Trustees' Report for the year ended March 2011

The Trustees present their report along with the financial statements of the Charity for the year ended 31 March 2011. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out on page 10 and comply with the Charity's Trust Deed and applicable law

Structure, governance and management

The organization is a charitable company limited by guarantee incorporated on 4 April 2005. The company was established under Memorandum of Association which established the objects and powers of the charitable company and is governed under its Articles of Association In the event of the company being wound up members are required to contribute an amount not exceeding £1

Trustees

The directors of the company are also the Charity Trustees for the purpose of Charity Law The trustees named on page 1 have served throughout the year.

Appointment of Trustees is governed by the Trust Deed of the Charity.

The Board of Trustees is authorised to appoint new Trustees to fill vacancies arising through resignation or death of an existing Trustee.

The Charity's work focuses on the disabled and the directors aim to ensure that a majority of the Trustees either have a disability or care for a person with a disability.

Trustees are normally recruited through recommendation and interviewed by the existing Trustees before an appointment is made.

Most of the Trustees are also actively involved with other charitable and voluntary organizations

Trustees' Induction and Training

Most Trustees are already familiar with the practical work of the charity having been encouraged to visit the Gillingham office and familiarize themselves with the services offered and also to visit one or more of the Outreaches

Trustees are invited to our 'away days' and to meet staff and volunteers They are also given copies of our Policy and Procedures Manual, the Memorandum and Articles of Association and the latest financial statements and reports.

Board Meetings

The Trustees held 9 meetings during the year

Objectives and Activities

Mission statement

To 'empower disabled people, older people and/or their carers, to have access to information about welfare benefits and current services that are available, both statutory and voluntary Our service is provided by disabled people and their allies'.

Our services are available at our offices in Gillingham

Public Benefit

The Trustees are aware of the changing needs of their Norddis clients

Some if our volunteers will help with the complicated form-filling and, if needed, will visit the client's home

The display in the shop reflects the increased needs of Carers, especially elderly carers, looking after relatives with dementia

All of us give sympathetic and helpful advice in relation to equipment and supplies not normally funded by Social Services Sometimes, just a small item purchased, and a chat to a volunteer with similar experiences, will lift the spirit

Some of our clients regard our shop as a 'home from home' and our volunteers, the majority of whom are disabled, have an increased sense of self-worth in the knowledge they are helping the community.

Risk Management

The major risks to which the charity is exposed are reviewed regularly.

Home visit staff are subject to Criminal Records Bureau checks Where appropriate, systems or procedures have been established to mitigate the risks faced.

The external risks to funding have been recognized and new fund-raising sources have been and are being developed

Procedures are in place to ensure compliance with health and safety of staff, volunteers, clients and visitors to our premises

Achievements and performance

Another year has gone by since our last AGM and what a year it has been As your Chairman again I am humbled by all the dedication and hard work you have given Norddis this past year. It has been a very difficult year in that our major funder Dorset County Council terminated our funding This was due to the major cuts in funding by Central Government. We are most grateful of the assistance we have received from them over the past years. This in turn meant we had to review our whole undertaking and direction. This resulted in our having to reduce our paid staff. This was a difficult time for all as we lost valuable people and years of knowledge. It was a great loss to Norddis and at the same time we had in effect to close down our outlets in several other towns in the county. That is and was a low time for us all. However being the positive and dedicated volunteers you are we have survived and indeed opened up a new phase in the life of Norddis.

Trustees report for the year ended 31 March 2011

We are now focussing on our shop, and it is most heartening to see how you have risen to the challenge. We have an asset in the shop we can be proud of, this is due to the calibre of those who man it and go the extra mile to provide the above service to our consumers. We are in the happy position of having people who have been there and have the T shirt giving advice to those requiring assistance. I am not going to single out anyone in this report as you are very valuable to Norddis. As to the committee you have all pulled your weight in this trying year.

As to the future it is in the hands of all of you I know you will all ensure that we carry on with this good work for the benefit of all who require our assistance in the coming year. It has been my privilege to be your chairman this last year

Financial Review

Due to careful husbandry and recognizing that funding for the charitable sector was likely to get worse before it gets better our loss this year is £9,067

Total reserves at the end of the year were £24,469 all of which is unrestricted.

Investment Powers and Policy

Most of the charity's funds are to be spent in the short term on day-to-day running costs. There are no funds available for long term investment. Funds are deposited in a CAF Bank 'Gold' account to secure daily interest, and swept automatically to a CAF Bank chequing account to meet expenses.

Future Developments

The Charity plans to continue the activities outlined in this report subject to satisfactory funding arrangements and to endeavour to open further outreaches as needs arise.

Responsibilities of the Trustees

1.2 Tangible fixed assets for use by the charity and depreciation.

1.5 Fundraising costs

Fundraising expenditure comprises costs incurred in inducing people and organisations to contribute financially to the charity's work. This includes the cost of advertising for donations and the staging of special fundraising events.

1.6 Management and administration expenditure.

Expenditure on management and administration of the charity includes all expenditure not directly related to the charitable activity. This includes costs of renting and running office premises and staff salaries for administrative staff.
