#### DIRECTORS' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2012

The directors present their report and the financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2012

#### Directors' responsibilities statement

The directors are responsible for preparing the Directors' report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulations

Company law requires the directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year. Under that law the directors have elected to prepare the financial statements in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice (United Kingdom Accounting Standards and applicable law). Under company law the directors must not approve the financial statements unless they are satisfied that they give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company and of the profit or loss of the company for that period. In preparing these financial statements, the directors are required to

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently,
- make judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent,
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the company will continue in business

The directors are responsible for keeping adequate accounting records that are sufficient to show and explain the company's transactions and disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the company and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

#### **Principal activities**

The principal activities of the company during the year was the production and distribution of ready mixed concrete, sand and gravel, the distribution of fuel oils and the operation of a waste disposal business

The waste disposal business has the infrastructure to generate electricity from the landfill site and revenues from this were also generated in the year

#### **Business review**

The year ended 31 March 2012 has been a positive year for the company, despite the continuing effects of the recession on the building and construction sector

On 30 September 2011 the company sold its subsidiary, Swan Petroleum Ltd, for £2 75 million debt free, which has resulted in a profit of almost £2 2 million. This will enable the company to concentrate on its core activities of concrete and aggregates and waste services. The funds received from the sale have resulted in a significant reduction in both bank borrowing and the level of hire purchase finance.

The Sale of Swan Petroleum Ltd has greatly improved the strength of the balance sheet, with net assets increasing from £4.8 million to £6.9 million

Turnover for the year has increased by almost 14%, although both volumes and margins in the concrete and aggregates division have been under continued pressure. However, there has been significant further growth in the waste services division. Gross profit has increased to almost £7.4 million and operating for the year was £630,000 excluding the £2.2 million gain on the sale of Swan.

#### DIRECTORS' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2012

The Material Recycling Facility at Wood Lane has been fully operational throughout the year During the year the company has completed construction of the next landfill cell and has invested in a Doppstadt shredder which, together with the MRF, will result in reduced volumes of waste going to landfill into the future

In order to protect profitability the company has continued cost cutting measures. The directors remain confident about the longer term future of the company.

In addition, the company's continued success is significantly dependent on the retention of key personnel Although there is always a risk of losing key members of staff, the company seeks to minimise this risk through the provision of an excellent working environment and through recognition of hard work through the remuneration system

#### Performance and development during the year including key performance indicators

The directors monitor performance of the company by reviewing monthly management accounts with expected performance

In addition to this process, the directors review depot volume and gross margin as key performance indicators

#### Results

The profit for the year, after taxation, amounted to £2,554,061 (2011 - £534,792)

#### NOTES TO THE ABBREVIATED ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2012

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### 1.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The full financial statements, from which these abbreviated accounts have been extracted, have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards

#### 1.2 Turnover

Turnover comprises revenue recognised by the company in respect of goods and services supplied during the year, exclusive of Value Added Tax and trade discounts

#### 1.3 Aggregates levy and landfill tax

Aggregates Levy and Landfill Tax are included within both turnover and operating costs 
These are determined by the Government and are a cost to the company

#### 1.4 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is not charged on freehold land. Depreciation on other tangible fixed assets is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost of those assets, less their estimated residual value, over their expected useful lives on the following bases.

L/Term Leasehold Property

Plant & Machinery Motor Vehicles 8% straight line

5% straight line

20% reducing balance25% reducing balance

#### 1.5 Investments

Incorporated investments held as fixed assets are shown at cost less provision for impairment

Non incorporated Joint Ventures are held at the company share of net assets

#### 1.6 Leasing and hire purchase

Assets obtained under hire purchase contracts and finance leases are capitalised as tangible fixed assets. Assets acquired by finance lease are depreciated over the shorter of the lease term and their useful lives. Assets acquired by hire purchase are depreciated over their useful lives. Finance leases are those where substantially all of the benefits and risks of ownership are assumed by the company. Obligations under such agreements are included in creditors net of the finance charge allocated to future periods. The finance element of the rental payment is charged to the Profit and loss account so as to produce a constant periodic rate of charge on the net obligation outstanding in each period.

#### 1.7 Operating leases

Rentals under operating leases are charged to the Profit and loss account on a straight line basis over the lease term

#### NOTES TO THE ABBREVIATED ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2012

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

#### 1.7 Operating leases

Rentals under operating leases are charged to the Profit and loss account on a straight line basis over the lease term.

#### 1.8 Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value after making due allowance for obsolete and slow-moving stocks. Cost includes all direct costs and an appropriate proportion of fixed and variable overheads.

#### 1.9 Deferred taxation

Full provision is made for deferred tax assets and liabilities arising from all timing differences between the recognition of gains and losses in the financial statements and recognition in the tax computation

A net deferred tax asset is recognised only if it can be regarded as more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are calculated at the tax rates expected to be effective at the time the timing differences are expected to reverse

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are discounted

#### 1.10 Pensions

#### Defined contribution scheme

The company operates a defined contribution pension scheme and the pension charge represents the amounts payable by the company to the fund in respect of the year

#### **Defined benefit scheme**

The company contributes to a multi-employer defined benefit pension scheme (Final salary scheme) The scheme closed to future accrual in December 2006

The scheme is a multi-employer scheme where it is not possible, in the normal course of events, to identify on a consistent and reasonable basis, the share of underlying assets and liabilities belonging to individual participating employers. Therefore, as required by FRS17 'Retirement benefits', the company accounts for this scheme as if it was a defined contribution scheme. The amount charged to the Profit and loss account represents contributions payable to the scheme in respect of the accounting period.

#### 1,11 EA Provision

The FillSecure provision relates to an agreement with the Environment Agency whereby monies are put into trust to repair the site after the landfill has closed

Over the course of the 13 year agreement, the costs of dilapidation will be written off to the profit and loss account and at the end of the 13 years the provision will offset the investment in the trust
