information on bus and train services and holiday accommodation for the disabled; and we provide an off-site wheelchair and walking aid service.

We can arrange disability access surveys to homes and business premises.

We have an Office Manager but due to funding restrictions the post of Project Manager is vacant. During the year our main office relocated from 1 Newbury Court to larger premises at 3 Newbury Court Gillingham. This has allowed us to offer for sale a wider variety of goods and equipment sought by persons with a disability.

Financial Review

Due to careful husbandry and despite restricted finances we were able to achieve a small surplus of £270 which has been transferred to reserves. Our trading income has increased by one-third.

Investment Powers and Policy

Most of the charity's funds are to be spent in the short term on day-to-day running costs. There are no funds available for long term investment. Funds are deposited in a CAF Bank 'Gold' account to secure daily interest (about 4.20% on average during the year), and swept automatically to a CAF Bank chequing account to meet expenses.

A separate chequing account is operated for trading in goods and equipment.

Future Developments

The Charity plans to continue the activities outlined in this report subject to satisfactory funding arrangements and to endeavour to open further outreaches as needs arise.

Statement of Trustees' responsibilities

They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

1 Accounting Policies

1.1 Basis of preparation of accounts.

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Companies Act 1985 and Statement of Recommended Practice "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" (SORP 2005) issued in November 2005 and with the Charities Act 1993

1.2 Tangible fixed assets for use by the charity and depreciation.

Tangible fixed assets for use by the charity are stated at cost less depreciation.

Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost of valuation of fixed assets less their estimated residual value, over their expected useful lives on the following basis:-

1.3 Income resources

Voluntary income and donations are accounted for as received by the charity. No permanent endowments have been received in the period.

1.4 Value Added Tax

Value Added Tax is not recoverable by the charity, and as such is included in the relevant costs in the Statement of Financial Activities.

1.5 Fundraising costs

Fundraising expenditure comprises costs incurred in inducing people and organisations to contribute financially to the charity's work. This includes the cost of advertising for donations and the staging of special fundraising events.

1.6 Management and administration expenditure.

Expenditure on management and administration of the charity includes all expenditure not directly related to the charitable activity. This includes costs of renting and running office premises and staff salaries for administrative staff.
