STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing Document

South West Crossroads Caring for Carers, a company limited by guarantee, is a registered charity governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association dated 27 August 2007

Recruitment and Appointment of Trustees

The directors of the Company are also charity trustees for the purposes of charity law and, under the Company's Articles of Association, are known collectively as the Board of Trustees. They are elected by and from the membership at the Annual General Meeting. In accordance with the Articles of Association, the Board has agreed that the number of trustees shall be nine (up to six elected and up to three co-opted). The Articles of Association set out the conditions under which trustees are appointed and prescribe the election process. These include

- * Elections allow every member of the Company to stand for election and to vote
- * All trustees serve until the end of the Annual General Meeting following their election or co-option
- * Retiring trustees are eligible for re-election or co-option
- * The Board of Trustees appoints honorary officers from amongst its membership

Organisation

The Board of Trustees administers the Charity The Board meets as required, during the year there have been

- working groups to deal with specific issues such as Risk Management
- a Project Team to deal with the Development Project
- a Local Advisory Group to deal with local issues relating to the Enabling Service in Torbay

In addition, the Board has adopted Administrative Procedures and Standing Financial Instructions, which include a formal Scheme of Delegation

There were four paid staff employed during the year. The office of Chief Executive was provided under contract with North Somerset Crossroads.

Related Parties

South West Crossroads Caring for Carers is affiliated to the Crossroads Association as an umbrella organisation

South West Crossroads Caring for Carers also works closely with other Crossroads schemes in the South West Region and this is recognised in a Heads of Agreement signed by all member schemes

The appointment of a Development Director and the start of work on the Development Project

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES PUBLIC BENEFIT

South West Crossroads plans to provide a wide range of services to support carers of all ages by providing advice and information to enable them to make choices in the provision of services and have control over them. It will provide some care support services individually in the home. Equal access to our services is important to us, this is limited only by the geographical area of benefit and the availability of funding.

Charges may be made for some services, or as a contribution, other services will be free at the point of use and will be funded by statutory funding, charitable grants and trusts and donations from the public. Some self-funding will be from personalised budgets and direct payments from statutory sources in line with developing national government policy.

Each year, the trustees review the achievements of the Charity and these are contained in the Annual Report. The trustees have developed a three-year Strategic Plan, which they will review each year as operational services develop in reviewing past performance, and developing future plans, the trustees have referred to guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit. In particular, the trustees consider how planned activities will contribute to the objects of the Charity.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE Charitable activities The following are the main achievements in 2010/2011

Torbay Enabling Service

In September 2009, South West Crossroads secured a two-year contract from the Torbay Care Trust to run an Enabling Service in Torbay. Two staff were appointed to run this service and, by the end of this report year, by adjusting working hours, three staff had supported or were supporting 152 families. Crossroads links up with carers in an informal way and, by being proactive in the local community, putting on open days etc has identified "hidden" carers. By working with carers and the Care Trust, a new, very visual, self-assessment tool has been developed.

In November 2009, the Olive Carers Centre was opened in Torquay Owned by the Torbay Care Trust, the Olive Carers Centre provides a base for South West Crossroads and a facility for use by carers. In June 2010, the Care Trust opened the Carers Centre in Brixham, South West Crossroads assists in the staffing of this and sees carers there.

Torbay was a Department of Health Demonstrator Site for the Carers Strategy South West Crossroads was a key part of this Project The Project finished at the end of March 2011 and is being independently evaluated

'I am writing this testimony for Crossroads Care, because I have found it difficult to accurately complete the surveys I have been given. It is not easy for me to quantify this support by means of a statistical questionnaire. I believe trellis work on a rose should be there in the background, almost unnoticed, supporting the plant to achieve what it does naturally and best, this is the empowering role Crossroads Care performs for me.' Extract from a note from Jonathan who is the sole carer for his father

An objective in Torbay is to secure funding to enable the development of a "breaks plus" service. This is designed to provide practical help in the home and enable carers to take a break and do something they choose to do. It is based on personal budgets and requires working capital to start the service and assist with cashflow. Applications to Futurebuilders for funding have been unsuccessful and new innovative ways of developing this service are being pursued and other funding applications have been made.

The potential for greater use of volunteers is being explored

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE Charitable activities Development Project

In order to pursue the replication of the Enabling Service in other areas, a Development Project was specified and funding sought from various sources. Funding was secured for the two-year project from the James Tudor Foundation and the Henry Smith Charity, together with smaller contributions from some Crossroads Care schemes.

A Development Director was appointed in November 2010

The Local Area Research Report has been updated and the Development Director has made contact with commissioners throughout the Region

Work is being done on marketing, using case studies from Torbay and from North Somerset Crossroads

The Development Director has attended regional network meetings of The Princess Royal Trust for Carers centres in the South West

South West Crossroads has a Strategic Plan This Plan is drawn up against a background of significant change in the social care sector, Government Policy placing emphasis on self-directed care and a stringent financial climate. The Plan is reviewed on a regular basis.

The Plan is based on the needs of carers and families and draws on direct input from them following feedback (including carer involvement in the Torbay Local Advisory Group)

Specifically, we plan to

- Develop and implement plans for the replication of the Enabling Service, working with commissioners, Crossroads Care schemes and other appropriate partners
 - Develop marketing plans
- Continue the Enabling Service in Torbay and plan for its future (the Torbay Care Trust has extended the current contract until 31 March 2012)
 - Explore novel options for the provision of a breaks plus service in Torbay
 - Secure initial funding for a breaks plus service and introduce it
 - Work with the Torbay Care Trust to provide more carers centres
- Secure funding and establish a volunteer scheme in Torbay to develop volunteering for the benefit of carers generally
 - Explore opportunities for providing services in other parts of the Region
 - Contribute to the developing strategy for the whole of the Crossroads Care network

Meeting the needs of carers and their families in a holistic way, and with dignity, will be central to all activities
