The directors present their report with the financial statements of the company for the period 20th October 2008 to 31st December 2009

INCORPORATION

The company was incorporated on 20th October 2008 and commenced trading on 23rd January 2009

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY

On 23 January 2009 the company acquired the assets and intellectual property rights in respect of the Dore Programme, an individually tailored, physical exercise programme to help children and adults with specific learning difficulties. Following this acquisition, the company has invested in the reorganisation and refinement of the Programme to improve the experience and ultimately the success levels for participants. The investment is ongoing as the Company is also developing improved assessment processes and better measurement of progress through the Programme.

This investment has resulted in significant one-off costs reflected in the trading performance for the financial period. The directors are satisfied with the progress of the business, which has resulted in increased Programme participation, and confident that the Company has sufficient funding support to remain a going concern

On 12 January 2010 the company converted to a community interest company which means that the greater part of any surplus generated by the company must be reinvested back into the business or used in other ways to benefit those with specific learning difficulties. This status is more closely aligned to the principal aims of the company's stakeholders.

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008)

Turnover

Turnover represents net invoiced sales of goods and services, excluding value added tax

Where the company receives upfront payment for the Dore Programme, turnover is spread over 12 months, the estimated average length of the programme, to match the anticipated costs of delivering the programme over that period

Intangible fixed assets

Amortisation is provided at the following rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life

Intellectual property rights - over a 10 year period, either on a straight line basis or by fully writing off annual additions in the year of addition

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life

Plant and machinery etc

-33% or 20% on cost

Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items

Deferred tax

No deferred tax has been recognised for the current year as there is no expectation of it being reversed in the foreseeable future

Hire purchase and leasing commitments

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to the profit and loss account on a straight line basis over the period of the lease

Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The company operates a defined contribution pension scheme Contributions payable to the company's pension scheme are charged to the profit and loss account in the period to which they relate.
