Many problems have been solved but we continue to hold regular meetings with residents to enable them to address issues that they have

Summary of the main achievements during the period

We organised the pensioners Christmas party in partnership with Ormiston Sir Stanley Mathews Santa Parade in partnership with St Albans Church We also held community safety days for residents to address anti-social behaviour

BFRA have been waiting to move into new premises so have had to put many of our activities on hold. The newly purpose built community facility on Ingestre Square is a culmination of many years of campaigning by our organisation and we look forward to the move.
