Summary of the main activities undertaken for the public benefit

Blurton Farm Resident Association continues to work to represent our community at various meetings and give feedback at our public meetings. We are still monitoring the Pembridge Road home site and the garage site off Pembridge Road. We are also keeping residents updated with the Extra Care buildings/apartments on Consett Road. These should be completed in January 16 and ready to move into February 16.

Public Benefit

The trustees of the Charity are aware of the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit and have had regard to it in their administration of the Charity.

Summary of the main achievements during the period

We held our annual Christmas meal and sing-along at Ormistion Sir Stanley Mathews Academy. This was very well attended and everyone had a great time. We held our Christmas event that was very well attended and other community events and trips throughout the year. We continue to support Blurton Community Hub and the day to day running of the community centre. Our Kids club goes from strength to strength and has 73 members and between 15 and 30 children regularly attend. Our knit and natter group continues to be very successful with a general turnout of 6-10 people regularly attending. More nattering than knitting goes on at this group but they have lots of fun and are very supportive of each other.

The charity's policy on reserves

The current level of free reserves is £1569. The charity has no specific policy with regard to the level of reserves.

1. Accounting policies

Basis of the preparation of the accounts
