#### STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

# **Governing document**

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006

#### Organisational structure

The Founder and Director of Studies, who is also a trustee, runs the charity on a day-to-day basis, with the support of a volunteer management team

#### Risk management

The trustees have a duty to indentify and review the risks to which the charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error

#### **OBJECTIVES & ACTIVITIES**

#### **Objectives**

The main objectives of the European Academy for Jewish Liturgy (EAJL) are to train people to be inspired leaders of Jewish prayer and worship through studying liturgical traditions, history, melodies and cantillations, preserving these traditions for future generations, and mentoring and providing trained leaders of prayer particularly but not exclusively in small and remote communities

#### **Activities**

The charity provides services to individuals and communities in the UK and Europe and its activities fall under three main categories

- One-to-one Mentoring Programme
- Seminars and courses
- Consultancy

#### **PUBLIC BENEFIT STATEMENT**

The trustees confirm that they have complied with the duty in section 4 of the Charities Act 2006 to have due regard to the public benefit guidance by the Charity Commission in determining the activities undertaken by the charity

#### **ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE**

#### Objectives and Achievements in 2009/2010

EAJL's aim of inspiring leaders of Jewish prayer has taken new wings this year

- Gerard Edery, internationally acclaimed Moroccan-born cantor, gave two fundraising concerts for EAJL scholarships, enabling the charity to launch students from Germany, Spain and the UK into study
- EAJL was commissioned to run three 'Art of Shulmanship' seminars, all well attended in London and Leeds and later in the year in Oxford
- EAJL travelled to Budapest with a small group of dynamic young leaders of prayer, who brought a fresh expression to the group, who were hungry to learn
- EAJL provided a three-week course in Jerusalem at the Conservative Yeshiva, teaching High Holydays liturgy to twelve people from different countries
- EAJL's Founder and Director of Studies recorded for British TV, providing a unique setting for Passover liturgy
- EAJL provided successful teaching sessions at Limmud, the popular and renowned teaching facility at Warwick University attended by 2,500 people
- EAJL provided consultancy to various synagogues
- EAJL's Director of Course Administration organised one-to-one mentoring for twelve students worldwide, including two students who have signed up for cantorial examinations
- EAJL provided teachers of liturgical themes to various organisations
- EAJL Managing Director initiated talks with the Cantors Assembly in the USA regarding plans for Cantors Assembly Europe
- · EAJL provided interfaith work through the music of prayer

#### **FINANCIAL REVIEW**

EAJL's net assets amounted to £12,720 at 30 November 2010, an increase of £2,246 over the position in the previous year. The Trustees consider that this level of reserves is sufficient to enable EAJL to carry out its objectives. The main source of revenue comes from the provision of mentoring services for students. This activity enables EAJL to train future leaders of Jewish prayer and worship. The Trustees review the financial position on a regular basis to ensure that it can meet its obligations as and when they fall due.

#### **PLANS FOR FUTURE PERIODS**

#### Objectives for 2010/2011

The charity will be building on the success of its current activities, in particular

- The first Tefillah Leaders Europe retreat is being planned for 2012
- A new recruit to the charity will archive material and head plans for 'Campus Online', EAJL's new education programme to start in 2012
- A new volunteer will come on board to handle marketing activities
- EAJL is planning new para-clergy placements for small communities
- EAJL will be developing partnerships with Masorti UK (the Masorti Tefillah Network) and the Cantors Assembly (CA Europe)

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### **Accounting convention**

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Companies Act 2006 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities

#### Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy

#### Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources. Grants offered subject to conditions which have not been met at the year end date are noted as a commitment but not accrued as expenditure.

#### **Taxation**

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities

#### **Fund accounting**

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements
