Our CIC company runs two youth cafés in the Cornish market towns of Helston and Redruth.

These are for young people to help them become actively engaged in a range of youth activities, including the café, information, advice and guidance and a range of workshops on pertinent topics. The cafes also have arts and crafts activities, pool and games areas.

This year has seen the two youth cafes go from strength to strength with some very positive significant change stories and case studies of how the young people have benefitted from being at the youth cafes.

We continue to work well with our youth work provider Young People Cornwall which has resulted in even more young people attending and making new friends, participating in a variety of sessions to help build confidence, and learn new skills

The Board of directors has worked hard to secure new grant funding.

The crisis of living has had a major impact on the young people we serve, in particular we are working with more young people who are suffering from food poverty at home and are finding the youth cafes a warm, safe space where they can enjoy a meal and gain new confidence and skills.

The funding from the Tweed Charitable Foundation, has been instrumental in supporting the two unique Supper Clubs at the youth cafes, to address food poverty, enable young people to learn to cook together as a team, experience meal planning, understand budgeting for food and work with guest chefs to learn a range of exciting new skills. This has proved very popular with the young people.
