Risk Management

The Trustees identify the major risks to which the charity is exposed each financial year when preparing and updating the strategic plan, in particular those related to the operations and finances of the charity. The Trustees then review any major risks which have been identified and establish systems to mitigate those risks. The charity is satisfied that the systems are in place to mitigate their exposure to the major risks which have been so far identified and reviewed.

Organisational Structure

The organisation has a Board of Trustees of up to 4 members who meet quarterly and are responsible for the strategic direction and policy of the charity.

A scheme of delegation is in place and day to day responsibility for the provision of services rests with the manager.

Related Parties

In so far as it is complimentary to the charity's objects, the charity is guided by both local and national policy.

Aims & Objectives

Purposes and Aims

The principal activity of the Company is:

BPHA provide an inclusive, tenant needs-led, high quality accommodation and support service to vulnerable adults that enables them to achieve their full potential and promotes social inclusion.

Achievements and Performance

Blue Pits Housing Action continues to hold the Investors in People Standard award for the second year running. In addition, we continue to hold the new Investors in People Health & Wellbeing Award. The award endorses our commitment to staff wellbeing.

Despite the changes to local adult care commissioning plans and contracting arrangements, our annual Adult Care block contract for support provision has been extended until 31st March 2015, albeit with a reduction of 3% in value. In addition, this contract has been increased to include housing support provision for one additional tenant, bringing the contract total up to 23 supported tenants.

The successful outcome of tendering for the provision of housing and support services to four individually funded tenants has enabled the recruitment of a full-time support worker.

A new website has been designed by Sizzle Media and this continues to be developed and updated. This website and our new social media page support the promotion and marketing of the organisation.

How Our Activities Deliver Public Benefit

Our charity's purposes as set out in the objects contained in the company's memorandum of association are to:

To carry on for the benefit of the community the business of providing social housing and any associated amenities, services, advice or assistance for persons:

- ~ in necessitous circumstances upon terms appropriate to their means;
- ~ for whom it would be charitable to provide housing.

To promote or carry out any other charitable purpose that can be carried out by a company registered as a social landlord with the tenant services authority or such similar authority from time to time.

The aims of Blue Pits Housing Action are:

- ~ To provide high quality accommodation which meets the needs of vulnerable people
- ~ To improve the overall health and wellbeing of vulnerable people with complex mental health needs, including those with a dual diagnosis.

- ~ To enable people to develop and maintain the skills and competencies they need to return to, or remain, living independently in their own home.
- ~ To minimise the need for secondary health and social care provision.
- ~ To promote integration and reintegration among socially excluded groups and those leaving institutions of confinement.

Financial Review

Blue Pits Housing Action continues to benefit from two statutory funding streams via Rochdale MBC for both its support and housing management services.

We have rented four additional properties from private landlords and although these create new expenditure, our rent and service charges, agreed by the Principal Housing Officer for Rochdale MBC Housing Benefit service have been extended to include these tenancies.

Principal Funding Sources

Principal funding sources are grants from Supporting People.

Investment Policy

Aside from retaining a prudent amount in reserves each year, most of the charity's funds are to be spent in the short term so there are few funds for any longer term investment.

Reserves Policy

We are currently seeking advice in how to adopt a reserves policy.

Plans for Future Periods

It has been proposed and agreed by our Board of Trustees to recruit a Project Lead to the BPHA staff team at a salary of £27000 per annum in the following 6 months. This will enable the service manager to focus on the strategic plans of the organisation which will include tendering for the provision of new services to individual clients and exploring grant funding streams and partnership working.

We have been approved as an appropriate placement for intermediate and final year social work students by Uclan and Salford University. With the support of Newbarn Ltd, we will be able to offer 90 and 100 day placements to students, adding value to the support we provide for our tenants.

Trustees' Responsibilities

The trustees (who are also directors of Blue Pits Housing Action for the purposes of company law) are responsible for preparing the Trustees' Annual Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice). Company law requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year, which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Charitable Company, and of

the incoming resources and application of resources, including the income and expenditure, of the charitable company for that period. In preparing those financial statements, the trustees are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and apply them consistently;
- observe the methods and principles in the Charities SORP;

- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable UK Accounting Standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- prepare the financial statements on a going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charitable company will continue in operation.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records, which disclose with reasonable accuracy, at any time, the financial position of the charitable company and enable them to ensure that the accounts comply with the Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charitable company, and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 OCTOBER 2014

1 Accounting Policies

Basis of accounting

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008) and with the Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities issued in March 2005 and with the Charities Act 1993.

Fund accounting

- ~ Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity.
- ~ Restricted funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure imposed by the donor or through the terms of an appeal.

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when the charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:

- ~ Grants and investment income are reflected in the accounts when receivable.
- ~ Grants which relate to a specified future period are deferred.
- ~ Donations, gifts and other income are reflected in the accounts when received.

Resources Expended

All expenditure other than that capitalised has been reflected in the Statement of Financial Activities on an accruals basis.

Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered, and is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates.

Charitable expenditure includes those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them. Governance costs include those costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements of the charity and include the audit fees and costs linked to the strategic

management of the charity.

Fixed Assets

Fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. The costs of minor additions or those costing below £500 are not capitalised. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:
