The directors present their report with the financial statements of the company for the period ended 31 March 2023

Principal activities of the company

APM Cleaning & Repair Limited is a cleaning company based in the North East of England providing cleaning work to a vast range of companies both commercial and domestic. Following transition from a Domestic Client base in 2019, APM secured formal contracts with Durham County Council, Karbon Homes and Castles and Coasts. In the subsequent 2 years of limited trading due to the Covid-19 pandemic, APM has invested significantly in upskilling its workforce and pivoting to a now 100% Commercial client base. This has been achieved via significant investment in training and considerable systemisation and investing in accreditations to enable the business to win further contracts. APM has learned how to tender for government contracts, and is now realising a 30% success rate. During this period of operational evolution, APM secured further contracts with Cumbria Police, Accent Housing, ACIS Housing, Salix Homes, Home Group, Tyne & Wear Fire and Rescue and multiple smaller clients. To facilitate this change of direction and limited trading, APM secured Bounce back loans and reinvested all profits in training/upskilling at all levels. APM now believes it is on a position of stability from which it can grow. Future plans for growth and increased profitability will include: Further investment in systems — we will utilise latest available technologies. Continuous learning for all -throughout the business. Targeted Contract acquisition centred in the Social Cleaning sectors. Expanding operations to the whole of the North of England.

Basis of measurement and preparation

Turnover policy

Turnover is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable, net of discounts and value added taxes. Turnover includes revenue earned from the sale of goods and from the rendering of services. Turnover from the sale of goods is recognised when the significant risks and rewards of ownership of the goods have transferred to the buyer. Turnover from the rendering of services is recognised by reference to the stage of completion of the contract.
