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STRATEGIC REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2015

Review of Business and Key Performance Indicators

The directors present their report and the financial statements of the company for the year ended 31st March 2015.

There is no separate "Summary of Actual Trading Results" as no adjustment for pension costs is required under FRS 17. The Profit and Loss account on page 8 therefore reflects the actual trading results for the year

The year ended 31st March 2015 has seen turnover increase by 12.69% from £22.54m in the year ended 31st March 2014 to £25.40m in the year ended 31st March 2015. The directors attribute this to a number of factors not least the capital expenditure incurred on new rides and attractions of £2.84m in the year, which is in addition to the expenditure incurred in the previous year of £5.31m. While the year ended 31st March 2014 saw the addition the major new ride "Hero" and continued significant investment in other areas of the Park including the Holiday Village Arena, a new Dino Stone area, and a new Tea Rooms., the year ended 31st March 2015 saw expenditure of £0.61m on further developments within the Holiday Village complex, £0.17m of expenditure developing the new Umbrella Bar. In addition the Rhino enclosure has been enhanced with £0.16m of expenditure and the caravan hire fleet has been refreshed to the tune of £1.06m

Operating profit has increased from £2.17m to £2.26m. This represents another good trading year and the increase in turnover has allowed the Company to continue with the established policy of ensuring that the park is well maintained. As a consequence Repair and Upkeep costs have increased from £2.13m to £3.30m. Repair costs continue to be a very significant expense due to the continual need to ensure that all of the facilities at this vast location (which of course includes a zoo, holiday village and theme park), are kept in good condition and comply with all relevant Health & Safety standards. The company continues with the existing policy of depreciating rides and attractions on a straight line basis over a four year period and therefore the high level of capital investment in recent years has led to an increase in depreciation

Key Performance Indicators – Flamingo Land is unique in that it combines three major attractions in one location and there is no other theme park directly comparable on a like for like basis. Flamingo land is further unique as it is a family owned and run operation. The following KPI's are notable

Turnover increase - 12.69% (2014 – 9.90%)

Gross Margins - 80.99% (2014 – 82.29%)

Retained Profit - £1.37m (2014 - £1.32m)

Operating Profit - £2.26m (2014 - £2.17m)

Wages Costs (exc Directors) - 23.93% of turnover (2014 – 25.99%)

Repairs and Renewals -12.98% of turnover (2014 - 9.45%)

Business Risks

The company faces a number of risks and uncertainties and the directors believe that the key business risks are in respect of the competitive leisure industry and the need to maintain a high standard of rides and attractions to satisfy customer demand. The directors are confident that the substantial levels of investment the company has carried out in recent years will enable the company to continue to trade profitably and intend to continue to add new rides and attractions. There are a number of other risks involved including (1) the need to ensure that the Health and Safety aspects of the park are maintained at the current high standard which is of particular importance in view of the rides and attractions available to the public and (2) the vagaries of the British weather. In view of the risks and uncertainties the directors are aware that the development of the company may be influenced by factors outside their control.

The directors anticipate that the business environment will remain competitive and they believe that the company is in a good financial position and are confident that the company will maintain its market share of the leisure industry

Future Developments

The directors aim to maintain the management policies which have resulted in the company's growth in recent years. They plan to continue to invest in new rides and attractions as and when necessary to keep the theme park at the forefront of the sector of the leisure industry in which it operates.

Results and Dividends

The holding company has taken advantage of the Companies Act 2006 Section 408 and has not prepared it's own Profit & Loss Account. The reported profit for the year was the £235,000 dividend received which was then paid to shareholders by a dividend from the holding company.

The results of the year's trading and the financial position of the company are shown in the annexed accounts.

The company's profit for the year, after taxation, amounted to £1,604,614 (2014 - £1,522,093)

On 26th September 2014 a dividend was paid amounting to £235,000 (2014 - £235,000). No further dividend is proposed for the year.

Principal Activity

The principal activity of the company throughout the year was that of pleasure park and zoo.

Financial Instruments

The Group has a normal level of exposure to price, credit, liquidity and cash flow risks arising from trading activities which are conducted in sterling. The company does not enter into any hedging transactions although, from time to time, if an attraction or asset is being acquired from a country other than the UK, and the supplier requires payment to be made in their own currency rather than sterling, then the directors may choose to acquire the currency required to complete the transaction in order to limit their exposure to any movement/fluctuation in exchange rates. The company otherwise makes use of the usual financial instruments that a normal trading company would use including bank funding, creditors, and finance leases.

Employees

The Group's policy is to consult and discuss with employees through regular meetings, matters likely to affect employees' interests. Information of matters of concern to employees is given thorough the Staff Handbook which is regularly updated, and through regular bulletins and reports which seek to achieve a common awareness on the part of all employees of the financial and economic factors affecting the Company's performance.

Disabled Employees

Disabled persons are employed by the group when they appear to be suited to a particular position. The aptitude and abilities of disabled persons are more easily met in certain aspects of the company's business and every effort is made to ensure that they are given full and fair consideration.

DIRECTORS' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2015 (CONT)

Charitable Donations

During the year the Group made Charitable and political donations amounting to £42,806 (2014 - £49,466). These donations include £1,000 to local causes and £16,806 to a Wildlife conservation project in Tanzania which is being undertaken by a local University and is closely related to the Company's desire to develop and improve the welfare of wild animals in the care of the Company and in the world at large. A political donation of £25,000 was made to the Conservative Party (2014 £25,000).

Fixed Assets

The movement in fixed assets is shown in the notes to the financial statements.

In the opinion of the directors, the market value of freehold land and buildings was not significantly different from book value. In arriving at that opinion the directors have had regard for the fact that there are several freehold properties on the site and a fully equipped holiday village which offers substantial facilities and enjoys the benefit of full planning permission for a large number of caravan pitches including a permanent residential site. The directors therefore consider that depreciating freehold properties both on an annual basis and on a cumulative basis to be not material due to the residual value of the freehold properties. This is a departure from the Companies Act 2006 which requires all properties to be depreciated. The directors consider that to depreciate them would not allow the Financial Statements to give a true and fair view.

Policy on payment of creditors

The Group's policy in relation to all of its suppliers is to settle the terms of payment when agreeing the transaction and to abide by those terms, provided that it is satisfied that the supplier has provided the goods and service in accordance with the agreed terms and conditions. The company does not follow any code or standard of payment practice.

Directors

The present directors are as shown above. All served on the board throughout the year.

The company's Articles of Association do not require directors to retire by rotation.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

COMPLIANCE WITH ACCOUNTING STANDARDS

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards. There were no material departures from those standards.

The principal accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are set out below and have remained unchanged from the previous year, and also have been consistently applied within the same accounts.

Basis of Preparation of Financial Statements

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

The effect of events in relation to the year ended 31 March 2015 which occurred before the date of approval of the financial statements by the Board of Directors, have been included in the statements to the extent required to show a true and fair view of the state of affairs at 31 March 2015 and of the results for the year ended on that date.

Depreciation

Depreciation has been computed to write off the cost of tangible fixed assets over their expected useful lives using the following rates:

Freehold buildings

not depreciated

Fixtures and fittings

25% annum of cost

Motor vehicles

- 25% annum of cost

Freehold buildings are not depreciated because the Directors consider the depreciation both on an annual basis and a cumulative basis to be not material due to the residual value of the freehold buildings.

Stocks

Stocks have been valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost is determined on a first in first out basis and, where appropriate, due allowance is made for obsolete and slow moving items.

Leasing

Tangible fixed assets acquired under finance leases or hire purchase contracts are capitalised and depreciated in the same manner as other tangible fixed assets. The related obligations, net of future finance charges, are included in creditors.

Rentals payable under operating leases are charged to the profit and loss account on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.

Government grants

Government grants received are treated as deferred credits and credited to profit and loss account over the estimated useful life of the relevant fixed assets.

2. TURNOVER

The company's turnover represents the value, excluding Value Added Tax, of goods and services supplied to customers during the year. Turnover is recognised in the accounts on a trading season basis. Any income received for the following trading season and any associated direct costs are deferred until the following accounting period (there are occasions when the park opens for business before 31st March).

Interest on this loan is charged at 1% above bank base rate. During the year ended 31st March 2015 the company paid interest on a loan of £500,000 advanced by a family trust. Interest was paid at a rate of 1½ % above bank base rate. The loan from the family trust was repaid in full during the year ended 31st March 2015.

No contributions were made to the Flamingo Land Ltd self administered pension fund during the year (2014 - Nil).
