Structure, governance and management

The company was incorporated on 8 November 2006 as Midland Homes Thoroughcare Housing and Support Limited

On 20 December 2006 the company changed its name by ordinary resolution to Midland Homes Throughcare Housing and Support Ltd

On 29 August 2009 the company changed its name by ordinary resolution to Throughcare Housing & Support Ltd

The company is registered as a private company limited by guarantee and not having a share capital

The subscribers to the memorandum are the first members of the Charity but membership is open to other individuals or organisations who apply apply to the Charity and are approved by the directors

Under charity law those persons having the general control and management of the administration of the Charity are deemed to be charity trustees. The director is therefore a charity trustee.

Objectives and activities

The company operates as a charity to provide housing and support to disadvantaged members of the community

Achievements and performance

Over the last year the company has facilitated the settlement of forty families and provided accommodation in the form of six hostels, three male and three female. An advertising campaign has been created and is due for launch. All administrative aspects have been taken care of

Financial review

Throughcare continues to source funds for its ongoing activities and is planning a launch for November 2010

Plans for future periods

Throughcare hopes to hold a launch event in November 2010 as well as open another 40 hostels by the end of 2011, move premises and recruit extra staff. In addition Throughcare aims to initiate a 24 hour call out service

Responsibilities of the trustee

The trustee (who is also the director of Throughcare Housing & Support Ltd for the purposes of company law) is responsible for preparing the Trustees Annual Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice)

Company law requires the trustee to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charitable company and of the incoming resources and application of resources, including the income and expenditure, of the charitable company for that period. In preparing these financial statements, the trustee is required to

The charity's trustees (who is also the director of Throughcare Housing & Support Ltd for the purposes of company law) is responsible for the preparation of the accounts.
