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REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES / DIRECTORS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2014

The Trustees have pleasure in submitting the Report and Accounts for the year

Objects of the charity

Relational Mission is an incorporated charity controlled by its governing document dated the 6 December 2012. It was registered as a Charity on the 24 January 2013.

As detailed in this documentation the charity has 3 core charitable objects

- 3 1 to advance the Christian faith in accordance with the Statement of Beliefs in such parts of the United Kingdom and the world as the Trustees may from time to time think fit;
- 3 2 to relieve sickness and financial hardship and to promote and preserve good health by the provision of funds, goods or services of any kind including through the provision of counselling and support in such parts of the United Kingdom and the world as the Trustees may from time to time think fit; and
- 3 3 to advance education in such ways and in such parts of the United Kingdom and the world as the Trustees may from time to time think fit

Management & Governance Structure

Primarily 3 Trustees have run Relational Mission over this period, each with differing backgrounds and expertise that can contribute to the delivery of the charity's objectives. Towards the end of the year to expand this expertise 3 additional Trustees were appointed

The policy and key operating decisions (i.e. budget setting, risk management) of the charity rest with the Trustees who meet regularly to monitor the activities of the charity. Day to day operation has been delegated to the apostolic / strategy Team (Led by Mike Betts) and implementation team

During the year, Relational Mission directly employed 7 staff (5 Full time equivalent) These staff alongside retained consultancy support and volunteers delivered the activities of the charity

Review of Activities

In order to achieve its stated charitable objectives, Relational Mission works with and through a family of churches to:

- support churches and their elders
- · establish new churches
- work directly with or support projects helping the poor or those in hardship
- organise conferences to encourage and envision church leaders and individuals
- train and educate individuals for Christian service in the church and community
- write, publish and distribute various Christian materials in various forms

Relational Mission continues to relate to Newfrontiers in terms of apostolic leadership and is responsible for a family of approximately 75 churches including church plants in 17 nations across the world.

The period up to the 31st December 2014 has focused on strengthening the spine of operations for the Relational Mission charity, laying foundations for future activity as well as continuing to fortify relationships amongst churches and their leadership teams.

A key event in 2014 was the first Relational Mission Leadership Conference at which over 600 leaders from our family of churches gathered. Together we explored the theme of being a 'church for a broken world' and began to outline the journey we have together as we move forward.

Examples of the other activities carried out are:

- Strengthened the spine of Relational Mission operations through the employment of a number of staff and the expansion of the Trusteeship.
- Released a number of individuals to facilitate ministries amongst the family of churches, in areas including worship, children & youth, prophetic ministry, the workplace, evangelism and ministry to the poor.
- Undertaken research to establish an action plan for helping our family of churches reach the poor in their communities and create pathways from poverty.
- Launched a new Relational Mission website and communications infrastructure
- Helped establish church plants in Helsinki, Rotterdam & Calgary.
- Established a new training programme HEAR, to help encourage prophetic ministry and help people hear from God
- Successfully delivered the first year of the revised leadership training programme LEAD

- Delivered a number of events to build relationship and equip our churches and leaders:
- 2 days of Prayer & Equipping held twice in the UK, and once in the Netherlands and Canada
- Presence of God Tour finished off with 2 events in Mainland Europe
- Worship Conference
- Cluster leaders Forum
- Over £70,000 was raised in the year to support situations in Kenya & Ghana through the Christmas appeals.
- Development began on our 'ENOUGH' prayer initiative and Intentional Discipleship programmes ready for launch in 2015.

In planning the activities the Trustees have had regard to the guidance on public benefit issued by the Charity Commission in December 2008.

Financial Review

Relational Mission is financially dependent upon the donations made by supporting churches, grants from charitable trusts and income generated via events.

Relational Mission Trustees and team would like to thank all the churches and organisations that have supported the charity throughout the year

During the year Relational Mission had income of £463,256, £82,023 of which was for restricted purposes, i.e. Christmas appeal monies for Kenya & Ghana and grants received to help specific church plants.

Expended resources for the period were £418,456 in total of which £93,918 were restricted. At the end of 2014 Relational Mission had a surplus of £190,746 with £45,426 restricted.

While this is a significant surplus to carry forward, it has been established in preparation for the activity planned for 2015, which will draw significantly on these resources

In 2015, the charity will be seeking to refine its structure of operation and engagement so that a sustainable and multiplication based approach can be established for the long term.

Alongside the continuation of many of the activities facilitated in 2014, Relational Mission will be seeking to launch its major prayer initiative, ENOUGH, with the aim of gathering 1,000's of people to pray across our churches across the nations.

Reserves & Investment Policy

On an on going basis the Trustees consider the level of reserves they wish to retain, appropriate to the Charity's needs and circumstances. This is based on the charity's size and level of commitments held. The Trustees endeavour not to set aside funds unnecessarily.

The Trustees aim to ensure the charity will be able to continue to fulfil its charitable objectives even if there is a temporary shortfall in income or unexpected expenditure. In doing this the Trustee's aim to make sure that the current budget forecast and reserves levels allow the charity to continue in operation for a rolling 12 month period. This is reviewed at a minimum at 2 points within the financial year.

Relational Mission has no investment policy as it currently does not intend to make any investments. This will be reviewed next year.

Grant Making Policy

Relational Mission works with churches worldwide and where these contacts are able to fulfil the objectives of the charity more ably, or maintain closer working links with activities or projects, grants are sometimes provided. These are made following regular contact, budgetary control and adequate reporting

Risk Statement

The Trustees have and continue to review the major strategic, business and operational risks, which a small charity with few employees is likely to be exposed to. A framework has been established and procedures are in place to identify, monitor and review these risks on a regular basis.

All major insurable risks have been covered by the charity's insurance coverage. Contracts and associated risks are reviewed before being finalised to ensure they do not significantly impact (negatively) upon the charity's ability to fulfil its objectives.

Trustee's Responsibilities

Charity law requires us as Directors to prepare financial statements for each accounting year which give a true and fair view of the state of the charity and of its income and expenditure for the year.

- 1. Select suitable accounting policies and apply them consistently
- 2. Make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent
- 3. State whether the applicable accounting standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the accounts.
- 4 Prepare the financial statements on a going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in business.

We are responsible for keeping adequate accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the company and enable us to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006.

We also have a responsibility to safeguard the assets of the charity and to take reasonable steps to prevent fraud or any other irregularities.

INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT TO THE TRUSTEES OF RELATIONAL MISSION

I have examined the accounts for the year ended 31 December 2014 on pages 8 to 14 following which have been prepared on the basis of the accounting policies set out on page 10

Respective Responsibilities of Directors/Trustees and Examiner

The directors/trustees of the company are responsible for the preparation of accounts, they consider that the audit requirements under section 144 of the Charities Act 2011 do not apply but that an independent examination is needed. I have been appointed to conduct an Independent Examination required by section 145 of the Charities Act 2011 and to report in accordance with the regulations made under section 145 of that Act. It is my responsibility to examine the accounts, without performing an audit, and to report to the trustees

Having satisfied myself that the company is not subject to audit under company law and is eligible for independent examination, it is my responsibility to

The charity's gross income exceeded £250,000 and I am qualified to undertake the examination

Basis of Examiner's Statement

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Notes to the Accounts FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2014

1 Accounting Policies

The accounts have been prepared under the historic cost convention, in accordance with applicable accounting standards and follow the Statement of Recommended Practice. Accounting by Charities 2005 The following are the accounting policies which have been applied in dealing with material items -

a) Donated and grant income:

Donated income and grants receivable are taken into account when received by the charity. Income received in circumstances where a claim for repayment of tax has been or will be made to HM Revenue & Customs is grossed up for the tax recoverable. Any amount of tax reclaimed from HM Revenue & Customs but not yet received is shown within the charity's debtors.

b) Other income and expenditure

Events income and expenditure is taken into account when the event is completed Investment income is taken into account when receivable and expenditure, including irrecoverable VAT, when incurred by the charity, regardless of when payment is made. Grants payable are taken into account at the earlier of when they are paid or become constructive obligations. Grants for the support of mission projects are accounted for on the basis of support that relates to the financial year.

c) Funds

Unrestricted funds are donations and other income received or generated for the objects of the charity without specified purpose and are available for purposes as directed by the Trustees Restricted funds are amounts received where the donor has specified the purpose for which it should be used

d) Pension costs

The company operates a defined contribution scheme for certain of its employees Pension premiums are charged as they are paid

e) Taxation

The company is a registered charity and is exempt from taxation under the Income & Corporation Taxes Acts

f) Cashflow statement

The company has taken advantage of the exemption provided by the Financial Reporting Standard 1 and has not prepared a Cash Flow Statement for the year.

Pathways for poverty

Pathways from Poverty is an initiative of Relational Mission that seeks to empower people from across the world by offering them choices and creating pathways to enable them to escape from poverty A key part of this activity is that a Christmas appeal is held most years to support an initiative in line with the PfP ethos

PfP Ghana Appeal

The focus of this appeal was to raise funds to help extend and build a new 2 storey eduction block for the New Nation School in Accrua, Ghana. This will help increase the capacity and number of children they can educate & release from poverty

Pfp Kenya Orphans Appeal

The focus of this appeal was to support the Community Empowerment Programme, in Meru, Kenya The programme works with vulnerable children and orphans to provide education sponsorship, including school fees, uniforms and books, clothing, food and housing, medical care and nutritional supplements For those orphaned by HIV or AIDS, counselling and mentorship are also provided
