The year 2018 / 2019 has been yet another exciting year for BWA in the current climate of restricted funding faced by all voluntary organisations. Despite that, BWA has been able to accomplish many significant achievements, for which the Directors of BWA can be proud of and as such like to extend their deepest gratitude to all those who contributed in making those achievements possible. 1. Education Home Work Classes:


