Additionally, in their assessment of going concern the directors have considered the current and developing impact on the business as a result of the COVID-19 virus. This has not had a significant, immediate impact on the company's operations but the Directors are aware that if the current situation becomes prolonged then this may change. Having regard to the above, the directors believe it appropriate to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the financial statements.

The directors are responsible for preparing the Report of the Directors and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulations.





1. STATUTORY INFORMATION

Maximark Limited is a private company, limited by shares, registered in England and Wales. The company's registered number and registered office address can be found on the Company Information page.

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparation

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 101 "Reduced Disclosure Framework" and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Turnover

Turnover represents net invoices from the sale of goods, excluding value added tax.

Turnover is recognised when the company has transferred to the buyer the significant risks and rewards of ownership.

Financial instruments

The company only enters into basic financial instruments transactions that result in the recognition of the financial assets and liabilities like trade and other accounts receivable and payable and loans to related parties.

Taxation

Current taxes are based on the results shown in the financial statements and are calculated according to local tax rules, using tax rates enacted or substantially enacted by the balance sheet date.

Foreign currencies

Assets and liabilities in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. Transactions in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rate of exchange ruling at the date of transaction. Exchange differences are taken into account in arriving at the operating result.

Creditor

Short term creditors are measured at transaction price.

Cash and Equivalent

Cash is represented by cash in hand and deposits with financial institutions repayable without penalty on notice of not more than 24 hours. Cash equivalents are highly liquid investments that mature in no more than three months from the date of acquisition and that are readily convertible to known accounts of cash with significant risk of change in value.
