The Trustee/Directors present their report together with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 July 2014.

The Directors of the charitable company are its trustees for the purpose of charity law and throughout this report and accounts are referred to as the trustees.

Governing Document

Takeover Radio Children's Media Trust is a Company Limited by guarantee, governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association dated 20 April 2005, by concession the Company has been permitted to exclude "Limited" from its title. It became a registered Charity on 20 July 2006 and, with effect from 1 August 2006, the Company took on the obligations, assets and liabilities of the unincorporated charitable trust which was also known as Takeover Radio Children's Media Trust.

As set out in the Articles of Association, membership of the Company is open to individuals or organizations who apply to and are approved by the directors. The directors may only refuse an application if they consider that refusal would be in the best interests of the Charity.

Each member of the Company agrees to contribute up to a maximum of £10 in the event of the Company winding up. At present the members of the Company are the original subscribers to the memorandum and articles of association: Mr P. Quilter, Robin Webber-Jones and Mr G. Coley, Miss Sharon Komrska joined this year. Messrs Quilter, Webber-Jones, Komrska and Coley are also the trustees of the Charity.

Our Primary Objective

The Charity's Aims

To advance the education and work experience of young people in the UK by provision of training in Radio Presentation, Journalism, Web Design, Video Production and any other New Media with a view to enhancing their life conditions, and to work towards a career in media.

We achieve this by operating a full time training centre in the heart of Leicester, and the running of the UK's first full time young person's radio station aimed at young people. Many of the young people have never experienced a work environment and the skills and experiences they gain stay with them throughout their adult life.

The last 12 months

This year has seen us work towards sustainability; at the stat of the year we received a grant from the Community Radio Fund to employ a Fundraising and Development Officer who would work for the Leicester station and our sister station in Sutton in Ashfield to set up funding streams to sustain the stations into the future.

We also received a grant to engage a research company to investigate the potential markets into which we could develop and produce a report in order for us to develop a full business plan.

We continue to train the young people coming to the station with 16 new members of the crew and 12 starting evening training.

We again joined forces with The Spark Children's Art Festival and Radio Leicester to create the Spark News Room. Our association with Centre Bus has continued with the logoed bus travelling around Leicester.

We have completed 4524 hours of live broadcasting this year along with 624 hours of recorded programmes.

33 young people have presented the programmes along with 7 young adults.

Training

The crew has reduced slightly this year with a number leaving us as they reach 18 year old. We have however a group of new young people joining the station. They are all undergoing the 10 week training course and will be presenting their own programmes very soon.

We have completed the walking project looking at our local environment and producing walks around Leicestershire. They young people have produced a booklet which was distributed across the region and long with a web page with the walks to download.

Website

In July we launched our new website which is the first time we have combined information for both radio stations, this has proved successful with many positive comments and an average of 2200 hits a week with 850 unique visitors.

Programming

Takeover Radio has broadcast 24 hours a day 7 days a week 52 weeks a year with volunteers throughout 2013/14. Our response from our listeners continues to focus on social media rather than the traditional ways of phone, emails and text messaging. Our app has proved very popular with many of the messages coming in from the built in contact facility.

Over the first year the app has been downloaded 825 times and we have received 1391 messages through the app against just 440 from traditional texting.

Twitter has been the most popular with 2430.

As with every year a number of our presenters have left to move on to University or into work leaving spaces for the new crew members to start their own programmes.

Our adult presenters have changed this year with Toni Murphy coming back for a few months, and two new volunteers, Edward and Jake joining us.

Events

For the eleventh year running we were, along with Radio Leicester the media sponsors for the Spark Children's Art Festival, we worked closely with Radio Leicester to produce the Spark News Room. This involved a number of our young presenters visiting the various activities of the festival and reporting on them for Radio Leicester in the form of a live delivered package. This is proving very successful for the third year running and is helping to build relationships up with the team at Radio Leicester.

Funding-

We have received 5 grants this year, the largest from Ofcom from the Community Radio fund to employ a fundraiser for both radio stations. Plus 3 grants to help us train our young people. We also received a grant in order for us to commission some research to investigate way of sustaining the station into the future.

Summing Up

The summery of 2013 /14 has been yet another successful year for Takeover radio. Our audience awareness has increased with the work we have done at radio Leicester and the continual presence of the logoed bus. We continued to produce programmes and train more young people and our income remained at the same level.

We are now looking forward to 2014/15.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 JULY 2014

1 Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities (SORP 2005)', issued in March 2005, the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008) and the Companies Act 2006.

Fund accounting policy

Unrestricted income funds are general funds that are available for use at the trustees' discretion in furtherance of the objectives of the charity.

Restricted funds are those donated for use in a particular area or for specific purposes, the use of which is restricted to that area or purpose.

Further details of each fund are disclosed in note 15.

Incoming resources

Grants that provide core funding or are of a general nature are recognised where there is entitlement, certainty of receipt and the amount can be measured with sufficient reliability.

Investment income is recognised on a receivable basis.

Income from charitable activities includes income recognised as earned (as the related goods or services are provided) under contract.

Resources expended

Liabilities are recognised as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to the expenditure. All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category.

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.

Governance costs

Governance costs include costs of the preparation and examination of the statutory accounts, the costs of trustee meetings and the cost of any legal advice to trustees on governance or constitutional matters.

Fixed assets

Assets costing £500 or more are capitalised at cost.

As at the balance sheet date, the company owed £20,299 (2013 - £21,299) to Takeover Radio Limited.
