The Trustees present their report and accounts for the year ended 30 September 2007

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the accounts and comply with the Companies Act 1985 and the Statement of Recommended Practice, "Accounting and Reporting by Charities", issued in March 2005

Structure, Governance and Management

The organisation is a charitable company limited by guarantee having no share capital. The liability of each member in the event of winding up is limited to £1

The company was established under a Memorandum of Association and is governed under its Articles of Association

The company was incorporated on 18 October 2005 and commercial operations on 1 October 2006, taking over the existing activities and net assets of Carlisle Mencap a registered charity

The trustees are elected from and by the membership at the Annual General meeting

Objectives and Activities

- a) The objects of the charity are the relief of people with a learning disability in particular by the provision of help and support for them and their families, dependents and carers, and to prevent learning disabilities for the public benefit and to advance religion amongst persons with learning disability,
- b) To provide and assist in the provision of facilities for the recreation or other leisure time occupation for people who have the need thereof by reason of learning disability with the object of improving their conditions of life

Financial Review

Carlisle Mencap has had a financially stable year, with ongoing funding of their core projects and staffing

There has been a considerable growth in all our core services this year, in particular the Community Support Service which has greatly increased. Our first Supported Living Service was also developed this year and in March 2007 we moved into new office premises at Kingmoor Park, Carlisle.

It is the policy of the charitable company that unrestricted funds which have not been designated for a specific use should be maintained at a level equivalent to between three and six month's expenditure. The trustees consider that reserves at this level will ensure that, in the event of a significant drop in funding, they will be able to continue the charitable company's current activities while consideration is given to ways in which additional funds may be raised. This level of reserves has been maintained throughout the year.

Achievements and Performance

During 2006/07 the organisation has continued its core activities - these include -

California House Residential respite care for adults with learning disabilities

Community Support Adults We provide services for adults in the community

A Home Respite Care Service Families with disabled children are able to obtain vouchers for home respite – which is either sitting in or taking the children out to undertake and activity

Children's Community Support This has grown out of the home respite as is similar but funded CCC children's services

After School Club This is a service for 10 to 14 year olds. It is based at James Rennie School and operates for 3 hours directly after school on a Monday in term time.

The Saturday Club For up to nine teenagers. Uses the minibus to take them out into the community

North Cumbria Autism Family Support Project Two part time support workers work across the whole of the North of Cumbria supporting families with children on the autistic spectrum

Carlisle Active Carlisle active is a volunteering programme which provides leisure activities for adults with learning disabilities

Holidays Volunteers provide two holidays a year for adults with learning disabilities

Shop Volunteers work in a charity shop and collect goods to raise funds

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1.1 Basis of Preparation

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards. The Financial Reporting Standard for Small Entities (effective January 2005), the Statement of Recommended Practice, "Accounting and Reporting by Charities", issued in March 2005 and the Companies Act 1985.

12 Incoming Resources

All incoming resources are included in the Statement of Financial Activities when the Charity is entitled to the income

13 Resources Expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accrual basis as a liability is incurred Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the Charity in the delivering of its activities and services for its beneficiaries

Governance costs include those costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements of the charity

14 Tangible Fixed Assets

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation

Depreciation is calculated to write off the cost of an asset over its expected useful life as follows -

Fixtures, Fittings and Equipment	25% per annum on the reducing balance
Freehold Property	2% per annum on the reducing balance
Vehicle	25% per annum on the reducing balance

15 Funds

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the Charity

Restricted funds are funds which have been given for a particular purpose and project
