

Structure, governance and management

The Charity is a company limited by guarantee and is governed by the Memorandum and Articles.

All trustees listed above, remain Trustees at the date of this report. New Trustees are approved by the existing Trustees and appointments are reviewed. They are appointed for the skills and experience that they bring to help the Trust meet its charitable objectives. New Trustees are given copies of the memorandum and articles, and documents explaining the charity and its key policies and procedures. In addition all new Trustees are given guidance material published be the Charity Commission on the responsibilities of being a Trustee. Trustees meet regularly to monitor the performance.

None of the trustees has any beneficial interest on the company. All the trustees are members of the company and guarantee to contribute £1 in the event of a winding up.

There are no policies adopted for the induction and training of the trustees.

The day to day running of the charity is managed by Olga Makharinsky.

There were no related parties' transactions during the year.

The trustees have assessed the major risks to which the Charity is exposed, and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate exposure to the major risks.

Objectives and activities

The objectives of the charity are to improve the quality of life and relieve the needs of young people in the United Kingdom and Russia though:

- a) Advancing their education
- b) The provision of recreational and leisure time activities provided in the interest of social welfare, designed to improve their social environment; and
- c) Providing support and activities which develop their skills, capacities and capabilities to enable them to participate in society as mature and responsible individuals.

The trustees have paid die regard to guidance issued by the Charity Commission in deciding what activities the Charity should undertake.

TRUSTEES' REPORT (CONTINUED)

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2016

Public benefit

The Trustees have referred to the Charity Commission's guidance on Public Benefit when reviewing their aims and objectives and planning their future activities. The Trustees believe that their strategic grant-making meets the objective of benefiting a wide cross-section of the community and this is demonstrated by providing grants to assist children from poorer backgrounds with medical treatment.

Achievements and performance

During the year the charity received donations amounting to £71,726 and made grants totalling to £43,940 to the Russian Charitable Foundation 'Line Life', £420 to Harley Street Chemo Club.

Financial review

The charity had total incoming resources of £71,730 and outgoing resources of £60,149

It is the policy if the Charity that unrestricted funds which have not been designated for a specific use should be maintained at a level equivalent to between three and six month's expenditure. The trustees considers that reserves at this level will ensure that, in the event of a significant drop in funding, they will be able to continue the Charity's current activities while consideration is given to ways in which additional funds may be raised. This level of reserves has been maintained throughout the year.

Plans for the future

The charity is planning to carry out some fundraising events, such as charitable fairs, classical music concerts and fashion shows. It is also planning to organise art exhibitions and Christmas concerts for children, particularly Russian children who stay in London for lengthy medical treatment in a Harley Street Clinic. The charity conducts its activities in full cooperation with Chemo Club which is based in a Harley Street Clinic and the Russian Charitable Foundation 'Line Life'.
