REVIEW OF ACITIVITIES:

The year 2009 to 2010 has been a challenging year for Bangladesh Welfare Association (BWA) in the 30 years the organisation has been at the heart of community development in the Bangladeshi community in Burnley providing its core services. As with most Voluntary organisations, operating in the third sector that are experiencing restrictive funding difficulties, Bangladesh Welfare Association (BWA) for that reason cannot be considered as an exception Despite that, Bangladesh Welfare Association continued to strive in providing its core services to the much needed community in Burnley. The Directors are pleased to report that the long term project of the homework centre for 11 to 14 year olds continues to be well attended together with the afterschool activity classes to local students and young people

During the last financial year the organisation commenced 3 short term projects in addition to the normal long term development activities. Two of the projects successfully completed last year, of which the **Music Project** was considered to be most popular, culminating in a performance by local artists at the **Burnley Creativity Centre**, which was well recieved by the local members of the community. The project involved teaching classical and modern Bengali music to adults and children by professional artists by the use of professional musical instruments. The local involvement by both adults and young people was overwhelming and the appreciation demonstrated by the local people, following the performance was a true testament to the hard work of the local artists, volunteers, project coordinator, and fellow Board Directors, who have participated in that project. REVIEW OF ACITIVITIES:

The Bangla Link Worker's Project (Interpreting Service) continued until September 2009, but received considerable interest and support from both the health professionals and other agencies and most importantly, the Bangladeshi female population. The project provided a vital service of bilingual interpreting to the users of local services whose mother tongue was other than English. The provision of the Interpreting Service through this project enabled the ease and improvement of communication between female Bangladeshi services users and mainly the health professionals for local services, thus resulting in greater access to local services otherwise would not have been possible previously

The Women's Development Programme in conjunction with Youth Development Programme last year organised a tour of Chester Zoo, which all the participants found very exciting The Over 50's Club has been operating for a number of years and continues to remain a dedicated advice and information service provided by Bangladesh Welfare Association (BWA) staffed by both volunteers and paid staff. As part of the on - going Community Development Programme, The Mental Health and Drug Awareness Project continued to work closely with the local PCT by providing information by means of leaflet distribution, public meetings, seminars and discussions to the local community Last but not least, some members of the Board Directors and Project Coordinator have attended many local, regional and national conferences and seminars on various issues relating to community development and social welfare during the last financial year. The Board of Directors express their deep sense of gratitude and appreciation to the fellow Board Directors and the Project Coordinator for taking the time and effort for making this tremendous sacrifice, though in a voluntary capacity, and trust that they will continue to render their services, in the future with the view to improving and further developing the services of Bangladesh Welfare Association
