The Trustee/Directors present their report together with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 July 2012

The Directors of the charitable company are its trustees for the purpose of charity law and throughout this report and accounts are referred to as the trustees

Governing Document

Takeover Radio Children's Media Trust is a Company Limited by guarantee, governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association dated 20 April 2005, by concession the Company has been permitted to exclude "Limited" from its title. It became a registered Charity on 20 July 2006 and, with effect from 1 August 2006, the Company took on the obligations, assets and liabilities of the unincorporated charitable trust which was also known as Takeover Radio Children's Media Trust.

As set out in the Articles of Association, membership of the Company is open to individuals or organizations who apply to and are approved by the directors. The directors may only refuse an application if they consider that refusal would be in the best interests of the Charity.

Each member of the Company agrees to contribute up to a maximum of £10 in the event of the Company winding up. At present the members of the Company are the original subscribers to the memorandum and articles of association. Mr P. Quilter, Robin Webber-Jones and Mr G. Coley, Miss Sharon Komrska joined this year. Messrs Quilter, Webber-Jones, Komrska and Coley are also the trustees of the Charity.

Our Primary Objective

The Charity's Aims

To advance the education and work experience of young people in the UK by provision of training in Radio Presentation, Journalism, Web Design, Video Production and any other New Media with a view to enhancing their life conditions, and to work towards a career in media

We achieve this by operating a full time training centre in the heart of Leicester, and the running of the UK's first full time young person's radio station aimed at young people. Many of the young people have never experienced a work environment and the skills and experiences they gain stay with them throughout their adult life.

The last 12 months

Takeover Radio has been broadcasting to the community of young people in Leicester for the last ten years 2011 / 2012 has been spend doing much of the work associated with the history of the Abbey park project which has resulted in the organisation learning about film production and publishing. We have again supported the Spark Children's Art Festival

The Trust has continued to train young people in radio production, present radio shows and joined in with our local community. The Trust has completed training on behalf of the City Council with out Fast Forward courses which came to an end this year, this involved training young people from difficult backgrounds to help them improve their confidence and communication skills.

We received funding to take part in the digital switch over promoting this to our listeners

Training

The crew has grown this year with 14 new young people joining the station. They have all completed the 10 week training course and are now presenting their own programmes. We have also continued with our project on the history of the Abbey Park.

The City Council decided to cancel the Fast Forward project this year due to cut backs at the council, we training 24 disadvantaged young people during the year which finished in October 2012

At the start of the year we were involved with the Digital Switchover process in our area and we arranged for our young people to make a number of on air public service announcements to let the listeners know about the switch over

Programming

Takeover Radio continues to broadcast across Leicester and on the internet to an ever increasing audience. We recive much of our feed back now through social media sites such as Facebook and Twitter giving us the additional advantage of two way communication. The programming has changed a little over the last 12 months with a change in the pre recorded programs and presenters.

As with every year a number of our presenters have left to move on to university or into work leaving spaces for the new crewmembers to start their own programmes. The presenters who have left this year are Ruairi McKay, Brad Foster, Daniel Leung, Tamish Khullar, Joe Butcher Smith, Matt Benson, Kelsea Gracee, Anika Hindocha and Ash Mistry all of whom have gone on to university or work.

We also have a number of our adult presenters this year with Dave Bott, Rob Hayes and Ingrid Grenar all leaving to pursue careers in other areas of the media

Events

Like Takeover Radio Spark Children's Art Festival celebrated their 10th anniversary this year and as before we were their main media partner. This year we not only ran a series of advertisements on air, we also joined with BBC Radio Leicester to create the Spark News Room. Three young people from Takeover Radio when along to the Spark events and recorded interviews and then produced a daily new feature for Radio Leicester. We also arranged our own event with a Treasure Hunt for children on the Abbey Park with over 150 people taking part.

We organised a conference for young people in July inviting schools and community groups to talk about how to get more young people into radio. With over 100 deligates and topics including Radio in School, Community Radio and Takeover Radio it made it a great success. As part of the project we also creasted a web ite dedicated to radio 4 children at www.radio4children.org

As this was our tenth year of broadcasting we arranged a number of special event including a BBQ for all our ex members and dignities from Leicester. The BBQ took place in June on one of the few sunny days of the year. Many of our ex member were able to attend and sheared their experiences with us since leaving the station.

We sent an ambitious target of having 10 guests per show throughout the year meaning 130 guests in the year, so far we have achieved 89 with six months to go. Some on the guests included Tom Meighan from Kasabian, Michael Brown (Randy) from Big Brovas, Local performer Matthew R, Steve Walsh ex Leicester City Player, comedian Tim Vine, James May from Top Gear and Peter Soulsby the Mayor of Leicester.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 JULY 2012

1 Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities (SORP 2005)', issued in March 2005, the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008) and the Companies Act 2006

Fund accounting policy

Unrestricted income funds are general funds that are available for use at the trustees' discretion in furtherance of the objectives of the charity

Restricted funds are those donated for use in a particular area or for specific purposes, the use of which is restricted to that area or purpose

Further details of each fund are disclosed in note 16

Incoming resources

Grants that provide core funding or are of a general nature are recognised where there is entitlement, certainty of receipt and the amount can be measured with sufficient reliability

Investment income is recognised on a receivable basis

Income from charitable activities includes income recognised as earned (as the related goods or services are provided) under contract

Resources expended

Liabilities are recognised as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to the expenditure. All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category.

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.

Governance costs

Governance costs include costs of the preparation and examination of the statutory accounts, the costs of trustee meetings and the cost of any legal advice to trustees on governance or constitutional matters

Fixed assets

Assets costing £500 or more are capitalised at cost

Depreciation

Depreciation is provided on tangible fixed assets so as to write off the cost or valuation, less any estimated residual value, over their expected useful economic life as follows
