NOTES TO THE ABBREVIATED ACCOUNTS FOR THE PERIOD ENDED 1 APRIL 2012

1 Accounting policies

1.1 Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008)

1.2 Compliance with accounting standards

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with applicable United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice), which have been applied consistently (except as otherwise stated)

1.3 Turnover

Turnover represents amounts receivable for goods and net of VAT and trade discounts Turnover is recognised upon dispatch of goods

1.4 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows

Land and buildings Leasehold 10% - 20% straight line Fixtures, fittings & equipment 10% - 20% straight line

1.5 Leasing

Rentals payable under operating leases are charged against income on a straight line basis over the lease term

1.6 Stock

Stock is valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost is based on price paid less any discount, on an average cost basis, and net realisable value is the estimated selling price less costs to sell.

1.7 Pensions

The company operates a defined contribution scheme for the benefit of its employees Contributions are charged to the profit and loss account in the period they are payable

1.8 Foreign currency translation

Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. Transactions in foreign currencies are recorded at the rate ruling at the date of the transaction. All differences are taken to the profit and loss account.

1.9 Warranty provision

A provision against replacement costs under warranties given by the company has been made based on the director's assessment of likely costs in the light of his historic experience
