LIMITED REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES for the year ended 31 October 2019

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 October 2019. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

Our memorandum of Association states:

"The charity's objects are 1. To advance the Christian religion for the benefit of the public by teaching, holding public services of worship, and producing and distributing literature to enlighten others about Christianity. 2. To relieve need, hardship, and physical and mental distress among all persons without limitation."

Public Worship Services

Weekly services of public worship are held each Sunday, with a strong emphasis on Christian instruction and encouraging new people to join us. We offer a friendly welcoming environment, which is expressed in a diverse, multi-ethnic congregation.

Each service is followed by refreshments, a period of open discussion, and a "bring and share" lunch together. These sessions provide excellent informal opportunities to address the personal needs of regular attenders or visitors.

Bible Study Group

The weekly Bible Study is an additional opportunity to explain and discuss the Christian religion in greater depth. These sessions are lead discussions, which encourage people to think for themselves and express their understanding.

Annual Conferences

Conferences and special seminars are held to address particular theological, church or societal issues.

Theological Reading Group and discussion groups

A theological discussion group guides participants through a course of reading and discussion over a 4 year period. It is aimed at those who are being prepared for leadership responsibility in the church and for those who are looking for a deeper understanding of their faith.

Men's and Ladies Meetings

Regular Men's Meetings and Ladies Meetings are held to encourage one another, share experiences and explore our faith in greater depth. We encourage attendees to bring their older children and visitors who might be interested in the Christian religion.

Counselling

The minister and elders (leaders) regularly counsel attendees and visitors as requested. The leaders regularly offer advice and counsel regarding marital problems, the raising of children, dealing with issues in broader life (e.g. work-life). They also counsel attendees to help deal with the pressures and anxieties of modern life.

Sunday School

A weekly Sunday School is held for the children of attendees, teaching the younger children (under 11s) songs, stories and lessons from Scripture. The children get to memorize, sing and participate in craft activities.

English Classes

A weekly English Class is held in a local café and its purpose is to offer help with learning English to those for whom English is a second language. This group draws people who are either new to the UK, or have lived here for some time but want to improve their skills. The lessons are free and are advertised online and they are open to all. It provides opportunities to get to know local people, help in a practical manner, explain the Christian religion, and offer advice when it is requested.

Sports Outreach

This is organized by young adults in the congregation and it is an opportunity to invite friends and acquaintances to enjoy football and wide games in the park, followed by a short talk with questions.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Public Benefit

The trustees have read and reviewed the "Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit" and believe the objectives and achievements of the charity meet that guidance.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

In 2018-2019 the church has been able to grow in its ability to meet its objectives and serve the wider community.

Public Worship Services

Weekly services of public worship are held each Sunday has grown in attendance, with new people joining the congregation through the year. Our services, informal times of fellowship, periods of open discussion and a "bring and share" lunches have provided many opportunities for encouragement, friendship, counsel, and instruction. Attendees have been encouraged to read about the faith through our **Book of the Month**. We have encouraged attendees to take an interest in contemporary issues and questions through visiting speakers.

Our annual **Easter Feast**, **Carol Service** and **baptismal services** provided an opportunity for attendees to being guests and introduce them to the Christian religion.

Annual Conferences.

The aim is to hold conferences and special gatherings that address particular church or societal issues. This year we held three events:

- a. A family day conference called **Raising Expectations** which is aimed at encouraging our own attendees plus many visitors, addressing key aspects living today.
- b. **Digging Deeper** was our youth weekend, attended by young people both from within and outside our congregation. It consisted of teaching, recreational time and a BBQ.
- c. **Ministers Conference**. We were pleased to organize a small ministers and church leaders conference and an in-depth study day with **Dr. Peter Leithart** from the USA.

Our objectives have been further met through the weekly **Bible Study Group** with non-regular attendees being able to access the faith this way. **The Theological Reading Group** has continued, with a small dedicated group committed to meeting regularly to discuss the study materials they are working through.

The **Men's Meetings** and **Ladies Meetings** began during this period. They have provided an informal opportunity to improve relationships, invite new people where single people, mothers and daughters and fathers and sons are encouraged to participate in a deeper communal life. These sessions have discussed the challenges and stresses involved in living in the modern world, allowing time for open discussion and encouragement.

Pastoral Counselling

The minister and elders (leaders) have counselled attendees and visitors as requested. Leaders have advised on marital and relationship problems, the raising of children, dealing with issues in broader life (e.g. work-life). They have been able to advise on dealing with the pressures and anxieties of modern life.

Sunday School

A growing crowd of younger children (under 11s) have enjoyed a weekly session after worship, involving learning new songs, hearing stories, memorizing Scripture passages and enjoy craft activities.

English Classes

A weekly English Class, held in a local café, has been well attended by a wide range of people, many of whom are new to the UK. The free and informal nature of the classes has been a good opportunity to meet new people in the community and offer practical help, explain the Christian religion and provide practical advice where requested.

Sports Outreach

This has been a new activity over the summer months, in a local park, organized by young adults in the congregation. It has been advertised locally, and has been an opportunity to invite friends and acquaintances.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Missionaries: Kip and Rachel Chelashaw, Nairobi, Kenya.

Whilst this does not involve any financial commitments at this stage, Emmanuel is the "sending church" for these missionaries. They are supported with encouragement and regular leadership calls to check on progress and help address issues and challenges.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Principal funding sources

The main sources of income derive from donations of members and supporters. Donations for the year increased to £115,180 (compared to £58,969 in 2018) and total resources expended were £83,079 in 2019 (compared to £81,009 in 2018).

Reserves policy

The Unrestricted Fund represents the free reserves of the charity. The Unrestricted Fund balance was £62,353 at 31st October 2019, providing the ability to have sensible buffer to cover fluctuations in giving and to start to build a fund to expand our work in the coming years.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006.

Our memorandum of Association states:

"The charity's objects are 1. To advance the Christian religion for the benefit of the public by teaching, holding public services of worship, and producing and distributing literature to enlighten others about Christianity. 2. To relieve need, hardship, and physical and mental distress among all persons without limitation."

Emmanuel Evangelical Church is organized as a limited company.

New trustees are appointed or stand down by trustee vote, which is recorded in the minutes. New trustees have been selected due to their relationship to the congregation, that they are regular worshippers at the church and of good character.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The charitable company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the charitable company's pension scheme are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities in the period to which they relate.
