This year it's worth noting that we decided to change our financial year end from 31st March to 30th June in order to streamline our internal accounting processes.

Even taking into account this extended financial year, One Cause has performed well. This can be attributed to the incredible efforts of our Trustees and volunteers who ensured that we participated in many external events that continue to raise awareness of the charity. Our Sponsor A Student programme remains as popular as ever and it was wonderful to hold one of our signature events again, comedy night Gigglathon!

In Uganda, Auro School is a great asset to the community and the investments and projects supported by One Cause are opening new doors. For example, 70 students registered and sat the national curriculum exams for the very first time. This is a huge breakthrough as the students will get an accredited qualification, which will help them gain better jobs throughout the country.

Nirvana School, in India, continues to flourish and the results speak for themselves, with a 100% pass rate in the 10th standard class public exams. We also extended the installation of our successful solar power initiative to the high school, and the school has reduced its electricity costs by more than 80%.

The Board of Trustees and I are, as always, eternally grateful to our kind donors and loyal supporters whose generosity helps us continue to make significant strides in our desire to lift communities out of poverty and into opportunities via education.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objects of the charity

The company's principle activity and primary charitable object during the year was that of establishing or working in collaboration with educational institutions in the advancement, improvement and provision of education and training of children in developing countries in particular but not exclusively.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Reserves policy

The charity needs to have sufficient reserves to enable it to meet its charitable obligations should there be an unexpected revenue shortfall. The existence of unrestricted reserves also offers the charity flexibility to plan and fund major projects within its two current programmes in India and Uganda. The trustees have agreed that the charity will have reserves equivalent of eighteen months of income (based on the year ended 31 March 2015 income) which will be reviewed annually to ensure sufficient funds are available to meet our obligations. The remaining funds are set aside for operational and programme investment.

This report has been prepared in accordance with the special provisions of Part 15 of the Companies Act 2006 relating to small companies.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

ACCOUNTING CONVENTION

INCOMING RESOURCES

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

RESOURCES EXPENDED

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Grants offered subject to conditions which have not been met at the year end date are noted as a commitment but not accrued as expenditure.

TAXATION

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

FUND ACCOUNTING

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.
