Opinion

Notes to the Financial Statements

Year ended 31 December 2018

1. General Information

The company is a private company limited by shares, registered in England and Wales. The address of the registered office is 31 - 32 Alfred Place, London, WC1E 7DP.

2. Statement of Compliance

These financial statements have been prepared in compliance with Section 1A of FRS 102, 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland'.

3. Accounting Policies

Basis of Preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis.

The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the company. Monetary amounts in these accounts are rounded to the nearest £.

Revenue Recognition

Turnover, which excludes value added tax and discounts, represents billings to customers for advertised newsstand sales, subscriptions revenue, events and licensing income.

Subscriptions income is recognised in the profit and loss accounts as turnover on a receivable basis with that proportion relating to subsequent periods included in accruals and deferred income.

Income Tax

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date where transactions or events have occurred at that date that will result in an obligation to pay more, or a right to pay less or to receive more tax, with the following exception:

Deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that the directors consider that it is more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted.

Deferred tax is measured on an undiscounted basis at the tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which timing differences reverse, based on tax rates and laws enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date.

3. Accounting Policies (continued)

Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost or valuation of an asset, less its residual value, over the useful economic life of that asset as follows:

Financial instruments are classified and accounted for, according to the substance of the contractual arrangement, as either financial assets, financial liabilities or equity instruments. An equity instrument is any contract that evidences a residual interest in the assets of the company after deducting all of its liabilities.

Defined Contribution Plans

The Company offers access to a defined contribution scheme. Contributions are charged to the profit and loss account in the year in which they are payable to the scheme. Any differences between contributions payable and contributions actually paid in the year are shown as either accruals or prepayments at the year end.

10. Controlling Party

The company's immediate parent undertaking is Dennis Publishing Limited, a company incorporated in England and Wales

Dennis Publishing (UK) Limited was the ultimate parent undertaking until 3rd October 2018. From that date onwards, the ultimate parent undertaking is Broadleaf Topco Limited, a company incorporated in England and Wales and controlled by Exponent Private Equity Partners IV, LP, a Private Fund Limited Partnership incorporated in England and Wales.

The largest Group in which the results of the Company and its subsidiaries are consolidated is Broadleaf Topco Limited. However, the first set of statutory accounts which will be produced for Broadleaf Topco Limited will be made up to 31st December 2019. Dennis Publishing Limited is the smallest group of which the company is a member and for which group accounts are prepared.
