Directors' Report for the Period 28 March 2014 to 26 March 2015

The directors present their annual report and the audited financial statements for the period ended 26 March 2015.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY

The principal activity of the company is the operation of the veterinary surgery at Farnham Retail Park, Farnham.

REVIEW OF BUSINESS

The business made a profit in the period. The directors are satisfied that performance is in line with expectations and remain positive about future trading. The profit on ordinary activities before taxation for the period to 26 March 2015 was £67,368 (27 March 2014: profit £46,056).

DIRECTORS

R Holden has held office during the whole of the period from 28 March 2014 to the date of this report.

Other changes in directors holding office are as follows:

Ms J Balmain - resigned 1 May 2014 B Collins - resigned 1 May 2014 Companion Care (Services) Limited - appointed 1 May 2014

At the date of this report, Companion Care (Services) Limited held 60 'B' Ordinary shares in the company.

Under the terms of the joint venture agreement these shares are not entitled to any profits or dividends, or any surplus on winding up or disposal.

GOING CONCERN

The directors have considered the future profitability of the Company and its ability to continue as a going concern, and have prepared profit and cash flow forecasts into the future. Companion Care (Services) Limited has confirmed that it will provide support for at least 12 months following the approval of these financial statements. Therefore, the directors are satisfied that, for the foreseeable future, the Company can meet its projected working capital requirements. Consequently, the financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis.

STATEMENT AS TO DISCLOSURE OF INFORMATION TO AUDITOR

So far as the directors are aware, there is no relevant audit information (as defined by Section 418 of the Companies Act 2006) of which the company's auditor is unaware, and each director has taken all the steps that they ought to have taken as a director in order to make themselves aware of any relevant audit information and to establish that the company's auditor is aware of that information.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the financial statements.

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared under the going concern basis.

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for smaller Entities (effective April 2008).

Turnover

Turnover represents the amounts (excluding value added tax) derived from the provision of goods and services to customers in the UK.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided to write off the cost less estimated residual value of tangible fixed assets by equal instalments over their estimated useful economic lives as follows:

Plant and equipment - 4 years Computer equipment - 3 years Fixtures and fittings - 7 years Leasehold improvements (fixtures and fittings) - 10 years Leasehold improvements (buildings) - life of lease

Stocks

Stocks are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Leases

Assets acquired under finance leases are capitalised and the outstanding future lease obligations are shown in creditors.

Operating lease rentals are charged to the profit and loss account on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.

Taxation

The charge for taxation is based on the profit for the period and takes into account taxation deferred because of timing differences between the treatment of certain items for taxation and accounting purposes.

Deferred tax is recognised, without discounting, in respect of all timing differences between the treatment of certain items for taxation and accounting purposes which have arisen but not reversed by the balance sheet date, except as otherwise required by FRS 19.

Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the company's pension scheme are charged to the profit and loss account in the period to which they relate.

Going concern

The directors have considered the future profitability of the Company and its ability to continue as a going concern, and have prepared profit and cash flow forecasts into the future. Companion Care (Services) Limited has confirmed that it will provide support for at least 12 months following the approval of these financial statements. Therefore, the directors are satisfied that, for the foreseeable future, the Company can meet its projected working capital repayments. Consequently, the financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis.

Dividends on shares presented within shareholders' funds

Dividends unpaid at the balance sheet date are only recognised as a liability at that date to the extent that they are appropriately authorised and are no longer at the discretion of the company. Unpaid dividends that do not meet these criteria are disclosed in the notes to the financial statements.

Dividends only become available for distribution once the terms of the Joint Venture agreement have been met.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES - continued

Classification of financial instruments issued by the company

Following the adoption of FRS 25, financial instruments issued by the Company are treated as equity (i.e. forming part of shareholders' funds) only to the extent that they meet the following two conditions:

- a) they include no contractual obligations upon the Company to deliver cash or other financial assets or to exchange financial assets or financial liabilities with another party under conditions that are potentially unfavourable to the Company; and
- b) where the instrument will or may be settled in the Company's own equity instruments, it is either a non-derivative that includes no obligation to deliver a variable number of the Company's own equity instruments or is a derivative that will be settled by the Company exchanging a fixed amount of cash or other financial assets for a fixed number of its own equity instruments.

To the extent that this definition is not met, the proceeds of issue are classified as a financial liability. Where the instrument so classified takes the legal form of the Company's own shares, the amounts presented in these financial statements for called up share capital and share premium account exclude amounts in relation to those shares.

Finance payments associated with financial liabilities are dealt with as part of interest payable and similar charges. Finance payments associated with financial instruments that are classified as part of shareholders' funds (see dividends policy), are dealt with as appropriations in the reserves note.
