In the year ending November 2021 the business was starting to grow back from the impact of Covid 19. Whilst trading activities had been disrupted the previous year the spring/summer period of March 21 to July 21 started to see events commence again and trading pick up, however it was not unit! the autum of 2021 when all government restrictions had been eased that the compnay started to see demand for services outstrpping supply.

The company moved office and relocated to a new premises and started to rebuild the team both in the office and on the ground. With demand returning the company commenced with a new business plan for 2022.

The company saw both a 49% increase in sales and a 48% increase in hours worked by exhomless individuals in the period maintaining that 18% of the total work completed on site was with ex homeless individuals.

After the move to the new premises investment has been made in a training space for new recruits and the company revisited its Training Academy for the first time since the pandemic running this again in August 21 for exhomeless candidates.

The next financial year will depend on the full return of the economy along with the events sector. As it does return the company will restructure with clear aim of driving towards its target of 25% of the workforce being from an exhomeless background as well as its net zero commitments.

Community Interest Statement

Activities

Connection Crew is a crewing company providing teams of talented people to solve production challenges across a range of sectors including events, TV and film, FM and construction.

How the activities benefit the community

Connection Crew is on a mission to prevent and reduce homelessness by offering training, mentoring and employment in its crew. It aims for its crew to be made up of 25 % ex-homeless individuals, so that means people with lived experience of homelessness and those who would be considered at a high risk of homelessness. It is proud to say that it has employed 312 ex-homeless people to complete 172,522 hours of work since it started in 2005.

Connection Crew provides all of its staff with opportunities for training and growth. Trainees and employees develop crucial life skills as well as technical knowledge. This training, along with work experience enables people that have been homeless or at risk of homelessness to build their experience into a career with valuable prospects.

This, in turn drives the quality of the service Connection Crew provides to its clients, further increasing the success of the business and its staff. The more successful the business becomes the more opportunities it has to offer to ex-homeless people and the more profit it can turn back into its founding charity, The Connection at St Martins.

All profit is re-invested in the company to support growth, enabling Connection Crew to offer an increasing number of employment opportunities. Once investment in training, operational improvements, marketing and business development has been made, surplus profits are returned to the Connection at St Martins charity for the homeless."

Connection Crew is pleased that is has been able to build back after 2020 and create impact in what has been a very difficult year for businesses operating in events – an industry hit particularly hard by the pandemic.

Connection Crew deliver a number of supporting initiatives that:

- bolster our social impact as outlined in our Community Interest Statement
- explore new ways to increase impact within and beyond our own organisation

Connection Crew Impact Account	The Connection Crew Impact Account an initiative to pay clients the impact their business has generated back to them so that they can use it to win business and stand out from the crowd.
	We recently changed the name of this initiative from 'CSR Account' to 'Impact Account'. This is to reflect additional environmental impact measures that we've added as part of our drive to Net Zero. Clients receive a certificate that states the number of ex-homeless hours and the kilos of unavoidable carbon their work with us contributed. Unavoidable carbon is subsequently removed via We Are Albert's Creative Offsets scheme.
Connection Crew Academy	Connection Crew has revived its Employment Preparation programme known as the Academy post-pandemic in 2021. We delivered 1 Academy with – with the following impact:
	 12 attended Test and Build Days 8 started the Academy 7 graduated 5 employed by Connection Crew
	We also monitor softer outcomes such as increased confidence and interview skills as this helps people facing barriers to employment that are not suitable for crewing work improve their chances elsewhere.
London Living Wage Accreditation	Connection Crew started preparing to become an accredited London Living Wage Employer in 2021. While we have kept up with the LLW rate for several years now, it's important to be accredited and join the movement.
	And for us the London Living Wage is just the start - at Connection Crew we use this to guide our entry level rate for new team members to build upon following a probationary period and at our regular pay and progress reviews.
Carbon Neutral	Connection Crew has been making progress toward its goal to become a Net Zero business. For example, the carbon generated by our operations in 2021 have been offset so we are carbon neutral, and we can offer clients carbon neutral crew.
Pivots	Connection Crew has been working hard to grow its business in other sectors aside from events – such as TV and film, construction, and facilities management. This diversification allows us to be a more stable employer as we would be less affected by future changes in the market as these sectors are less volatile than events.
